- Moses calls Yehowah God a faithful God who keeps his promises and always acts with loving-kindness toward his people.
- And you well know that Yehowah your God is the true God, the faithful God, keeping covenant and loving-kindness in the case of those who love him and those who keep his commandments to a thousand generations. (Deuteronomy 7:9)
- Unfaithful Eli was told that Yehowah God would raise up for himself a faithful priesthood, one not coming from Eli's unfaithful sons.
- And I shall certainly raise up for myself a faithful priest. In harmony with what is in my heart and in my soul he will do, and I shall certainly build for him a lasting house, and he will certainly walk before my anointed one always. (1 Samuel 2:35)
- A himelech saw David as the most faithful man among the household of Saul.
- At this Ahimelech answered the king and said; And who among all your servants is like David, faithful, and the son-in-law of the king and a chief over your bodyguard and honored in your house? (1 Samuel 22:14)
- The woman speaking to Joab, told him that she represented the loyal and faithful ones in Israel.
- I represent the peaceable and faithful ones of Israel. You are seeking to put to death a city and a mother in Israel. Why should you swallow up the inheritance of Yehowah? (2 Samuel 20:19)
- David asked for Yehowah God to let his promises to him prove faithful, for a kingdom in his family line to time indefinite.
- And now, O Yehowah, let the word that you have spoken concerning your servant and concerning his house prove faithful to time indefinite, and do just as you have spoken. (1 Chronicles 17:23)

- And let your name prove faithful and become great to time indefinite, saying; Yehowah of armies, the God of Israel, is God to Israel, and let the house of David your servant be one lasting before you. (1 Chronicles 17:24)
- Solomon later also asked Yehowah God to be faithful to this promise.
- Now, O Yehowah God, let your promise with David my father prove faithful, for you yourself have made me king over a people as numerous as the dust particles of the earth. (2 Chronicles 1:9)
- Hezekiah continued to be faithful, and do what was right before Yehowah throughout Judah.
- And Hezekiah proceeded to do like this in all Judah, and he continued to do what was good and right and faithful before Yehowah his God. (2 Chronicles 31:20)
- Later after this faithful course of Hezekiah, Sennacherib came to invade Judah, and Yehowah God protected Judah.
- After these things and this faithful course Sennacherib the king of Assyria came and proceeded to invade Judah and camp against the fortified cities, and kept thinking of making them his by a breakthrough. (2 Chronicles 32:1)
- Nehemiah showed, that Yehowah God found the heart of Abraham faithful to him, and so made many promises to him concerning the Promised Land.
- And you found his heart faithful before you, so there was a contracting of the covenant with him to give him the land of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites and the Perizzites and the Jebusites and the Girgashites, to give it to his seed, and you proceeded to carry out your words, because you are righteous. (Nehemiah 9:8)
- Nehemiah put certain men in charge of the stores for the temple, because they were faithful men.
- Then I put Shelemiah the priest and Zadok the copyist and Pedaiah of the Levites in charge of the stores, and under their

control there was Hanan the son of Zaccur the son of Mattaniah, for they were considered faithful, and upon them it devolved to do the distributing to their brothers. (Nehemiah 13:13)

- Job showed that Yehowah God is removing speech from the faithful ones, because their witness will not be heard within this present system of things.
- He is removing speech from the faithful ones, and the sensibleness of old men he takes away. (Job 12:20)
- The Psalmist asked for Yehowah God to save him for faithful people had vanished from the earth.
- Do save me, O Yehowah, for the loyal one has come to an end, for faithful people have vanished from the sons of men. (Psalms 12:1)
- Yehowah is safeguarding the faithful ones, but paying back their haughtiness to the haughty ones.
- O love Yehowah, all you loyal ones of his. The faithful ones Yehowah is safeguarding, but he is rewarding exceedingly anyone showing haughtiness. (Psalms 31:23)
- The Psalmist showed, that the heart of the men of Israel was not faithful to their God Yehowah.
- And their heart was not steadfast with him, and they did not prove faithful in his covenant. (Psalms 78:37)
- The Psalmist realized, that his covenant of faithfulness to his God must be to time indefinite.
- To time indefinite I shall preserve my loving-kindness toward him, and my covenant will be faithful to him. (Psalms 89:28)
- Yehowah God's covenant to David for a kingdom was enduring, like a faithful witness in the skies, the moon and stars.
- As the moon it will be firmly established for time indefinite, and as a faithful witness in the skies. (Psalms 89:37)

