

~ENCOURAGEMENT (64)

[English, support, back-up]

- In Antioch in Pisidia the presiding officers of the synagogue invited Paul to give some words of **encouragement** to those attending.
- After the public reading of the Law and of the Prophets the presiding officers of the synagogue sent out to them, saying, Men, brothers, if there is any word of **encouragement** for the people that you have, tell it. (**Acts of Apostles 13:15**)
- Paul and Barnabus took the letter from the Apostles and brought it to Antioch where it brought much **encouragement**.
- After reading it, they rejoiced over the **encouragement**. (**Acts of Apostles 15:31**)
- Paul showed that even though he was an Apostle of Christ Jesus that he was **encouraged** as much as he **encouraged** others by their company and fine examples.
- Or, rather, that there may be an interchange of **encouragement** among you, by each one through the others faith, both yours and mine. (**Romans 1:12**)
- Titus responded to the **encouragement** of the Corinthian congregation and of his own free will journeyed there to them.
- Because he has indeed responded to the **encouragement**, but, being very earnest, he is going forth of his own accord to you. (**2 Corinthians 8:17**)
- Paul counseled the Philippians that if there was any **encouragement** in Christ that they should walk unitedly in it.
- If, then, there is any **encouragement** in Christ, if any consolation of love, if any sharing of spirit, if any tender affections and compassions. (**Philippians 2:1**)
- Paul shows that God's oath and promise are two things in which it is impossible for God to lie, and that through this we should be greatly **encouraged** to lay hold on the hope set before us.

- In order, that, through two unchangeable things in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled to the refuge may have strong **encouragement** to lay hold on the hope set before us. (**Hebrews 6:18**)
- Paul's letter to the Hebrews was a letter of **encouragement**.
- Now I exhort you, brothers, to bear with this word of **encouragement**, for I have, indeed, composed a letter to you in few words. (**Hebrews 13:22**)
- Peter deliver his letter to the congregation through Silvanus, a faithful brother as he accounted him.
- Through Silvanus, a faithful brother, as I account him, I have written you in few words, to give **encouragement** and an earnest witness that this is the true undeserved kindness of God, in which stand firm. (**1 Peter 5:12**)
