~DUMAH 1 (39) (Du'mah)

- The sixth in the list of Ishmael's 12 sons. By the marriage of his sister Mahalath, Dumah became the brother-in-law to his half cousin Esau. Dumah also became a chieftain and head of a clan, or nation, in fulfillment of Yehowah's promise to Abraham.
- But as regards Ishmael I have heard you. Look! I will bless him and will make him fruitful and will multiply him very, very much. He will certainly produce twelve chieftains, and I will make him become a great nation. (Genesis 17:20)
- And Mishma and Dumah and Massa. (Genesis 25:14)
- Hadad and Tema, Jetur, Naphish and Kedemah. (Genesis 25:15)
- These are the sons of Ishmael, and these are their names by their courtyards and by their walled camps, twelve chieftains according to their clans. (Genesis 25:16)
- Hence Esau went to Ishmael and took as wife Mahalath the daughter of Ishmael the son of Abraham, the sister of Nebaioth, besides his other wives. (Genesis 28:9)
- Mishma and Dumah, Massa, Hadad and Tema. (1 Chronicles 1:30)
- The Ishmaelite Dumah evidently gave his name to a region in North Arabia about midway between the Promised Land and South Babylonia. The name continues in that of the oasis Dumat al-Ghandal, now known as Al-Jawf.
- Assyrian King Sennacherib mentions an *Adummatu*, which was situated in the desert. Esar-haddon says that an Adumu was conquered by his father Sennacherib.
