## ~ELI 2 (31) (E'li)

- As Jesus was dying on the torture stake, about the ninth hour, or about 3:00 P.M, he called out; *E'li, E'li, la'ma sa-bach-tha'ni?* My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? (Matthew 27:46)
- And at the ninth hour Jesus called out with a loud voice; Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? Which means, when translated. My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? (Mark 15:34)
- Bystanders thought that he was calling for Elijah. Perhaps they misunderstood Jesus words because his speech was indistinct as a result of his intense suffering or because his dialect differed from theirs.
- At hearing this, some of those standing there began to say; This man is calling Elijah. (Matthew 27:47)
- And some of those standing near, on hearing it, began to say; See! He is calling Elijah. (Mark 15:35)
- In calling out to his heavenly Father, acknowledging him as his God, Jesus fulfilled
- My God, my God, why have you left me? Why are you far from saving me, from the words of my roaring? (Psalms 22:1)
