[English, ended, ran out, finished, terminated, concluded]

- During the flood of Noah's day all flesh on the surface of the ground expired except those within the ark.
- So all flesh that was moving upon the earth expired, among the flying creatures and among the domestic animals and among the wild beasts and among all the swarms that were swarming upon the earth, and all mankind. (Genesis 7:21)
- · Abraham expired and died at a good old age satisfied with his experience in life.
- Then Abraham expired and died in a good old age, old and satisfied, and was gathered to his people. (Genesis 25:8)
- Ishmael expired at an age of 135 years, and was gathered to his people.
- And these are the years of Ishmael's life, a hundred and thirtyseven years. Then he expired and died and was gathered to his people. (Genesis 25:17)
- Isaac died and expired old and satisfied with his days.
- After that Isaac expired and died and was gathered to his people, old and satisfied with days, and Esau and Jacob his sons buried him. (Genesis 35:29)
- Thus Jacob finished giving commands to his sons. Then he gathered his feet up onto the couch and expired and was gathered to his people. (Genesis 49:33)
- The Israelites told Moses, that they wished that they had expired earlier along with the others Yehowah God put to death.
- And the people went quarreling with Moses and saying; If only we had expired when our brothers expired before Yehowah! (Numbers 20:3)
- Aaron expired, and all the assembly mourned for him thirty days.

- And all the assembly got to see that Aaron had expired, and all the house of Israel continued weeping for Aaron thirty days. (Numbers 20:29)
- The days had not expired for David to bring the foreskins to Saul as his marriage price for his daughter.
- So his servants reported these words to David, and the matter was to David's liking, to form a marriage alliance with the king, and the days had not yet expired. (1 Samuel 18:26)
- Jehoram expired and died after a two year long sickness.
- And it came about that in the days to come, even when the term of two full years had expired, his intestines came out during his sickness, and he gradually died in his bad maladies, and his people did not make a burning for him like the burning for his forefathers. (2 Chronicles 21:19)
- Job asked why he had not just expired right in the womb, for it would have been better in his eyes.
- So why from a womb did you bring me out? Could I have expired, that not even an eye could see me. (Job 10:18)
- Jesus let out a loud cry and expired on the torture stake.
- But Jesus let out a loud cry and expired. (Mark 15:37)
- And Jesus called with a loud voice and said; Father, into your hands I entrust my spirit. When he had said this, he expired. (Luke 23:46)
- When the army officer saw how Jesus expired, he was then convinced that Jesus was God's son.
- Now, when the army officer that was standing by with him in view saw he had expired under these circumstances, he said; Certainly this man was God's Son. (Mark 15:39)
- When Ananias heard Peter's words he fell down dead and expired. Later his wife after testifying to her guilt, also did similarly.

- On hearing these words Ananias fell down and expired. And great fear came over all those hearing of it. (Acts of Apostles 5:5)
- Instantly she fell down at his feet and expired. When the young men came in they found her dead, and they carried her out and buried her alongside her husband. (Acts of Apostles 5:10)
- The angel of Yehowah God struck Herod so that he expired.
- Instantly the angel of Yehowah struck him, because he did not give the glory to God, and he became eaten up with worms and expired. (Acts of Apostles 12:23)
