

## ~EXHORTATION (100)

[English, catchphrase, refrain, buzzword, advice, counsel]

- Job heard an insulting **exhortation**, and a response from others lacking in understanding.
- An insulting **exhortation** to me I hear, and a spirit without the understanding that I have replies to me. (**Job 20:3**)
- Yehowah God uncovers the ears of men, and on **exhortation** to them he puts his seal.
- It is then that he uncovers the ear of men, and on **exhortation** to them he puts his seal. (**Job 33:16**)
- Yehowah uncovers the ears of mankind to **exhortation**, so as to turn them back from what is hurtful.
- And he will uncover their ear to **exhortation**, and he will say that they should turn back from what is hurtful. (**Job 36:10**)
- Jeremiah showed that a man bowing to a piece of wood is unreasoning and stupid, for his idol is a mere **exhortation** of vanity.
- And at one and the same time they prove to be unreasoning and stupid. A tree is a mere **exhortation** of vanities. (**Jeremiah 10:8**)
- Through Jeremiah, Yehowah God asked Israel if he had not continually send **exhortations** to them to do good.
- This is what Yehowah of armies, the God of Israel, has said; Go, and you must say to the men of Judah and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem; Did you not continually receive **exhortation** to obey my words? Is the utterance of Yehowah. (**Jeremiah 35:13**)
- Hosea showed that Israel had gone down deep into a slaughtering work, against God's many **exhortations**.
- And in slaughter work those falling away have gone deep down, and I was an **exhortation** to all of them. (**Hosea 5:2**)

- Paul showed that an overseer who **exhorts** others should be at his **exhortation**.
- Or he that exhorts, let him be at his **exhortation**. He that distributes, let him do it with liberality. He that presides, let him do it in real earnest. He that shows mercy, let him do it with cheerfulness. (**Romans 12:8**)
- Paul showed that the **exhortation** he gave did not arise from error, uncleanness or deceit.
- For the **exhortation** we give does not arise from error or from uncleanness or with deceit. (**1 Thessalonians 2:3**)
- Paul relayed the **exhortation** from Jesus Christ that by working with quietness, they should provide food for themselves which they themselves earned.
- To such persons we give the order and **exhortation** in the Lord Jesus Christ that by working with quietness they should eat food they themselves earn. (**2 Thessalonians 3:12**)
- Paul told Timothy to continue applying himself to public reading, to **exhortation**, and to teaching.
- While I am coming, continue applying yourself to public reading, to **exhortation**, to teaching. (**1 Timothy 4:13**)
- Paul showed Hebrew Christians that they had entirely forgotten the godly **exhortation**, that spoke to them as sons of God, about not refusing God's disciplining of them.
- But you have entirely forgotten the **exhortation** which addresses you as sons; My son, do not belittle the discipline from Yehowah, neither give out when you are corrected by him. (**Hebrews 12:5**)
- Peter was an older man himself who gave other older men an **exhortation**, to keep commending themselves to a faithful creator.
- Therefore, to the older men among you I give this **exhortation**, for I too am an older man with them and a witness of the sufferings of the Christ, a sharer even of the glory that is to be revealed. (**1 Peter 5:1**)
