[English, fake, bogus, sham, phony, counterfeit, forged, copy, artificial, fictitious, pretend, put on, insincere, Opposite of, true]

- Abimelech made Abraham swear to him that he would not be false to him in his future actions, based upon how he had dealt with Abraham.
- So now swear to me here by God that you will not prove false to me and to my offspring and to my posterity, that, according to the loyal love with which I have dealt with you, you will deal with me and with the land in which you have been residing as an alien. (Genesis 21:23)
- The Pharaoh of Egypt told the Israelite men not to pay attention to false words, the words of Moses and Aaron.
- Let the service be heavy upon the men and let them work at it, and let them not pay attention to false words. (Exodus 5:9)
- Part of the Law Covenant was for Israelites to keep far from a false word, or a lie.
- You are to keep far from a false word. And do not kill the innocent and the righteous, for I shall not declare the wicked one righteous. (Exodus 23:7)
- Judges within Israel were to search out testimony thoroughly to see if it was false.
- And the judges must search thoroughly, and if the witness is a false witness and has brought a false charge against his brother. (Deuteronomy 19:18)
- The excellency of Israel, Yehowah God will not prove to be false.
- And, besides, the Excellency of Israel will not prove false, and He will not feel regrets, for He is not an earthling man so as to feel regrets. (1 Samuel 15:29)
- The woman asked the man of the true God not to mislead her into a false hope.

- She now said; Did I ask for a son through my lord? Did I not say; You must not lead me to a false hope? (2 Kings 4:28)
- The men approaching Jehu thought that his statements to them were false.
- But they said; It is false! Tell us, please. Then he said; It was like this and like that that he talked to me, saying; This is what Yehowah has said; I do anoint you as king over Israel. (2 Kings 9:12)
- The Psalmist asked Yehowah God not to give him over to the soul of his adversaries, for many false witnesses had risen up against him.
- Do not give me over to the soul of my adversaries, for against me false witnesses have risen up, and he who launches forth violence. (Psalms 27:12)
- The Psalmist called for false lips to become speechless, for they speak against the righteous one unrestrainedly in haughtiness and contempt.
- May false lips become speechless, that are speaking against the righteous one, unrestrainedly in haughtiness and contempt. (Psalms 31:18)
- The Psalmist showed, that he would not prove false in his faithfulness to Yehowah God.
- But my loving-kindness I shall not break off from him, nor shall I prove false with regard to my faithfulness. (Psalms 89:33)
- The Psalmist asked Yehowah God to remove him from the false way.
- Remove from me even the false way, and favor me with your own Law. (Psalms 119:29)
- The Psalmist showed, that by closely following Yehowah God's orders, he had hated and avoided every false path in life.
- Owing to your orders I behave with understanding. That is why I have hated every false path. (Psalms 119:104)

- That is why I have considered all orders regarding all things to be right, every false path I have hated. (Psalms 119:128)
- The Psalmist asked Yehowah God to deliver his soul from false lips and a tricky tongue.
- O Yehowah, do deliver my soul from false lips, from the tricky tongue. (Psalms 120:2)
- Things Yehowah God does hate are a false tongue, lofty eyes, and hands that are shedding blood.
- Lofty eyes, a false tongue, and hands that are shedding innocent blood. (Proverbs 6:17)
- . A false witness launches forth mere lies.
- A false witness that launches forth lies, and anyone sending forth contentions among brothers. (Proverbs 6:19)
- The wicked man earns false wages, but the one sowing in righteousness, true earnings.
- The wicked one is making false wages, but the one sowing righteousness, true earnings. (Proverbs 11:18)
- A false witness launches forth only deception.
- He that launches forth faithfulness will tell what is righteous, but a false witness, deception. (Proverbs 12:17)
- False lips are something detestable to Yehowah God.
- False lips are something detestable to Yehowah, but those acting in faithfulness are a pleasure to him. (Proverbs 12:22)
- A false word the righteous one hates.
- A false word is what the righteous hates, but the wicked ones act shamefully and cause disgrace for themselves. (Proverbs 13:5)
- A false witness launches forth mere lies.

