## ~EXERCISING (160)

[English, working out, training, keeping fit, doing exercises]

- Abraham's servant asked Laban to tell him if he was exercising loving-kindness toward his master.
- And now if you are actually exercising loving-kindness and trustworthiness toward my master, tell me, but if not, tell me, that I may turn to the right hand or to the left. (Genesis 24:49)
- Yehowah God exercises loving-kindness toward the thousandth generation, in the case of those loving him.
- But exercising loving-kindness toward the thousandth generation in the case of those who love me and keep my commandments. (Exodus 20:6)
- But exercising loving-kindness toward the thousandth generation in the case of those who love me and keep my commandments. (Deuteronomy 5:10)
- Yehowah God is exercising great acts of salvation for his king, David.
- The One doing great acts of salvation for his king and exercising loving-kindness to his anointed one, to David and to his seed for time indefinite. (2 Samuel 22:51)
- He is doing great acts of salvation for his king and exercising loving-kindness to his anointed one, to David and to his seed to time indefinite. (Psalms 18:50)
- Yehowah God showed, that regarding the stone he laid in Zion, no one exercising faith in it would get panicky.
- Therefore this is what the Sovereign Lord Yehowah has said;
  Here I am laying as a foundation in Zion a stone, a tried stone,
  the precious corner of a sure foundation. No one exercising faith
  will get panicky. (Isaiah 28:16)
- Isaiah showed that Yehowah God had kept exercising selfcontrol for a long time, but that now he would let his anger out.

- I have kept quiet for a long time. I continued silent. I kept exercising self-control. Like a woman giving birth I am going to groan, pant, and gasp at the same time. (Isaiah 42:14)
- Yehowah delights in the one exercising knowledge of Yehowah God's loving-kindness, justice and righteousness in the earth.
- But let the one bragging about himself brag about himself because of this very thing, the having of insight and the having of knowledge of me, that I am Yehowah, the One exercising loving-kindness, justice and righteousness in the earth, for in these things I do take delight, is the utterance of Yehowah. (Jeremiah 9:24)
- Yehowah is a God exercising loving-kindness to thousands.
- The One exercising loving-kindness toward thousands, and repaying the error of the fathers into the bosom of their sons after them, the true God, the great One, the mighty One, Yehowah of armies being his name. (Jeremiah 32:18)
- Jesus gave authority to men to become spiritual children of Yehowah God, because they were exercising faith in his name.
- However, as many as did receive him, to them he gave authority to become God's children, because they were exercising faith in his name. (John 1:12)
- Yehowah God loved mankind deeply, so he gave Jesus Christ to mankind so that everyone exercising faith in him, might escape destruction, and find everlasting life through him.
- For God loved the world so much that he gave his only-begotten Son, in order, that everyone exercising faith in him might not be destroyed but have everlasting life. (John 3:16)
- Jesus' brothers were not exercising faith in him early on during his earthly ministry.
- His brothers were, in fact, not exercising faith in him. (John 7:5)
- Jesus gave convincing witness concerning sin, because men were not exercising faith in him.

- In the first place, concerning sin, because they are not exercising faith in me. (John 16:9)
- Paul was exercising himself continually so as to have a consciousness of never sinning against God.
- In this respect, indeed, I am exercising myself continually to have a consciousness of committing no offense against God and men. (Acts of Apostles 24:16)
- Jesus serves as an everlasting offering for sin, for as long as Yehowah God continues exercising his forbearance.
- God set him forth as an offering for propitiation through faith in his blood. This was in order to exhibit his own righteousness, because he was forgiving the sins that occurred in the past while God was exercising forbearance. (Romans 3:25)
- Christ is the end of the Law Covenant, so that everyone exercising faith, may attain to righteousness.
- For Christ is the end of the Law, so that everyone exercising faith may have righteousness. (Romans 10:4)
- The promise, of Abraham, is given only to those exercising faith toward Christ.
- But the Scripture delivered up all things together to the custody of sin, that the promise resulting from faith toward Jesus Christ might be given to those exercising faith. (Galatians 3:22)
- James showed why exercising our patience in faith is necessary, like a farmer waiting for his crops to grow to maturity.
- Exercise patience, therefore, brothers, until the presence of the Lord. Look! The farmer keeps waiting for the precious fruit of the earth, exercising patience over it until he gets the early rain and the late rain. (James 5:7)
- James showed that the prophets were a pattern of those exercising patience in faith.
- Brothers, take as a pattern of the suffering of evil and the

exercising of patience the prophets, who spoke in the name of Yehowah. (James 5:10)

- Yehowah God showed in scripture that no one exercising faith in his foundation stone, Jesus Christ would come to disappointment.
- For it is contained in Scripture; Look! I am laying in Zion a stone, chosen, a foundation cornerstone, precious, and no one exercising faith in it will by any means come to disappointment. (1 Peter 2:6)