- Yehowah God searches out faithful men to have close association with him, the one walking faultlessly, is the one who will minister to him.
- My eyes are upon the faithful ones of the earth, that they may dwell with me. The one walking in a faultless way, the it is who will minister to me. (Psalms 101:6)
- The one faithful in spirit, covers over a matter, forgiving the harm done to him.
- The one walking about as a slanderer is uncovering confidential talk, but the one faithful in spirit is covering over a matter. (Proverbs 11:13)
- A wicked messenger will fall into bad, but a faithful envoy proves to be a healing.
- A messenger that is wicked will fall into bad, but a faithful envoy is a healing. (Proverbs 13:17)
- A faithful witness will not lie.
- A faithful witness is one that will not lie, but a false witness launches forth mere lies. (Proverbs 14:5)
- Most men proclaim their own loving-kindness and goodness before others, but a man who is truly faithful is hard to find.
- A multitude of men will proclaim each one his own lovingkindness, but a faithful man who can find? (Proverbs 20:6)
- The faithful envoy is like a breath of snow on the day of harvest, refreshing to his master.
- Just like the coolness of snow in the day of harvest is the faithful envoy to those sending him, for he restores the very soul of his masters. (Proverbs 25:13)
- The wounds inflicted by a lover are faithful.
- The wounds inflicted by a lover are faithful, but the kisses of a hater are things to be entreated. (Proverbs 27:6)

- A man of faithful acts will get many blessings from Yehowah God.
- A man of faithful acts will get many blessings, but he that is hastening to gain riches will not remain innocent. (Proverbs 28:20)
- Isaiah bemoaned how the once faithful town, Jerusalem, had become a prostitute, for the fine qualities of her God, justice and righteousness no longer resided within her.
- O how the faithful town has become a prostitute! She was full of justice, righteousness itself used to lodge in her, but now murderers. (Isaiah 1:21)
- Through Isaiah, Yehowah God promised to bring back Jerusalem to her former state, and she would come to be called again, Faithful Town.
- And I will bring back again judges for you as at the first, and counselors for you as at the start. After this you will be called City of Righteousness, Faithful Town. (Isaiah 1:26)
- Isaiah sought out attestation for what Yehowah God did through him, from faithful witnesses.
- And let me have attestation for myself by faithful witnesses, Uriah the priest and Zechariah the son of Jeberechiah. (Isaiah 8:2)
- Isaiah calls for the Jews to open the gates of Jerusalem so that the righteous nation that is keeping faithful conduct may enter in. This first began to happen with the influx of Gentile Christians following Pentecost of 33 C.E.
- Open the gates, you men, that the righteous nation that is keeping faithful conduct may enter. (Isaiah 26:2)
- Because Yehowah God is faithful, he will raise up his seed of promise, making kings and princes bow down before him.
- This is what Yehowah, the Repurchaser of Israel, his Holy One, has said to him that is despised in soul, to him that is detested by the nation, to the servant of rulers; Kings themselves will see

and certainly rise up, and princes, and they will bow down, by reason of Yehowah, who is faithful, the Holy One of Israel, who chooses you. (Isaiah 49:7)

- Isaiah prophesies about the indefinitely lasting covenant to David that is faithful, the covenant for a kingship to time indefinite.
- Incline your ear and come to me. Listen, and your soul will keep alive, and I shall readily conclude with you people an indefinitely lasting covenant respecting the loving-kindnesses to David that are faithful. (Isaiah 55:3)
- The Jewish remnant leaving Judea swore to do as Yehowah God instructed them to faithfully do, but then turned around and did exactly as they were told not to do.
- And they, for their part, said to Jeremiah; May Yehowah prove to be a true and faithful witness against us if it is not according to every word with which Yehowah your God sends you to us that we shall exactly do. (Jeremiah 42:5)
- Jesus asked who really was the faithful and discreet slave whom his master appointed over his slaves to feed them. This faithful slave pointed back to the scriptural example of Joseph in Egypt, who would serve as a type for important future events.
- Who really is the faithful and discreet slave whom his master appointed over his domestics, to give them their food at the proper time? (Matthew 24:45)
- And the Lord said; Who really is the faithful steward, the discreet one, whom his master will appoint over his body of attendants to keep giving them their measure of food supplies at the proper time? (Luke 12:42)
- In Jesus' parable, he commended the **faithful** slave for increasing his belongings in his absence.
- His master said to him; Well done, good and faithful slave! You were faithful over a few things. I will appoint you over many things. Enter into the joy of your master. (Matthew 25:21)
- His master said to him; Well done, good and faithful slave! You were faithful over a few things. I will appoint you over many

