

### ~DISTURBED (230)

[English, troubled, bothered, concerned, worried, distressed, anxious, uneasy, Opposite of, **unconcerned**]

- Joseph's brothers were **disturbed** by what he said when he revealed himself to them.
- Finally Joseph said to his brothers; I am Joseph. Is my father still alive? But his brothers were unable to answer him at all, because they were **disturbed** by reason of him. (**Genesis 45:3**)
- Yehowah God's mighty performance of rescuing his people from the Red Sea would make the peoples of Canaan **disturbed**.
- At that time the sheiks of Edom will indeed be **disturbed**. As for the despots of Moab, trembling will take hold on them. All the inhabitants of Canaan will indeed be disheartened. (**Exodus 15:15**)
- The men of Israel set an ambush for the Benjamites, who were disturbed when it was exposed to them.
- And the men of Israel made an about-face, and the men of Benjamin were **disturbed**, for they saw that calamity had reached them. (**Judges 20:41**)
- Samuel was said to be **disturbed** when asked to appear from the dead, according to the witch of Endor.
- And Samuel began to say to Saul; Why have you **disturbed** me by having me brought up? To this Saul said; I am in very sore straits, as the Philistines are fighting against me, and God himself has departed from me and has answered me no more, either by means of the prophets or by dreams, so that I am calling you to let me know what I shall do. (**1 Samuel 28:15**)
- When the woman came to Saul she saw that he was greatly **disturbed**.
- The woman now came to Saul and saw that he had been greatly **disturbed**. So she said to him; Here your maidservant has obeyed your voice, and I proceeded to put my soul in my palm

and obey the words that you spoke to me. (1 Samuel 28:21)

- When the son of Saul heard that Abner had died at Hebron, then all the Israelites were **disturbed**.
- When the son of Saul heard that Abner had died in Hebron, then his hands became feeble and all the Israelites themselves were **disturbed**. (2 Samuel 4:1)
- Yehowah God promised to provide a place for his people where they could dwell **undisturbed**.
- And I shall certainly appoint a place for my people Israel and plant them, and they will indeed reside where they are, and no more will they be **disturbed**, and the sons of unrighteousness will not afflict them again as they did at the first. (2 Samuel 7:10)
- And I shall certainly appoint a place for my people Israel and plant them, and they will indeed reside where they are and no more will they be **disturbed**, and the sons of unrighteousness will not wear them out again, just as they did at the first. (1 Chronicles 17:9)
- David became **disturbed** over the death of his rebellious son Absalom.
- Then the king became **disturbed** and went up to the roof chamber over the gateway and gave way to weeping, and this is what he said as he walked; My son Absalom, my son, my son Absalom! O that I might have died, I myself, instead of you, Absalom my son, my son! (2 Samuel 18:33)
- Eliphaz counseled Job that when the trouble of life came to him, he got **disturbed**, and refused to listen.
- But this time it comes to you, and you become weary. It touches even you, and you get **disturbed**. (Job 4:5)
- Job was **disturbed** because of Yehowah God, and showed himself attentive to him.
- That is why I feel **disturbed** because of him, I show myself attentive and am in dread of him. (Job 23:15)

- Job showed that God himself had made his heart timid, and had **disturbed** him.
- Even God himself has made my heart timid, and the Almighty himself has **disturbed** me. (**Job 23:16**)
- The Psalmist showed that he felt he was fading away, and asked Yehowah God to heal him for his very bones had been **disturbed**.
- Show me favor, O Yehowah, for I am fading away. Heal me, O Yehowah, for my bones have been **disturbed**. (**Psalms 6:2**)
- Yes, my own soul has been very much **disturbed**, and you O Yehowah, how long? (**Psalms 6:3**)
- The Psalmist showed, that all God's enemies would turn back **disturbed** and ashamed.
- All my enemies will be very much ashamed and **disturbed**, they will turn back, they will be ashamed instantly. (**Psalms 6:10**)
- The Psalmist showed that when Yehowah God concealed his face from him, he became **disturbed**, over the perceived loss of favor.
- O Yehowah, in your goodwill you have made my mountain to stand in strength. You concealed your face, I became one that is **disturbed**. (**Psalms 30:7**)
- The Psalmist showed how Yehowah God's enemies got **disturbed**, and were sent running in panic.
- They themselves saw, and so they were amazed. They got **disturbed**, they were sent running in panic. (**Psalms 48:5**)
- The Psalmist asked that Yehowah God's enemies be **disturbed** at all times, and become abashed and perish.
- O may they be ashamed and be **disturbed** for all times, and may they become abashed and perish. (**Psalms 83:17**)
- The Psalmist bemoaned that Israel had come to an end in Yehowah God's anger against them, and that by his rage they had been **disturbed**.

- For we have come to an end in your anger, and by your rage we have been **disturbed**. (**Psalms 90:7**)
- The Psalmist showed, that if Yehowah God concealed his face from his people, they get **disturbed**, for they all depend upon his spirit.
- If you conceal your face, they get **disturbed**. If you take away their spirit, they expire, and back to their dust they go. (**Psalms 104:29**)
- At the fall of Babylon, the people would become **disturbed**, as in the convulsions of birth.
- And people have become **disturbed**. Convulsions and birth pains themselves grab hold. Like a woman that is giving birth they have labor pains. They look at each other in amazement. Their faces are inflamed faces. (**Isaiah 13:8**)
- Isaiah described his feelings like those of a woman in birth convulsions, and he became **disturbed** so that he could not see.
- That is why my hips have become full of severe pains. Convulsions themselves have grabbed hold of me, like the convulsions of a woman that is giving birth. I have become disconcerted so that I do not hear. I have become **disturbed** so that I do not see. (**Isaiah 21:3**)
- Jeremiah prophesied about the fall of Babylon the people would become **disturbed**, as Babylon fell to the Medes.
- And that the fords themselves have been seized, and the papyrus boats they have burned with fire, and the men of war themselves have become **disturbed**. (**Jeremiah 51:32**)
- When Yehowah God comes to judge his people, the very hands of the people will become **disturbed**.
- The king himself will go into mourning, even a chieftain will clothe himself with desolation, and the very hands of the people of the land will get **disturbed**. According to their way I shall act toward them, and with their judgments I shall judge them, and they will have to know that I am Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 7:27**)

- In the day of the downfall of Satan the Devil, all the islands of the sea will tremble and be **disturbed**.
- Now the islands will tremble in the day of your downfall. And the islands that are in the sea must be **disturbed** owing to your going out. (**Ezekiel 26:18**)
- Mary was deeply **disturbed** at the greeting of the angel that appeared to her.
- But she was deeply **disturbed** at the saying and began to reason out what sort of greeting this might be. (**Luke 1:29**)
- Jesus counseled Martha who was **disturbed** over many things, rather than listening to him teach.
- In answer the Lord said to her; Martha, Martha, you are anxious and **disturbed** about many things. (**Luke 10:41**)
- A crippled man complained to Jesus, that he had no man to help him get into the pool for healing, when that waters were **disturbed**.
- The sick man answered him; Sir, I do not have a man to put me into the pool when the water is **disturbed**, but while I am coming another steps down ahead of me. (**John 5:7**)
