(E'noch) [One Trained Up, Inaugurated, that is, dedicated, initiated]

- The son born to Jared at the age of 162, the seventh man in the genealogical line from Adam. In addition to Methuselah, who was born to him when he was 65 years old, Enoch had other sons and daughters. Enoch was one of the so great a cloud of witnesses who were outstanding examples of faith in ancient times. Enoch kept walking with the true God.
- And Jared lived on for a hundred and sixty-two years. Then he became father to **Enoch**. (**Genesis 5:18**)
- And Enoch lived on for sixty-five years. Then he became father to Methuselah. (Genesis 5:21)
- And after his fathering Methuselah Enoch went on walking with the true God three hundred years. Meanwhile he became father to sons and daughters. (Genesis 5:22)
- And after his fathering Methuselah Enoch went on walking with the true God three hundred years. Meanwhile he became father to sons and daughters. (Genesis 5:22)
- By faith Enoch was transferred so as not to see death, and he was nowhere to be found because God had transferred him, for before his transference he had the witness that he had pleased God well. (Hebrews 11:5)
- So, then, because we have so great a cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us also put off every weight and the sin that easily entangles us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us. (Hebrews 12:1)
- As a prophet of Yehowah, he foretold God's coming with His holy myriads to execute judgment against the ungodly.
- Yes, the seventh one in line from Adam, Enoch, prophesied also regarding them, when he said; Look! Yehowah came with his holy myriads. (Jude 1:14)
- To execute judgment against all, and to convict all the ungodly

concerning all their ungodly deeds that they did in an ungodly way, and concerning all the shocking things that ungodly sinners spoke against him. (Jude 1:15)

- Likely persecution was brought against him because of his prophesying. However, God did not permit the opposers to kill Enoch. Instead, Yehowah took him; that is, cut short his life at the age of 365, an age far below that of most of his contemporaries.
- Enoch was transferred so as not to see death, which may mean that God put him in a prophetic trance and then terminated Enoch's life while he was in the trance so that he did not experience the pangs of death.
- And Enoch kept walking with the true God. Then he was no more, for God took him. (Genesis 5:24)
- By faith Enoch was transferred so as not to see death, and he was nowhere to be found because God had transferred him, for before his transference he had the witness that he had pleased God well. (Hebrews 11:5)
- In faith all these died, although they did not get the fulfillment of the promises, but they saw them afar off and welcomed them and publicly declared that they were strangers and temporary residents in the land. (Hebrews 11:13)
- However, he was not taken to heaven, in view of Jesus clear statement at:
- Moreover, no man has ascended into heaven but he that descended from heaven, the Son of man. (John 3:13)
- It appears that, as in the case of Moses body, Yehowah disposed of **Enoch's** body, for he was nowhere to be found.
- After that Moses the servant of Yehowah died there in the land of Moab at the order of Yehowah. (Deuteronomy 34:5)
- And he proceeded to bury him in the valley in the land of Moab in front of Beth-peor, and nobody has come to know his grave down to this day. (Deuteronomy 34:6)
- But when Michael the archangel had a difference with the Devil

and was disputing about Moses body, he did not dare to bring a judgment against him in abusive terms, but said; May Yehowah rebuke you. (Jude 1:9)
