

~EXULTING (62)

[English, reveling, taking pride, gloating, glorifying, triumphing, wallowing, rejoicing, Opposite of, **lamenting**]

- The Psalmist exulted over the saying of Yehowah's mouth like someone finding great spoil, because of the wisdom they contained.
- I am **exulting** over your saying just as one does when finding much spoil. (**Psalms 119:162**)
- When the righteous ones are exulting there is abundant beauty.
- When the righteous ones are **exulting**, there is abundant beauty, but when the wicked ones rise up, a man disguises himself. (**Proverbs 28:12**)
- You have met up with the one **exulting** and doing righteousness, those who keep remembering you in your own ways. Look! You yourself became indignant, while we kept sinning, in them a long time, and should we be saved? (**Isaiah 64:5**)
- Jeremiah was serious about his prophetic work for Yehowah not sitting down in the intimate group of those playing jokes and exulting.
- I have not sat down in the intimate group of those playing jokes and begun **exulting**. Because of your hand I have sat down all by myself, for it is with denunciation that you have filled me. (**Jeremiah 15:17**)
- Jeremiah prophesied against Babylon and Chaldea, because they rejoiced at the pillaging of Israel's inheritance.
- For you men kept rejoicing, for you men kept **exulting** when pillaging my own inheritance. For you kept pawing like a heifer in the tender grass, and you kept neighing like stallions. (**Jeremiah 50:11**)
- Paul showed that the reconciliation with God through Jesus Christ was a cause for rejoicing to all Christians.
- And not only that, but we are also **exulting** in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the

reconciliation. (**Romans 5:11**)

- Paul counseled Gentile Christians not to be exulting over the native Jewish branches that were lopped off for it is the root that feeds all of the branches and not the other way around.
- Do not be **exulting** over the branches. If, though, you are exulting over them, it is not you that bear the root, but the root bears you. (**Romans 11:18**)
- Paul showed that there was cause for exulting in Jesus Christ when it comes to things pertaining to God.
- Therefore I have cause for **exulting** in Christ Jesus when it comes to things pertaining to God. (**Romans 15:17**)
