## ~EXCITED (66)

[English, keyed up, eager, thrilled, animated, energized, wound up, Opposite of, bored]

- Joseph's inward emotions were excited when he saw his brother Benjamin among his brothers safe and sound.
- Joseph was now in a hurry, because his inward emotions were excited toward his brother, so that he looked for a place to weep and he went into an interior room and gave way to tears there. (Genesis 43:30)
- The inward emotions of the woman Solomon judged were excited, so that she gave the child to the other woman rather than have to see him die by the sword.
- At once the woman whose son was the living one said to the king, for her inward emotions were excited toward her son, so that she said; Excuse me, my lord! You men, give her the living child. Do not by any means put him to death. All the while this other woman was saying; Neither mine nor yours will he become. You men, do the severing! (1 Kings 3:26)
- The innocent ones gets excited over the apostate.
- Upright people stare in amazement at this, and even the innocent one gets excited over the apostate. (Job 17:8)
- Job would have been judged wicked, if he had had rejoiced over the extinction of the one hating him, or became excited because evil had found him out.
- If I used to rejoice at the extinction of one intensely hating me, or I felt excited because evil had found him. (Job 31:29)
- Babylon was caught by Yehowah God, and this because she excited herself against Yehowah God.
- I have laid a snare for you and you have also been caught, O Babylon, and you yourself did not know it. You were found and also taken hold of, for it was against Yehowah that you excited yourself. (Jeremiah 50:24)

- Paul showed that before becoming Christians, Jews had their sinful passions excited by the restrictions of the Law Covenant, that they might break its tenets leading to their deaths.
- For when we were in accord with the flesh, the sinful passions that were excited by the Law were at work in our members that we should bring forth fruit to death. (Romans 7:5)
- Paul showed that spirit anointed Christians should not be excited by any seemingly inspired expression stating that Yehowah God's day was here, because it would come as a thief. Therefore no advance warning would be given.
- Not to be quickly shaken from your reason nor to be excited either through an inspired expression or through a verbal message or through a letter as though from us, to the effect that the day of Yehowah is here. (2 Thessalonians 2:2)
