~DISOBEDIENT (124)

[English, defiant, noncompliant, rebellious, insubordinate, badly behaved, naughty, wayward, obedient]

- Nehemiah confessed to Yehowah God, that his people had been disobedient and cast his Law behind their backs.
- However, they became disobedient and rebelled against you and kept casting your Law behind their back, and your own prophets they killed, who bore witness against them to bring them back to you, and they went on committing acts of great disrespect. (Nehemiah 9:26)
- The Psalmist showed that many times when his people were disobedient that he would deliver them, but they would return to their disobedient course time and again.
- Many times he would deliver them, but they themselves would behave rebelliously in their disobedient course, and they would be brought low for their error. (Psalms 106:43)
- The angel of Yehowah God showed, that John the Baptist would come with Elijah's spirit and power to turn back disobedient ones to the practical wisdom of righteous ones.
- Also, he will go before him with Elijah's spirit and power, to turn back the hearts of fathers to children and the disobedient ones to the practical wisdom of righteous ones, to get ready for Yehowah a prepared people. (Luke 1:17)
- Paul confessed to King Agrippa that upon seeing the resurrected Jesus Christ, he did not become disobedient to that vision.
- Wherefore, King Agrippa, I did not become disobedient to the heavenly sight. (Acts of Apostles 26:19)
- Paul showed that wicked men were among others things, disobedient to parents.
- Backbiters, haters of God, insolent, haughty, self-assuming, inventors of injurious things, disobedient to parents. (Romans 1:30)

- Yehowah God bore witness, that he had spread out his hands all day long toward a people, the Jews, who were disobedient to him and talked back.
- But as respects Israel he says; All day long I have spread out my hands toward a people that is disobedient and talks back. (Romans 10:21)
- Gentile Christians were once disobedient to Yehowah God, but now have been shown mercy, because of the disobedience of the Jews.
- For just as you were once disobedient to God but have now been shown mercy because of their disobedience. (Romans 11:30)
- So also these now have been disobedient with mercy resulting to you, that they themselves also may now be shown mercy. (Romans 11:31)
- Paul showed that one of the signs of the Last Days was that men would be disobedient to their parents.
- For men will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, selfassuming, haughty, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, disloyal. (2 Timothy 3:2)
- Paul told Titus that some men declare that they know God, but they disown him through their works, because they are detestable and disobedient, not approved for good work of any sort.
- They publicly declare they know God, but they disown him by their works, because they are detestable and disobedient and not approved for good work of any sort. (Titus 1:16)
- Paul showed Titus, that before becoming Christians, they too were disobedient, being led by various desires and pleasures.
- For even we were once senseless, disobedient, being misled, being slaves to various desires and pleasures, carrying on in badness and envy, abhorrent, hating one another. (Titus 3:3)
- Paul reasoned, that if the word spoken through angels, the Law Covenant was firm, bringing retribution for every disobedient act, should they not now be in fear also, taking the Christ seriously.

- For if the word spoken through angels proved to be firm, and every transgression and disobedient act received a retribution in harmony with justice. (Hebrews 2:2)
- Paul showed that the Jews were stumbling over the Christ, because they themselves were disobedient to the word of God the Bible, and that they were appointed to this very end.
- And a stone of stumbling and a rock-mass of offense. These are stumbling because they are disobedient to the word. To this very end they were also appointed. (1 Peter 2:8)
- Peter showed that men before the flood of Noah's day were disobedient to God, while he had Noah patiently build the ark for salvation of a few.
- Who had once been disobedient when the patience of God was waiting in Noah's days, while the ark was being constructed, in which a few people, that is, eight souls, were carried safely through the water. (1 Peter 3:20)
