- Paul showed that when Christians first come to know the truth that they are still enslaved by the elementary things of the truth, but that later as they mature they apply Christian counsel to changing their lives according to God's will.
- Likewise we also, when we were babes, continued enslaved by the elementary things belonging to the world. (Galatians 4:3)
- Paul counseled for the aged women not to be enslaved by a lot of wine, but to be teachers of what is good.
- Likewise let the aged women be reverent in behavior, not slanderous, neither enslaved to a lot of wine, teachers of what is good. (Titus 2:3)
- Peter showed that whoever is overcome by another person is then enslaved by that one. Some were promising Christians freedom, but they were really enslaving them to corruption.
- While they are promising them freedom, they themselves are existing as slaves of corruption. For whoever is overcome by another is enslaved by this one. (2 Peter 2:19)
