[English, vanishing, evaporation, loss, desertion, departure, Opposite of, appearance]

- Judges speaks of the fading of the day referring to early evening and sunset.
- When he got up early in the morning on the fifth day to go, the father of the young woman then said; Please, take sustenance for your heart. And they lingered until the **fading** away of the day. And both of them kept eating. (**Judges 19:8**)
- The Psalmist cries out to Yehowah for he is fading away and deeply disturbed.
- Show me favor, O Yehowah, for I am **fading** away. Heal me, O Yehowah, for my bones have been disturbed. (**Psalms 6:2**)
- Isaiah refers to the fading crown of the eminent ones of Ephraim who have become spiritual drunkards.
- Woe to the eminent crown of the drunkards of Ephraim, and the **fading** blossom of its decoration of beauty that is upon the head of the fertile valley of those overpowered by wine! (**Isaiah 28:1**)
- And the **fading** flower of its decoration of beauty that is upon the head of the fertile valley must become like the early fig before summer, that, when the seer sees it, while it is yet in his palm, he swallows it down. (**Isaiah 28:4**)
