~ERASTUS 2 (26) (E-ras'tus) [Beloved, Lovely]

- The city steward of Corinth whose greetings Paul includes in his letter to the Romans.
- Gaius, my host and that of all the congregation, greets you.
 Erastus the city steward greets you, and so does Quartus his brother (Romans 16:23)
- During excavations in Corinth in 1929 C.E. Professor T. L. Shear discovered a pavement with an inscription, in Latin, that reads: Erastus, procurator and aedile, laid this pavement at his own expense. Although it is not known whether this is the Erastus mentioned by Paul, the pavement is believed to have existed in the First Century C.E.
- It has been suggested that the city steward was also Paul's traveling companion. See ERASTUS 1, above. However, since it would have been difficult for Erastus to accompany Paul and at the same time care for his duties as city steward, those who favor this identification generally conclude that Erastus held this official position at an earlier time and therefore Paul refers to him by this title.