- things. Enter into the joy of your master. (Matthew 25:23)
- So he said to him; Well done, good slave! Because in a very small matter you have proved yourself faithful, hold authority over ten cities. (Luke 19:17)
- Jesus showed that anyone faithful in small things will also be faithful in large or important things.
- The person faithful in what is least is faithful also in much, and the person unrighteous in what is least is unrighteous also in much. (Luke 16:10)
- Jesus showed that if his disciples could not first prove themselves faithful in regard to unrighteous riches, like money, then who would be foolish enough to entrust them with true riches, spiritual things.
- Therefore, if you have not proved yourselves faithful in connection with the unrighteous riches, who will entrust you with what is true? (Luke 16:11)
- In another illustration he showed, that if a slave could not be found faithful, in the taking care of his master's things, then who would be foolish enough to give him things of his own to take care of.
- And if you have not proved yourselves faithful in connection with what is another's, who will give you what is for yourselves? (Luke 16:12)
- The faithful ones accompanying Peter, were amazed when the Holy Spirit feel upon Cornelius and all his household.
- And the faithful ones that had come with Peter who were of those circumcised were amazed, because the free gift of the Holy Spirit was being poured out also upon people of the nations. (Acts of Apostles 10:45)
- Peter quoting from Yehowah God's promise to give to David the loving kindnesses that were faithful, proved that the Christ would be resurrected.
- And that fact that he resurrected him from the dead destined no more to return to corruption, he has stated in this way, I will give

you people the loving-kindnesses to David that are faithful. (Acts of Apostles 13:34)

- Lydia asked Paul and his traveling companions to stay in her house, if they considered her to be faithful.
- Now when she and her household got baptized, she said with entreaty; If you men have judged me to be faithful to Yehowah, enter into my house and stay. And she just made us come. (Acts of Apostles 16:15)
- Paul encouraged the Corinthians, by showing that Yehowah God, who had called them to heavenly glory, was a faithful God, he would see them through all their troubles on earth to success.
- God is faithful, by whom you were called into a sharing with his Son Jesus Christ our Lord. (1 Corinthians 1:9)
- Paul showed, that what is looked for in stewards, or elders and ministerial servants, if for them to be found faithful.
- Besides, in this case, what is looked for in stewards is for a man to be found faithful. (1 Corinthians 4:2)
- Paul viewed Timothy as a beloved and faithful child in the faith.
- That is why I am sending Timothy to you, as he is my beloved and faithful child in the Lord, and he will put you in mind of my methods in connection with Christ Jesus, just as I am teaching everywhere in every congregation. (1 Corinthians 4:17)
- Paul gave his opinion in a matter concerning virgins, for he was one that had been shown mercy by the Lord Jesus Christ, so as to remain faithful.
- Now concerning virgins I have no command from the Lord, but I give my opinion as one who had mercy shown him by the Lord to be faithful. (1 Corinthians 7:25)
- Paul showed the Corinthians, that Yehowah God is faithful, he will not let his spirit anointed Christian sons to be tempted beyond what they can bear, but will make a way out for them.
- No temptation has taken you except what is common to men.

But God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear, but along with the temptation he will also make the way out in order for you to be able to endure it. (1 Corinthians 10:13)

- Paul asked the Corinthians, just what portion or sharing could a faithful man have with an unbeliever, for their two courses in life were directly opposed.
- Further, what harmony is there between Christ and Belial? Or what portion does a faithful person have with an unbeliever? (2 Corinthians 6:15)
- Paul showed that all the remaining seed of promise who adhere to the same faith of Abraham, are being blessed, together with faithful Abraham.
- Consequently those who adhere to faith are being blessed together with faithful Abraham. (Galatians 3:9)
- Paul addressed his letter to the Ephesians to the faithful ones there, in union with Christ.
- Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus through God's will, to the holy ones who are in Ephesus and faithful ones in union with Christ Jesus. (Ephesians 1:1)
- Paul sent Tychicus to Ephesus to let the brothers there know of his welfare, because he was a faithful minister in the Lord.
- Now in order, that you may also know about my affairs, as to how I am doing, Tychicus, a beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord, will make everything known to you. (Ephesians 6:21)
- Paul addressed his letter to the Colossians to the holy ones and faithful brothers in union with Christ.
- To the holy ones and faithful brothers in union with Christ at Colossae. May you have undeserved kindness and peace from God our Father. (Colossians 1:2)
- Paul called Epaphras his beloved fellow slave and a faithful minister of Christ.

