~DOPHKAH (19) (Doph'kah) [possibly, Driven, Shoved]

- The first stopping place for the Israelites after leaving the Wilderness of Sin on their way to the Promised Land.
- Then they pulled away from the wilderness of Sin and went camping at Dophkah. (Numbers 33:12)
- Later they pulled away from **Dophkah** and went camping at Alush. (Numbers 33:13)
- The Bible does not indicate its exact geographic location. However, many scholars associate Dophkah with the Egyptian *mafqat*, a district named for the turquoise mined since ancient times around Sarabit el-Khadim, about 34 kilometers (21 miles) East of modern-day Abu Zanima on the Sinai Peninsula.
