## ~ETAM 3 (34) (E'tam) [Place of Birds of Prey]

- A town of Judah located probably at Khirbet el-Khokh, on a hill about 2.5 kilometers (1.5 miles) Southwest of Bethlehem. Apparently Etam and Bethlehem had been settled by close relatives.
- And these were the sons of the father of Etam, Jezreel and Ishma and Idbash, and the name of their sister was Hazzelelponi. (1 Chronicles 4:3)
- And Penuel the father of Gedor and Ezer the father of Hushah.

  These were the sons of Hur the firstborn of Ephrathah the father of Bethlehem. (1 Chronicles 4:4)
- According to Josephus, King Solomon often took a morning chariot ride from Jerusalem those 13 kilometers (8 miles) out to Etam, where there were gardens and streams. [Jewish Antiquities, VIII, 186 [vii, 3]]. The town was rebuilt and fortified by Solomon's successor Rehoboam.
- And Rehoboam continued to dwell in Jerusalem and proceeded to build fortified cities in Judah. (2 Chronicles 11:5)
- Thus he rebuilt Bethlehem and Etam and Tekoa. (2 Chronicles 11:6)
- · According to the Talmud, an aqueduct linked Jerusalem with a spring to the West of Etam. [Babylonian Talmud, Yoma 31a, Palestinian (Jerusalem) Talmud, Yoma 41a]
