- Once Esau realized that he had lost his father's blessing he cried out in an extremely loud and bitter manner.
- On hearing his father's words Esau began to cry out in an extremely loud and bitter manner and to say to his father; Bless me, even me too, my father! (Genesis 27:34)
- The fighting of Israel came to be extremely hard on that day and Israel was finally defeated before the servants of David.
- And the fighting came to be extremely hard on that day, and Abner and the men of Israel were finally defeated before the servants of David. (2 Samuel 2:17)
- Jeremiah bemoaned that his people had been struck with an extremely sickish stroke.
- And you must say to them this word, Let my eyes run down with tears night and day and let them not keep still, for with a great crash the virgin daughter of my people has been broken, with an extremely sickish stroke. (Jeremiah 14:17)
- Paul showed that before his conversion to Christianity he had been extremely mad against Christians and even went so far as to persecute them into distant cities.
- And by punishing them many times in all the synagogues I tried to force them to make a recantation, and since I was extremely mad against them, I went so far as to persecuting them even in outside cities. (Acts of Apostles 26:11)
