~DISTRESSES (95)

[English, sufferings, pains, sorrows, anguish, agony, grief, misery, Opposite of, peace]

- One of the maledictions for not serving Yehowah God according to the Law Covenant, was that he would bring continued distresses upon them, until they confessed their mistakes before him.
- I shall certainly forsake them and conceal my face from them, and they must become something to be consumed, and many calamities and distresses must come upon them, and they will be bound to say in that day; Is it not because our God is not in our midst that these calamities have come upon us? (Deuteronomy 31:17)
- And it must occur that when many calamities and distresses will come upon them, this song must also answer before them as a witness, because it should not be forgotten out of the mouth of their offspring, for I well know their inclination that they are developing today before I bring them into the land about which I have sworn. (Deuteronomy 31:21)
- Samuel told the people that they had rejected Yehowah God as one bringing them out of their many distresses, when they asked for a king instead of him to lead them.
- But you, today you have rejected your God who was a savior to you out of all your evils and your distresses, and you went on to say; No, but a king is what you should put over us. And now take your stand before Yehowah by your tribes and by your thousands. (1 Samuel 10:19)
- Job showed his confidence in his God, showing the Yehowah God rescues the righteous one through six or seven distresses.
- In six distresses he will deliver you, and in seven nothing injurious will touch you. (Job 5:19)
- The Psalmist showed that the distresses of his heart had multiplied, yet he looked to Yehowah God to bring him out of them.

- Distresses of my heart have multiplied, from the stresses upon me O bring me out. (Psalms 25:17)
- O God, redeem Israel out of all his distresses. (Psalms 25:22)
- I will be joyful and rejoice in your loving-kindness, in that you have seen my affliction; You have known about the distresses of my soul. (Psalms 31:7)
- This afflicted one called, and Yehowah himself heard. And out of all his distresses He saved him. (Psalms 34:6)
- They cried out, and Yehowah himself heard, and out of all their distresses he delivered them. (Psalms 34:17)
- Yehowah God is a refuge and a strength, a help that is readily found during distresses.
- God is for us a refuge and strength, a help that is readily to be found during distresses. (Psalms 46:1)
- The Psalmist showed that he had endured many distresses, and yet looked to Yehowah God to bring him up out of them all.
- Because you have made me see many distresses and calamities, may you revive me again, and from the watery deeps of the earth may you again bring me up. (Psalms 71:20)
- He that is keeping quiet with his tongue, is keeping his soul from distresses.
- He that is keeping his mouth and his tongue is keeping his soul from distresses. (Proverbs 21:23)
- In Yehowah God's New Order the former distresses will be completely forgotten.
- So that anyone blessing himself in the earth will bless himself by the God of faith, and anyone making a sworn statement in the earth will swear by the God of faith, because the former distresses will actually be forgotten and because they will actually be concealed from my eyes. (Isaiah 65:16)