- A faithful witness is one that will not lie, but a false witness launches forth mere lies. (Proverbs 14:5)
- A false witness will not go free from punishment.
- A false witness will not be free from punishment, and he that launches forth lies will not escape. (Proverbs 19:5)
- The false witness will not be free from punishment, and he that launches forth lies will perish. (Proverbs 19:9)
- The getting of treasures by means of a false tongue, or through lying, is an exhalation driven away, and leads one to death.
- The getting of treasures by a false tongue is an exhalation driven away, in the case of those seeking death. (Proverbs 21:6)
- A false witness is like a war club used against a righteous man.
- As a war club and a sword and a sharpened arrow is a man testifying against his fellowman as a false witness. (Proverbs 25:18)
- The tongue of the one speaking falsely, hates the one his lies crush.
- A tongue that is false hates the one crushed by it, and a flattering mouth causes an overthrow. (Proverbs 26:28)
- Where a ruler likes to hear false speech, all his attendants will prove to be wicked.
- Where a ruler is paying attention to false speech, all those waiting on him will be wicked. (Proverbs 29:12)
- Charm is sometimes false, and prettiness is sometimes vain, but the woman who fears Yehowah God procures praise for herself.
- Charm may be false, and prettiness may be vain, but the woman that fears Yehowah is the one that procures praise for herself. (Proverbs 31:30)
- Isaiah lamented that within Israel the false prophets took a position like the tail, which the head wags, when it should be like the

head, directing the body, but those false prophets were only giving false instruction.

- The aged and highly respected one is the head, and the prophet giving false instruction is the tail. (Isaiah 9:15)
- The unprincipled man gives counsel so as to wreck the afflicted one with false sayings.
- As for the unprincipled man, his instruments are bad, he himself has given counsel for acts of loose conduct, to wreck the afflicted ones with false sayings, even when someone poor speaks what is right. (Isaiah 32:7)
- Yehowah God felt that since Israel was in a covenant with him as their God, that they would not prove false to him.
- And he went on to say; Surely they are my people, sons that will not prove false. So it was to them that he came to be a Savior. (Isaiah 63:8)
- Jeremiah showed that men who viewed themselves as wise, and following Yehowah God's Law, that the false stylus of the secretaries had worked sheer falsehood within them.
- How can you men say; We are wise, and the Law of Yehowah is with us? Surely, now, the false stylus of the secretaries has worked in sheer falsehood. (Jeremiah 8:8)
- Jeremiah showed that the false prophets of his day were speaking out the desires of their own hearts, not Yehowah God's word, and he was against them.
- And Yehowah went on to say to me; Falsehood is what the prophets are prophesying in my name. I have not sent them, nor have I commanded them or spoken to them. A false vision and divination and a valueless thing and the trickiness of their heart they are speaking prophetically to you people. (Jeremiah 14:14)
- Here I am against the prophets of false dreams, is the utterance of Yehowah, who relate them and cause my people to wander about because of their falsehoods and because of their boasting. But I myself did not send them or command them. So they will by no means benefit this people, is the utterance of Yehowah.

(**Jeremiah 23:32**)

- When accused of falling away to the enemy, Jeremiah showed that their accusation of him was false.
- But Jeremiah said; It is false! I am not falling away to the Chaldeans. But he did not listen to him. So Irijah kept hold of Jeremiah and brought him in to the princes. (Jeremiah 37:14)
- Their leaders speak words, making false oaths in concluding a covenant, thus perverting justice. Their judgments are perverted like a poisonous plant growing in a furrow of the open field, where foodstuffs would be expected to be growing.
- They speak words, making false oaths, concluding a covenant, and judgment has sprouted like a poisonous plant in the furrows of the open field. (Hosea 10:4)
- Zechariah warned his people not to come to love any false oath, for Yehowah God hates such things.
- And calamity to one another do not you scheme up in your hearts, and do not love any false oath, for these are all things that I have hated, is the utterance of Yehowah. (Zechariah 8:17)
- Jesus warned his disciples to be on the watch for false prophets, who appear to be sheeplike ones, like his disciples, but inside, they are truly ravenous wolves.
- Be on the watch for the false prophets that come to you in sheep's covering, but inside they are ravenous wolves. (Matthew 7:15)
- And many false prophets will arise and mislead many. (Matthew 24:11)
- For false Christ's and false prophets will arise and will give great signs and wonders so as to mislead, if possible, even the chosen ones. (Matthew 24:24)
- For false Christ's and false prophets will arise and will give signs and wonders to lead astray, if possible, the chosen ones. (Mark 13:22)

