

~EXHORT (130)

[English, urge, press, push, encourage, insist, pressure]

- Paul **exhorted** his spirit anointed Christian brothers through their love of the Holy Spirit, to exert themselves in prayer for him.
- Now I **exhort** you, brothers, through our Lord Jesus Christ and through the love of the spirit, that you exert yourselves with me in prayers to God for me. (**Romans 15:30**)
- Paul **exhorted** his spirit anointed Christians brothers to keep an eye on anyone causing divisions and occasions for stumbling, and avoid them.
- Now I **exhort** you, brothers, to keep your eye on those who cause divisions and occasions for stumbling contrary to the teaching that you have learned, and avoid them. (**Romans 16:17**)
- Paul **exhorted** his spirit anointed Christian brothers to all speak in agreement concerning the Good News of God.
- Now I **exhort** you, brothers, through the name of our Lord Jesus Christ that you should all speak in agreement, and that there should not be divisions among you, but that you may be fitly united in the same mind and in the same line of thought. (**1 Corinthians 1:10**)
- Paul **exhorted** his brothers in Corinth to look up to men like Stephanus, one of his early converts.
- Now I **exhort** you, brothers. You know that the household of Stephanas is the firstfruits of Achaia and that they set themselves to minister to the holy ones. (**1 Corinthians 16:15**)
- Paul **exhorted** his brothers in Corinth to reaffirm their love for a brother who had been disfellowshipped, and then repented.
- Therefore I **exhort** you to confirm your love for him. (**2 Corinthians 2:8**)
- Paul **exhorted** two sisters to make peace between themselves and be of the same mind.

- Euodia I **exhort** and Syntyche I exhort to be of the same mind in the Lord. (**Philippians 4:2**)
- Paul **exhorted** the Thessalonians to continue walking in the things he had taught them, even though he had heard that they were in fact already doing so.
- Finally, brothers, we request you and **exhort** you by the Lord Jesus, just as you received the instruction from us on how you ought to walk and please God, just as you are in fact walking, that you would keep on doing it more fully. (**1 Thessalonians 4:1**)
- And, in fact, you are doing it to all the brothers in all of Macedonia. But we **exhort** you, brothers, to go on doing it in fuller measure. (**1 Thessalonians 4:10**)
- On the other hand, we **exhort** you, brothers, admonish the disorderly, speak consolingly to the depressed souls, support the weak, be long-suffering toward all. (**1 Thessalonians 5:14**)
- Paul exhorted his spirit anointed Christian brothers to pray in behalf of all sorts of men.
- I therefore **exhort**, first of all, that supplications, prayers, intercessions, offerings of thanks, be made concerning all sorts of men. (**1 Timothy 2:1**)
- Paul told Timothy to **exhort** others when the time was unfavorable for public preaching, thus using his energies to build others up spiritually.
- Preach the word, be at it urgently in favorable season, in troublesome season, reprove, reprimand, **exhort**, with all long-suffering and art of teaching. (**2 Timothy 4:2**)
- Paul told Titus that an overseer must be able to **exhort** others by using healthful teachings, and to reprove anyone contradicting what he taught.
- Holding firmly to the faithful word as respects his art of teaching, that he may be able both to **exhort** by the teaching that is healthful and to reprove those who contradict. (**Titus 1:9**)

- Paul **exhorted** the Hebrew Christians to carry in prayer for him, so that he might be restored to them the sooner.
- But I **exhort** you more especially to do this, that I may be restored to you the sooner. (**Hebrews 13:19**)
- Paul asked his spirit anointed Christian brothers to bear the word of his **exhortation**.
- Now I **exhort** you, brothers, to bear with this word of encouragement, for I have, indeed, composed a letter to you in few words. (**Hebrews 13:22**)
- Peter **exhorted** his spirit anointed Christian brothers who were temporary residents in this world, to keep abstaining from fleshly desires, which conflicted with the motivation of the Holy Spirit within them.
- Beloved, I **exhort** you as aliens and temporary residents to keep abstaining from fleshly desires, which are the very ones that carry on a conflict against the soul. (**1 Peter 2:11**)
- Jude **exhorted** his spirit anointed Christian brothers to put up a hard fight for the faith, that had been delivered to them, for many deceivers had gone forth into their world.
- Beloved ones, though I was making every effort to write you about the salvation we hold in common, I found it necessary to write you to **exhort** you to put up a hard fight for the faith that was once for all time delivered to the holy ones. (**Jude 1:3**)
