[English, pleaded, implored, begged, prayed, beseeched, asked, requested]

- When Isaac entreated Yehowah God over the barrenness of Rebekah, Yehowah let himself be entreated.
- And Isaac kept on entreating Yehowah especially for his wife, because she was barren, so Yehowah let himself be entreated for him, and Rebekah his wife became pregnant. (Genesis 25:21)
- Yehowah God let himself be entreated in behalf of the land after the death of Saul.
- Then they buried the bones of Saul and of Jonathan his son in the land of Benjamin in Zela in the burial place of Kish his father, that they might do everything that the king had commanded. So God let himself be entreated for the land after this. (2 Samuel 21:14)
- When David built an altar to Yehowah God, then Yehowah God let himself be entreated, and the scourge was halted.
- And David proceeded to build there an altar to Yehowah and offer up burnt sacrifices and communion sacrifices, and Yehowah began letting himself be entreated for the land, so that the scourge was halted from upon Israel. (2 Samuel 24:25)
- Yehowah God let himself be entreated in favor of the Hagrites, because they trusted in him.
- And they came to be helped against them, so that the Hagrites and all those who were with them were given into their hand, for it was to God that they called for aid in the war, and he let himself be entreated in their favor because they trusted in him. (1 Chronicles 5:20)
- Manasseh kept praying to Yehowah God showing true repentance, and so Yehowah God let himself be entreated by Manasseh.
- And he kept praying to Him, so that He let himself be entreated

by him and He heard his request for favor and restored him to Jerusalem to his kingship, and Manasseh came to know that Yehowah is the true God. (2 Chronicles 33:13)

- Ezra fasted and prayed, and Yehowah God let himself be entreated by him.
- Therefore we fasted and made request of our God concerning this, so that he let himself be entreated by us. (Ezra 8:23)
- The kisses of a hater are things to be entreated.
- The wounds inflicted by a lover are faithful, but the kisses of a hater are things to be entreated. (Proverbs 27:6)
- Isaiah prophesied about how Yehowah God would deal Egypt a blow, and afterwards he would let himself be entreated.
- And Yehowah will certainly deal Egypt a blow. There will be a dealing of a blow and a healing, and they must return to Yehowah, and he must let himself be entreated by them and must heal them. (Isaiah 19:22)
- The master of the slave in Jesus' parable forgave the slave a huge debt when the slave entreated him.
- Then his master summoned him and said to him; Wicked slave, I canceled all that debt for you, when you entreated me. (Matthew 18:32)
- The legion of demons entreated Jesus not to send them out of that country, but to send them into the nearby herd of swine.
- And he entreated him many times not to send the spirits out of the country. (Mark 5:10)
- So they entreated him, saying; Send us into the swine, that we may enter into them. (Mark 5:12)
- Now a herd of a considerable number of swine was feeding there on the mountain, so they entreated him to permit them to enter into those. And he gave them permission. (Luke 8:32)

- Jarius entreated Jesus, begging him at his feet to help his daughter, who was dying.
- And entreated him many times, saying; My little daughter is in an extreme condition. Would you please come and put your hands upon her that she may get well and live. (Mark 5:23)
- They brought to Jesus a man deaf and with a speech impediment, and entreated Jesus to lay his hand of healing upon him.
- Here they brought him a man deaf and with a speech impediment, and they entreated him to lay his hand upon him. (Mark 7:32)
- Now they put in at Bethsaida. Here people brought him a blind man, and they entreated him to touch him. (Mark 8:22)
- The Ethiopian eunuch entreated Phillip to assist him in understanding a prophecy of Isaiah.
- He said; Really, how could I ever do so, unless someone guided me? And he entreated Philip to get on and sit down with him. (Acts of Apostles 8:31)
- The magistrates of the city entreated Paul and Silas to depart from their city, after falsely imprisoning them.
- Consequently they came and entreated them and, after bringing them out, they requested them to depart from the city. (Acts of Apostles 16:39)
- In Puteoli Paul found brothers who entreated him to remain with them for seven days.
- Here we found brothers and were entreated to remain with them seven days, and in this way we came toward Rome. (Acts of Apostles 28:14)
- Paul entreated to speak with the Jews, because of the hope of Israel, for which he was in chains.
- Really on this account I entreated to see and speak to you, for because of the hope of Israel this chain I have around me. (Acts of Apostles 28:20)

- Paul entreated Apollos to come to the brothers in Corinth, but it was not his will at that time.
- Now concerning Apollos our brother, I entreated him very much to come to you with the brothers, and yet it was not his will at all to come now, but he will come when he has the opportunity. (1 Corinthians 16:12)
- Paul three times entreated the Lord that this thorn in the flesh might depart from him.
- In this behalf I three times entreated the Lord that it might depart from me. (2 Corinthians 12:8)
