[English, killed, eliminated, annihilated, destroyed, eradicated, wiped out, took out, decimated, massacred]

- Phineas kept Yehowah God back from exterminating his people over the affair of Peor.
- Phinehas the son of Eleazar the son of Aaron the priest has turned back my wrath from upon the sons of Israel by his tolerating no rivalry at all toward me in the midst of them, so that I have not exterminated the sons of Israel in my insistence on exclusive devotion. (Numbers 25:11)
- Joshua was told that no one would take a firm stand against him, until he had exterminated all the nations of Canaan from before him.
- And he will certainly give their kings into your hand, and you must destroy their names from under the heavens. Nobody will take a firm stand against you, until you have exterminated them. (Deuteronomy 7:24)
- One of the maledictions for not keeping the Law Covenant was that Yehowah God would bring a pestilence upon Israel until he had exterminated them.
- Yehowah will cause the pestilence to cling to you until he has exterminated you from off the ground to which you are going to take possession of it. (Deuteronomy 28:21)
- Yehowah God sent Saul on a mission to exterminate the Amalekites.
- Later Yehowah sent you on a mission and said; Go, and you must devote the sinners, the Amalekites, to destruction, and you must fight against them until you will have exterminated them. (1 Samuel 15:18)
- The Gibeonites asked David for justice against the man that tried to exterminate them.
- At this they said to the king; The man that exterminated us and that schemed to annihilate us from subsisting in any of the

territory of Israel. (2 Samuel 21:5)

- In David's song he showed that he would not return until his enemies were exterminated.
- I will pursue my enemies, that I may annihilate them, and I shall not return until they are exterminated. (2 Samuel 22:38)
- I shall pursue my enemies and overtake them, and I shall not return until they are exterminated. (Psalms 18:37)
- The sons of Canaan who had not been exterminated, Solomon used for forced labor.
- From their sons that had been left behind them in the land, whom the sons of Israel had not exterminated, Solomon kept levying men for forced labor until this day. (2 Chronicles 8:8)
- The Psalmist felt when feeling panicky, that he might be exterminated from in front of Yehowah God's eyes.
- As for me, I said when I became panicky; I shall certainly be exterminated from in front of your eyes. Surely you have heard the voice of my entreaties when I cried to you for help. (Psalms 31:22)
- In a little while they would have exterminated me in the earth, but I myself did not leave your orders. (Psalms 119:87)
- Jeremiah showed that despite severe discipline to the point of exterminating his people, they refused to accept his discipline.
- O Yehowah, are not those eyes of yours toward faithfulness? You have struck them, but they did not become ill. You exterminated them. They refused to take discipline. They made their faces harder than a crag. They refused to turn back. (Jeremiah 5:3)
- Through Jeremiah Yehowah God promised to send a sword after the exiles that survived Jerusalem's destruction, until he had exterminated them.
- And I will scatter them among the nations that neither they nor their fathers have known, and I will send after them the sword

until I shall have exterminated them. (Jeremiah 9:16)

- Yehowah God promised the Jeremiah to exterminate the Elamites.
- And I will shatter the Elamites before their enemies and before those seeking for their soul, and I will bring upon them a calamity, my burning anger, is the utterance of Yehowah. And I will send after them the sword until I shall have exterminated them. (Jeremiah 49:37)
