~DISTURBANCE (188)

[English, trouble, commotion, riot, uproar, fracas, disorder]

- Yehowah God promised to bring disturbance upon his people as a malediction for not following his way.
- Then I, for my part, shall do the following to you, and in punishment I shall certainly bring upon you disturbance with tuberculosis and burning fever, causing the eyes to fail and making the soul pine away. And you will simply sow your seed for nothing, as your enemies will certainly eat it up. (Leviticus 26:16)
- The land came to have no disturbance from war for many years after the Israelites took possession of the Promised Land.
- So Joshua took all the land, according to all that Yehowah had promised Moses, and Joshua then gave it as an inheritance to Israel by their shares, according to their tribes. And the land had no disturbance from war. (Joshua 11:23)
- The name of Hebron before that was Kiriath-arba, said Arba was the great man among the Anakim. And the land had no disturbance from war. (Joshua 14:15)
- Likewise after each judge came forth to save Israel, the land continue without disturbance for many years.
- After that the land had no disturbance for forty years. Eventually Othniel the son of Kenaz died. (Judges 3:11)
- And Moab came to be subdued on that day under Israel's hand, and the land had no further disturbance for eighty years. (Judges 3:30)
- Thus let all your enemies perish, O Yehowah, and let your lovers be as when the sun goes forth in its mightiness. And the land had no further disturbance for forty years. (Judges 5:31)
- Thus Midian was subdued before the sons of Israel, and they did not lift up their head anymore, and the land had no further disturbance for forty years in the days of Gideon. (Judges 8:28)

- And all the people of the land continued to rejoice, and the city, for its part, had no disturbance, and Athaliah herself they had put to death with the sword at the king's house. (2 Kings 11:20)
- They found good pasturage for their flocks in a land having no disturbance.
- Eventually they found fat and good pasturage, and the land was quite wide and having no disturbance but at ease, for those dwelling there in former times were of Ham. (1 Chronicles 4:40)
- In the time of the reign of Asa that land had no disturbance, for Asa removed false worship from the land.
- Finally Abijah lay down with his forefathers, and they buried him in the City of David, and Asa his son began to reign in place of him. In his days the land had no disturbance for ten years. (2 Chronicles 14:1)
- Accordingly he removed from all the cities of Judah the high places and the incense stands, and the kingdom continued without disturbance before him. (2 Chronicles 14:5)
- And he went on to build fortified cities in Judah, for the land had no disturbance, and there was no war against him during these years, for Yehowah gave him rest. (2 Chronicles 14:6)
- Yehowah God continued to give Jehoshaphat rest and the land had no disturbance.
- Thus the royal realm of Jehoshaphat had no disturbance, and his God continued to give him rest all around. (2 Chronicles 20:30)
- When Athaliah was put to death the land continued without disturbance.
- And all the people of the land continued to rejoice, and the city itself had no disturbance, and Athaliah they had put to death with the sword. (2 Chronicles 23:21)
- Pharaoh Necho of Egypt told Josiah, that it was not against him that he had come to cause disturbance.

- At that he sent messengers to him, saying; What do I have to do with you, O king of Judah? It is not against you that I am coming today, but it is against another house that my fight is and that God himself said that I should cause disturbance. Refrain for your own sake because of God, who is with me, and do not let him bring you to ruin. (2 Chronicles 35:21)
- Men of surrounding nations caused Nehemiah disturbance over his raising the walls of Jerusalem.
- And all of them began to conspire together to come and fight against Jerusalem and cause me disturbance. (Nehemiah 4:8)
- The Psalmist showed that the faithless men of Israel, Yehowah God had brought to an end in disturbance, as if an exhalation.
- So he brought their days to an end as if a mere exhalation, and their years by the disturbance. (Psalms 78:33)
- For the first time since the Garden of Eden, the whole earth will then be free of Satan the Devil's wicked rule. There are no more wars or revolutions, the world is now free of disturbance and at peace. People everywhere will be certain to notice the change. Surely then, earth's many inhabitants will rejoice and cry out in gladness.
- The whole earth has come to rest, has become free of disturbance. People have become cheerful with joyful cries. (Isaiah 14:7)
- Then people will not bring offspring to bring merely for disturbance.
- They will not toil for nothing, nor will they bring to birth for disturbance, because they are the offspring made up of the blessed ones of Yehowah, and their descendants with them. (Isaiah 65:23)
- Jeremiah promised the offspring of Jacob that they would return to their Promised Land, and be free of disturbance.
- And as for you, do not be afraid, O my servant Jacob, is the utterance of Yehowah, and do not be struck with terror, O Israel. For here I am saving you from far off and your offspring from the land of their captivity. And Jacob will certainly return and be free

- of disturbance and be at ease, and there will be no one causing trembling. (Jeremiah 30:10)
- And as for you, do not be afraid, O my servant Jacob, and do not be terror-stricken, O Israel. For here I am saving you from far away and your offspring from the land of their captivity. And Jacob will certainly return and have no disturbance and be at ease and without anyone causing trembling. (Jeremiah 46:27)
- Gog of Magog sees Israel dwelling in open country with no disturbance, and decides to attack them.
- And you must say; I shall go up against the land of open rural country. I shall come in upon those having no disturbance, dwelling in security, all of them dwelling without wall, and they do not have even bar and doors. (Ezekiel 38:11)
- The angels Zechariah saw in vision walking about within the earth, said that there was no disturbance in the earth, at that time.
- And they proceeded to answer the angel of Yehowah who was standing among the myrtle trees and to say; We have walked about in the earth, and, look! The whole earth is sitting still and having no disturbance. (Zechariah 1:11)
- In Ephesus no little disturbance arose over Paul's teaching that idols are nothing, among those making idols for a living.
- At that particular time there arose no little disturbance concerning The Way. (Acts of Apostles 19:23)