- Jesus showed that words coming forth from out of the heart like false testimonies, are what defile a man.
- For example, out of the heart come wicked reasonings, murders, adulteries, fornications, thieveries, false testimonies, blasphemies. (Matthew 15:19)
- Jesus reiterated from the Law Covenant that a man must not bear false witness.
- He said to him; Which ones? Jesus said; Why, You must not murder. You must not commit adultery. You must not steal. You must not bear false witness. (Matthew 19:18)
- You know the commandments, do not murder, do not commit adultery, do not steal, do not bear false witness, do not defraud, honor your father and mother. (Mark 10:19)
- You know the commandments, do not commit adultery, do not murder, do not steal, do not bear false witness, honor your father and mother. (Luke 18:20)
- The chief priests and the Sanhedrin were seeking false witness against Jesus to condemn him to death, but could not find any.
- Meantime the chief priests and the entire Sanhedrin were looking for false witness against Jesus in order to put him to death. (Matthew 26:59)
- But they found none, although many false witnesses came forward. Later on two came forward (Matthew 26:60)
- Many, indeed, were giving false witness against him, but their testimonies were not in agreement. (Mark 14:56)
- Also, certain ones were rising and bearing false witness against him, saying; (Mark 14:57)
- Jesus warned his disciples to be wary when all men spoke well of them, for this is how their forefathers treated the false prophets of their day.
- Woe, whenever all men speak well of you, for things like these are what their forefathers did to the false prophets. (Luke 6:26)

- Zacchaeus advised Jesus, that whatever he had previously obtained through false accusation, he was restoring to its rightful owner fourfold.
- But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord; Look! The half of my belongings, Lord, I am giving to the poor, and whatever I extorted from anyone by false accusation I am restoring fourfold. (Luke 19:8)
- Peter told Ananias that Satan the Devil had emboldened him to play false to the Holy Spirit within him, by lying about a field he had sold.
- But Peter said; Ananias, why has Satan emboldened you to play false to the Holy Spirit and to hold back secretly some of the price of the field? (Acts of Apostles 5:3)
- As long as it remained with you did it not remain yours, and after it was sold did it not continue in your control? Why was it that you purposed such a deed as this in your heart? You have played false, not to men, but to God. (Acts of Apostles 5:4)
- Jews brought false witness against Stephen, leading to a fine witness by him, and his eventual death.
- And they brought forward false witnesses, who said; This man does not stop speaking things against this holy place and against the Law. (Acts of Apostles 6:13)
- Paul in his ministry met a false prophet, in Paphos named Bar-Jesus.
- When they had gone through the whole island as far as Paphos, they met up with a certain man, a sorcerer, a false prophet, a Jew whose name was Bar-Jesus. (Acts of Apostles 13:6)
- Paul warned against men who were false to agreements.
- Without understanding, false to agreements, having no natural affection, merciless. (Romans 1:31)
- Paul showed that the false step of the Jews, led to salvation for Gentiles, so as to incite the Jews to jealousy.

- Therefore I ask; Did they stumble so that they fell completely?

 Never may that happen! But by their false step there is salvation to people of the nations, to incite them to jealousy. (Romans 11:11)
- Now if their false step means riches to the world, and their decrease means riches to people of the nations, how much more will the full number of them mean it! (Romans 11:12)
- Paul would really be a false witness against God if he did not preach the resurrection.
- Moreover, we are also found false witnesses of God, because we have borne witness against God that he raised up the Christ, but whom he did not raise up if the dead are really not to be raised up. (1 Corinthians 15:15)
- Paul warned of prominence-seeking men in Corinth who by their works proved to be false apostles, deceitful workers.
- For such men are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into apostles of Christ. (2 Corinthians 11:13)
- Paul faced many dangers in his ministry, including being among false brothers.
- In journeys often, in dangers from rivers, in dangers from highwaymen, in dangers from my own race, in dangers from the nations, in dangers in the city, in dangers in the wilderness, in dangers at sea, in dangers among false brothers. (2 Corinthians 11:26)
- Paul warned of false brothers brought into the Christian congregation secretly to spy upon their freedom in Christ.
- But because of the false brothers brought in quietly, who sneaked in to spy upon our freedom which we have in union with Christ Jesus, that they might completely enslave us. (Galatians 2:4)
- Christian elders are to try to readjust a brother who mistakenly takes some false step.

