[English, urging, pressing, pushing, encouraging, insisting, pressuring]

- Peter kept exhorting them saying, get saved from this wicked generation.
- And with many other words he bore thorough witness and kept **exhorting** them, saying; Get saved from this crooked generation. (**Acts of Apostles 2:40**)
- The brothers wrote the brothers in Achaia **exhorting** them to receive them kindly.
- Further, because he was desiring to go across into Achaia, the brothers wrote the disciples, **exhorting** them to receive him kindly. So when he got there, he greatly helped those who had believed on account of God's undeserved kindness. (**Acts of Apostles 18:27**)
- Paul **exhorted** his fellow Christians as a father **exhorts** his children.
- In harmony with that you well know how, as a father does his children, we kept **exhorting** each one of you, and consoling and bearing witness to you. (**1 Thessalonians 2:11**)
- Likewise keep on **exhorting** the younger men to be sound in mind. (**Titus 2:6**)
- Keep on speaking these things and **exhorting** and reproving with full authority to command. Let no man ever despise you. (**Titus 2:15**)
- I am **exhorting** you rather on the basis of love, seeing that I am such as I am, Paul an aged man, yes, now also a prisoner for the sake of Christ Jesus. (**Philemon 1:9**)
- I am **exhorting** you concerning my child, to whom I became a father while in my prison bonds, Onesimus. (**Philemon 1:10**)
- But keep on **exhorting** one another each day, as long as it may be called Today, for fear any one of you should become hardened by