- That is what you have learned from Epaphras our beloved fellow slave, who is a faithful minister of the Christ on our behalf. (Colossians 1:7)
- Paul addressed Tychicus and Onesimus as his beloved brothers and faithful ministers of Christ.
- All my affairs Tychicus, my beloved brother and faithful minister and fellow slave in the Lord, will make known to you. (Colossians 4:7)
- Along with Onesimus, my faithful and beloved brother, who is from among you. All the things here they will make known to you. (Colossians 4:9)
- Paul bore in mind the faithful work of the Thessalonians, and their loving labor and endurance in fine works for Christ.
- For we bear incessantly in mind your faithful work and your loving labor and your endurance due to your hope in our Lord Jesus Christ before our God and Father. (1 Thessalonians 1:3)
- Paul assured the Thessalonians that those one calling them to heavenly glory was faithful, and he would make it happen in time.
- He who is calling you is **faithful**, and he will also do it. (1 Thessalonians 5:24)
- This faithful one would also keep them from the wicked one, for that was his purpose for them.
- But the Lord is **faithful**, and he will make you firm and keep you from the wicked one. (2 Thessalonians 3:3)
- Paul was grateful to Christ because he considered him faithful, the proof of this being the ministry Christ assigned to Paul.
- I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who imparted power to me, because he considered me faithful by assigning me to a ministry. (1 Timothy 1:12)
- Paul showed that the statement that Christ came into the world to save sinners was a faithful statement.

- Faithful and deserving of full acceptance is the saying that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. Of these I am foremost. (1 Timothy 1:15)
- Paul told Timothy that the statement was faithful, that if any man was reaching out for the office of an overseer, he was seeking a fine thing for himself and others.
- That statement is **faithful**. If any man is reaching out for an office of overseer, he is desirous of a fine work. (1 Timothy 3:1)
- Women in the congregation should be serious, moderate in habits, and faithful in all things.
- Women should likewise be serious, not slanderous, moderate in habits, faithful in all things. (1 Timothy 3:11)
- Paul told Timothy that his prior statement about physical training being beneficial for a little, but spiritual training beneficial for all things, was a faithful statement.
- Faithful and deserving of full acceptance is that statement. (1 Timothy 4:9)
- Paul was working hard in the truth, because he knew he had rested his hope on a living God who is a savior especially of faithful men.
- For to this end we are working hard and exerting ourselves, because we have rested our hope on a living God, who is a Savior of all sorts of men, especially of faithful ones. (1 Timothy 4:10)
- Paul encouraged Timothy to become an example to faithful older ones, in speaking, conduct, love, faith and chasteness.
- Let no man ever look down on your youth. On the contrary, become an example to the faithful ones in speaking, in conduct, in love, in faith, in chasteness. (1 Timothy 4:12)
- Paul counseled Timothy to report the things he had been taught by Paul to other faithful men, thus making them adequately qualified to teach others.
- And the things you heard from me with the support of many

witnesses, these things commit to faithful men, who, in turn, will be adequately qualified to teach others. (2 Timothy 2:2)

- Paul showed that the saying, that if spirit anointed Christians died together with Christ in the doing of God's will for them, that they will also live together, as Christ is now living, was a faithful statement.
- Faithful is the saying. Certainly if we died together, we shall also live together. (2 Timothy 2:11)
- Paul showed Timothy, that if spirit anointed Christians prove unfaithful, that Christ always remains faithful, for he cannot deny what he is.
- If we are unfaithful, he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself. (2 Timothy 2:13)
- Paul counseled overseers to hold faithfully to the teachings of the Bible in their art of teaching.
- Holding firmly to the faithful word as respects his art of teaching, that he may be able both to exhort by the teaching that is healthful and to reprove those who contradict. (Titus 1:9)
- Paul said that the saying was faithful that Christians should keep their minds fixed upon maintaining fine works.
- Faithful is the saying, and concerning these things I desire you to make firm assertions constantly, in order, that those who have believed God may keep their minds on maintaining fine works.