- Brothers, even though a man takes some false step before he is aware of it, you who have spiritual qualifications try to readjust such a man in a spirit of mildness, as you each keep an eye on yourself, for fear you also may be tempted. (Galatians 6:1)
- Paul never presented a false front to others, but spoke and acted truthfully.
- In fact, at no time have we turned up either with flattering speech, just as you know, or with a false front for covetousness, God is witness! (1 Thessalonians 2:5)
- Paul counseled Timothy not to pay attention to false stories and genealogies, which end up in no spiritual rewards for those seeking them out.
- Nor to pay attention to false stories and to genealogies, which end up in nothing, but which furnish questions for research rather than a dispensing of anything by God in connection with faith. (1 Timothy 1:4)
- Paul counseled Timothy to avoid men who swear falsely.
- Fornicators, men who lie with males, kidnappers, liars, false swearers, and whatever other thing is in opposition to the healthful teaching (1 Timothy 1:10)
- Paul counseled Timothy to turn down false stories, like the Apocryphal works many today put forth as on a par with the Bible record.
- But turn down the false stories which violate what is holy and which old women tell. On the other hand, be training yourself with godly devotion as your aim. (1 Timothy 4:7)
- Paul showed that during the Last Days many would profess to be Christians, but would prove false to the power of the Holy Spirit within their lives, and we should avoid all such men.
- Having a form of godly devotion but proving false to its power, and from these turn away. (2 Timothy 3:5)
- Paul warned Timothy that men would pay attention to false stories and turn their ears away from the truth.

- And they will turn their ears away from the truth, whereas they will be turned aside to false stories. (2 Timothy 4:4)
- James counseled Christians to become doers of the word and not hearers only, for such ones are deceiving themselves with false reasonings.
- However, become doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves with false reasoning. (James 1:22)
- James showed, that if a man breaks any Law of God, he has become an offender against all Law, for the purpose behind all of God's Law is righteousness.
- For whoever observes all the Law but makes a false step in one point, he has become an offender against them all. (James 2:10)
- Peter showed his fellow spirit anointed Christian brothers that it was not by following artfully contrived false stories that he preached the Good News to them, for he had been an eyewitness to Christ's magnificence.
- No, it was not by following artfully contrived false stories that we acquainted you with the power and presence of our Lord Jesus Christ, but it was by having become eyewitnesses of his magnificence. (2 Peter 1:16)
- Peter also warned that false prophets would come into the Christian congregation, bringing in destructive sects, and splitting the congregation apart.
- However, there also came to be false prophets among the people, as there will also be false teachers among you. These very ones will quietly bring in destructive sects and will disown even the owner that bought them, bringing speedy destruction upon themselves. (2 Peter 2:1)
- John also warned against false prophets, telling Christians to test out every inspired expression, to see if its source was Yehowah God.
- Beloved ones, do not believe every inspired expression, but test the inspired expressions to see whether they originate with God, because many false prophets have gone forth into the world. (1

John 4:1)

- Jude warned about wicked men who slipped into the Christian congregation, and who were proving false to their Lord Jesus Christ.
- My reason is that certain men have slipped in who have long ago been appointed by the Scriptures to this judgment, ungodly men, turning the undeserved kindness of our God into an excuse for loose conduct and proving false to our only Owner and Lord, Jesus Christ. (Jude 1:4)
- Jesus commended his disciples who had kept his word, and not proved false to his name.
- I know your deeds, look! I have set before you an opened door, which no one can shut, that you have a little power, and you kept my word and did not prove false to my name. (Revelation 3:8)
- John in the Revelation saw three unclean inspired expressions coming forth from the dragon, the wild beast and the false prophet. These three are later caught and thrown into the lake of fire, eternal destruction.
- And I saw three unclean inspired expressions that looked like frogs come out of the mouth of the dragon and out of the mouth of the wild beast and out of the mouth of the false prophet. (Revelation 16:13)
- And the wild beast was caught, and along with it the false prophet that performed in front of it the signs with which he misled those who received the mark of the wild beast and those who render worship to its image. While still alive, they both were hurled into the fiery lake that burns with sulphur. (Revelation 19:20)
- And the Devil who was misleading them was hurled into the lake of fire and sulphur, where both the wild beast and the false prophet already were, and they will be tormented day and night forever and ever. (Revelation 20:10)
