~EGLAIM (25) (Eg-la'im)

- Evidently one of the geographic extremities of Moab that, according to;
- The pronouncement against Moab. Because in the night it has been despoiled, Ar of Moab itself has been silenced. Because in the night it has been despoiled, Kir of Moab itself has been silenced. (Isaiah 15:1)
- For the outcry has gone around the territory of Moab. The howling thereof is clear to Eglaim, the howling thereof is clear to Beer-elim. (Isaiah 15:8)
- Was due to howl over that nations despoiling. The exact location of the ancient site is uncertain. However, the name Eglaim and a similar name, Agallim, mentioned by Eusebius [Onomasticon, 36,19-21] as about 12 kilometers (7.5 miles) South of Rabbath-Moab, may be preserved at Rujm el-Jilimeh in that area or at Khirbet Jeljul, a location dating from Nabataean-Roman times, 7 kilometers (4 miles) farther south. Yohanan Aharoni suggests identifying it with Mazra`, an oasis Northeast of the Lisan Peninsula.