  These things are fine and beneficial to men. (Titus 3:8)
- Jesus was obliged to become like his spiritual brothers in all respects, in order to become a merciful and faithful High Priest before Yehowah God.
- Consequently he was obliged to become like his brothers in all respects, that he might become a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, in order to offer propitiatory sacrifice for the sins of the people. (Hebrews 2:17)
- Jesus was faithful to the one who made him High Priest, just as Moses was in all that house of worship.

- He was faithful to the One that made him such, as Moses was also in all the house of that One. (Hebrews 3:2)
- The things Moses proved faithful in doing toward Israel, served as a testimony of things to come later on.
- And Moses as an attendant was faithful in all the house of that One as a testimony of the things that were to be spoken afterwards. (Hebrews 3:5)
- Jesus, unlike God's slave Moses, was faithful as a son, over the house of God.
- But Christ was faithful as a Son over the house of that One. We are the house of that One, if we make fast our hold on our freeness of speech and our boasting over the hope firm to the end. (Hebrews 3:6)
- Spirit anointed Christians must hold fast to the public declaration of their faith, for he is faithful that promised.
- Let us hold fast the public declaration of our hope without wavering, for he is faithful that promised. (Hebrews 10:23)
- Sarah conceived seed when she was really too old to bear children, because she esteemed Yehowah God as faithful to his promise.
- By faith also Sarah herself received power to conceive seed, even when she was past the age limit, since she esteemed him faithful who had promised. (Hebrews 11:11)
- Paul encourages all faithful spirit anointed Christians to commend themselves to God, their faithful creator.
- So, then, also let those who are suffering in harmony with the will of God keep on commending their souls to a faithful Creator while they are doing good. (1 Peter 4:19)
- Paul accounted Silvanus as a faithful brother.
- Through Silvanus, a faithful brother, as I account him, I have written you in few words, to give encouragement and an earnest witness that this is the true undeserved kindness of God, in

## which stand firm. (1 Peter 5:12)

- If we come to Christ and confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous so as to forgive us our sins.
- If we confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous so as to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9)
- John assured his friend that he was doing a faithful work in assisting those ones sent out to visit the congregations.
- Beloved one, you are doing a **faithful** work in whatever you do for the brothers, and strangers at that. (3 John 1:5)
- Jesus Christ is described as the faithful and true witness.
- And from Jesus Christ, the Faithful Witness, The firstborn from the dead, and The Ruler of the kings of the earth. To him that loves us and that loosed us from our sins by means of his own blood. (Revelation 1:5)
- And to the angel of the congregation in Laodicea write. These are the things that the Amen says, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation by God. (Revelation 3:14)
- And I saw the heaven opened, and, look! A white horse. And the one seated upon it is called **Faithful** and True, and he judges and carries on war in righteousness. (Revelation 19:11)
- Jesus encouraged his disciples to remain faithful through difficult testings, and he would give to them the crown of life.
- Do not be afraid of the things you are about to suffer. Look! The Devil will keep on throwing some of you into prison that you may be fully put to the test, and that you may have tribulation ten days. Prove yourself faithful even to death, and I will give you the crown of life. (Revelation 2:10)
- Jesus commended Christians who remained faithful, even though his faithful one Antipas was killed among them.
- I know where you are dwelling, that is, where the throne of Satan is, and yet you keep on holding fast my name, and you did

not deny your faith in me even in the days of Antipas, my witness, the faithful one, who was killed by your side, where Satan is dwelling. (Revelation 2:13)

- Those called and chosen and faithful to the Lord will share in his victory over the nations.
- These will battle with the Lamb, but, because he is Lord of lords and King of kings, the Lamb will conquer them. Also, those called and chosen and faithful with him will do so. (Revelation 17:14)
- The angel told John to write down the Revelation vision, because these words are faithful and true.
- And the One seated on the throne said; Look! I am making all things new. Also, he says; Write, because these words are faithful and true. (Revelation 21:5)
- Yehowah the God of the inspired expressions of the prophets sent his angel forth to show his slaves the things that must shortly take place. (Revelation 22:6)
