

~ELIZUR (74)

(E-li'zur) [My God Is a Rock]

- **Son of Shedeur of the tribe of Reuben, one of the 12 chieftains who assisted Moses and Aaron in numbering the sons of Israel.**
- **And Yehowah proceeded to speak to Moses in the wilderness of Sinai, in the tent of meeting, on the first day of the second month in the second year of their coming out of the land of Egypt, and he said. (Numbers 1:1)**
- **Take the sum of the whole assembly of the sons of Israel according to their families, according to the house of their fathers, by the number of names, all the males, head by head of them. (Numbers 1:2)**
- **From twenty years old upward, everyone going out to the army in Israel. You should register them according to their armies, you and Aaron. (Numbers 1:3)**
- **And these are the names of the men who will stand with you: Of Reuben, **Elizur** the son of Shedeur. (Numbers 1:5)**
- **So Moses and Aaron took these men who had been designated by names. (Numbers 1:17)**
- **The three-tribe division of the camp of Reuben will be toward the south in their armies, and the chieftain for the sons of Reuben is **Elizur** the son of Shedeur. (Numbers 2:10)**
- **And the three-tribe division of the camp of Reuben pulled away in their armies, and **Elizur** the son of Shedeur was over its army. (Numbers 10:18)**
- **In addition to sharing in the group presentation made by the chieftains after the setting up of the tabernacle, **Elizur** presented his own offering on the fourth day for the inauguration of the altar.**
- **Now it came about on the day that Moses finished setting up the tabernacle that he proceeded to anoint it and to sanctify it and all its furnishings and the altar and all its utensils. Thus he anointed them and sanctified them. (Numbers 7:1)**

- Then the chieftains of Israel, the heads of the house of their fathers, made a presentation, they being the chieftains of the tribes and standing over the ones registered. (**Numbers 7:2**)
- Now the chieftains made their presentation at the inauguration of the altar on the day of its being anointed, and the chieftains proceeded with presenting their offering before the altar. (**Numbers 7:10**)
- On the fourth day there was the chieftain for the sons of Reuben, **Elizur** the son of Shedeur. (**Numbers 7:30**)
- His offering was one silver dish, its weight being a hundred and thirty shekels, one silver bowl of seventy shekels by the shekel of the holy place, both of them full of fine flour moistened with oil for a grain offering. (**Numbers 7:31**)
- One gold cup of ten shekels, full of incense. (**Numbers 7:32**)
- One young bull, one ram, one male lamb in its first year, for a burnt offering. (**Numbers 7:33**)
- One kid of the goats for a sin offering. (**Numbers 7:34**)
- And for a communion sacrifice two cattle, five rams, five he-goats, five male lambs each a year old. This was the offering of **Elizur** the son of Shedeur. (**Numbers 7:35**)
