

## ~EXCELLENT (40)

[English, outstanding, brilliant, exceptional, first-rate, admirable, superb, tremendous Opposite of, **poor**]

- Boaz told Ruth that her reputation was that of an **excellent** woman among his people.
- And now, my daughter, do not be afraid. All that you say I shall do for you, for everyone in the gate of my people is aware that you are an **excellent** woman. (**Ruth 3:11**)
- Luke wrote his letter of Luke to your Most Excellent Theophilus.
- I resolved also, because I have traced all things from the start with accuracy, to write them in logical order to you, most **excellent** Theophilus. (**Luke 1:3**)
- Paul showed that Christians know God's will and approve of things that are **excellent**.
- And you know his will and approve of things that are **excellent** because you are orally instructed out of the Law. (**Romans 2:18**)
- Jesus Christ has inherited a name that is more **excellent** than that of the angels.
- So he has become better than the angels, to the extent that he has inherited a name more **excellent** than theirs. (**Hebrews 1:4**)
- Jesus also has obtained a more **excellent** public service through a better covenant which is established on better promises.
- But now Jesus has obtained a more **excellent** public service, so that he is also the mediator of a correspondingly better covenant, which has been legally established upon better promises. (**Hebrews 8:6**)
