

~ENTREATING (175)

[English, begging, pleading, beseeching, imploring, prayerful, petitioning]

- Isaac kept **entreating** Yehowah God over the barrenness of his wife Rebekah.
- And Isaac kept on **entreating** Yehowah especially for his wife, because she was barren, so Yehowah let himself be entreated for him, and Rebekah his wife became pregnant. (**Genesis 25:21**)
- Solomon prayed in his temple dedication of Yehowah God to hear the **entreating** cries of his people toward him at this temple.
- And you must turn toward the prayer of your servant and to his request for favor, O Yehowah my God, to listen to the **entreating** cry and to the prayer with which your servant is praying before you today. (**1 Kings 8:28**)
- And you must turn toward the prayer of your servant and to his request for favor, O Yehowah my God, by listening to the **entreating** cry and to the prayer with which your servant is praying before you. (**2 Chronicles 6:19**)
- The Psalmist asked Yehowah God to pay attention to his **entreating** cries, for his prayer was in his integrity, in truth.
- Do hear what is righteous, O Yehowah, do pay attention to my **entreating** cry, do give ear to my prayer without lips of deception. (**Psalms 17:1**)
- Do hear, O God, my **entreating** cry. Do pay attention to my prayer. (**Psalms 61:1**)
- Before you my prayer will come. Incline your ear to my **entreating** cry. (**Psalms 88:2**)
- And he would see the distress of theirs when he heard their **entreating** cry. (**Psalms 106:44**)
- May my **entreating** cry come near before you, O Yehowah. According to your word, O make me understand. (**Psalms**

119:169)

- The Psalmist asked Yehowah God to hear his **entreating** cry, for he had become impoverished.
- Do pay attention to my **entreating** cry, for I have become very much impoverished. Deliver me from my persecutors, for they are stronger than I am. (**Psalms 142:6**)
- Jeremiah was told not to raise an **entreating** cry for his people, for Yehowah God's rage and anger were set against them, there would be no forgiveness, before their calamity came upon them.
- And as for you, do not pray in behalf of this people, neither raise in their behalf an **entreating** cry or a prayer nor beseech me, for I shall not be listening to you. (**Jeremiah 7:16**)
- And as for you, do not pray in behalf of this people, and do not lift up in their behalf an **entreating** cry or a prayer, for I shall not be listening in the time of their calling out to me in regard to their calamity. (**Jeremiah 11:14**)
- When they fast, I am not listening to their **entreating** cry, and when they offer up the whole burnt offering and the grain offering, I am taking no pleasure in them, for by the sword and by famine and by pestilence I am bringing them to their end. (**Jeremiah 14:12**)
- Zephaniah prophesied that the daughter of his scattered ones would make an **entreating** cry for Yehowah God's help.
- From the region of the rivers of Ethiopia the ones **entreating** me, namely, the daughter of my scattered ones, will bring a gift to me. (**Zephaniah 3:10**)
- An army officer's slaves entreated Jesus in his behalf when he entered Capernaum.
- When he entered into Capernaum, an army officer came to him, **entreating** him (**Matthew 8:5**)
- Many sickly ones **entreated** Jesus to just touch the fringe of his outer garments, and all who did so were made well again.

- And they went **entreating** him that they might just touch the fringe of his outer garment, and all those who touched it were made completely well. (**Matthew 14:36**)
- There also came to him a leper, **entreating** him even on bended knee, saying to him; If you just want to, you can make me clean. (**Mark 1:40**)
- One of the demon possessed men Jesus removed the legion from, kept **entreating** him that he might follow after him.
- Now as he was boarding the boat, the man that had been demon-possessed began **entreating** him that he might continue with him. (**Mark 5:18**)
- The demons were continually **entreating** Jesus not to order them to go away into the abyss.
- And they kept **entreating** him not to order them to go away into the abyss. (**Luke 8:31**)
- The Jews were **entreating** Paul to continue speaking the Good News to them on the following Sabbath.
- Now when they were going out, the people began **entreating** for these matters to be spoken to them on the following Sabbath. (**Acts of Apostles 13:42**)
- In a vision of the night Paul saw a man **entreating** him to come over into Macedonia, and assist the people there by preaching the Good News of God to them.
- And during the night a vision appeared to Paul. A certain Macedonian man was standing and **entreating** him and saying, Step over into Macedonia and help us. (**Acts of Apostles 16:9**)
- Paul's friends in the truth were **entreating** him not to go up to Jerusalem.
- Now when we heard this, both we and those of that place began **entreating** him not to go up to Jerusalem. (**Acts of Apostles 21:12**)
