- Foreigners will fade away in their opposition to Yehowah and they will come quaking to him from their bulwarks.
- Foreigners themselves will fade away, and they will come quaking out from their bulwarks. (2 Samuel 22:46)
- Foreigners themselves will fade away, and they will come quaking out from their bulwarks. (Psalms 18:45)
- Job shows that the mountains and stones thought durable will all fade away before Yehowah.
- However, a mountain itself, falling, will fade away, and even a rock will be moved away from its place. (Job 14:18)
- The Psalmist shows that the wicked will like green new grass all fade away.
- For like grass they will speedily wither, and like green new grass they will fade away. (Psalms 37:2)
- Isaiah shows that the fishers with their nets along the Nile River will all fade away.
- And the fishers will have to mourn, and all those casting fishhooks into the Nile River must express sorrow, and even those spreading fishing nets upon the surface of the water will actually fade away. (Isaiah 19:8)
- Mankind is unclean, like a garment used for menstruation, and all of mankind's error will make them fade away like the leafage that turns.
- And we become like someone unclean, all of us, and all our acts of righteousness are like a garment for periods of menstruation, and we shall fade away like leafage, all of us, and our errors themselves will carry us away just like a wind. (Isaiah 64:6)

- In the face of Yehowah's great day the land will mourn and every inhabitant will fade away and even the fishes of the sea will be gathered together in death.
- That is why the land will mourn and every inhabitant in it will have to fade away with the wild beast of the field and with the flying creature of the heavens, and even the fishes of the sea themselves will be gathered in death. (Hosea 4:3)
- The rich man is compared to the flower that withers and whose outward beauty fades away, so too the rich man will fade away in his ways of life.
- For the sun rises with its burning heat and withers the vegetation, and its flower drops off and the beauty of its outward appearance perishes. So, too, the rich man will fade away in his ways of life. (James 1:11)
