- Noah was a righteous man who proved himself **faultless** among his generation.
- This is the history of Noah. Noah was a righteous man. He proved himself **faultless** among his contemporaries. Noah walked with the true God. (**Genesis 6:9**)
- Yehowah God told Abraham to walk in a **faultless** way before him always.
- When Abram got to be ninety-nine years old, then Yehowah appeared to Abram and said to him; I am God Almighty. Walk before me and prove yourself **faultless**. (**Genesis 17:1**)
- Moses told Israelites to walk before their God in a **faultless** way, a way of holiness.
- You should prove yourself **faultless** with Yehowah your God. (**Deuteronomy 18:13**)
- In David's song he showed that he would prove **faultless** before his God and keep himself from error.
- And I shall prove myself **faultless** toward him, and I will keep myself from error on my part. (**2 Samuel 22:24**)
- And I will prove myself **faultless** with him, and I shall keep myself from error on my part. (**Psalms 18:23**)
- With the one walking **faultlessly** before his God, God will himself deal **faultlessly**.
- With someone loyal you will act in loyalty. With the **faultless**, mighty one you will deal faultlessly. (**2 Samuel 22:26**)
- With someone loyal you will act in loyalty. With the **faultless**, able-bodied man you will deal faultlessly. (**Psalms 18:25**)

- Yehowah God is aware of those who walk before him **faultlessly**, and their inheritance will continue to time indefinite.
- Yehowah is aware of the days of the **faultless** ones, and their very inheritance will continue even to time indefinite. (**Psalms 37:18**)
- The Psalmist showed that he would use discretion to walk in a **faultless** way before his God.
- I will act with discretion in a **faultless** way. When will you come to me? I shall walk about in the integrity of my heart inside my house. (**Psalms 101:2**)
- Yehowah shows that he watches mankind for faithful ones, and the one walking in a **faultless** way will be invited close to him to minister to him.
- My eyes are upon the faithful ones of the earth, that they may dwell with me. The one walking in a **faultless** way, he it is who will minister to me. (**Psalms 101:6**)
- Happy are all the ones walking **faultlessly** in their way, keeping the Law of Yehowah.
- Happy are the ones **faultless** in their way, the ones walking in the Law of Yehowah. (**Psalms 119:1**)
- The Psalmist requested of Yehowah God that his heart might prove **faultless** in keeping his regulations.
- Let my heart prove **faultless** in your regulations, in order, that I may not be ashamed. (**Psalms 119:80**)
- The **faultless** ones themselves will come into the possession of good.
- He that is causing the upright ones to go astray into the bad way will himself fall into his own pit, but the **faultless** ones themselves will come into possession of good. (**Proverbs 28:10**)
- The one walking **faultlessly** before his God will be saved by God.
- He that is walking **faultless** will be saved, but he that is made

crooked in his ways will fall at once. (**Proverbs 28:18**)

- Satan the Devil was **faultless** in all his ways until unrighteousness was found within him.
- You were **faultless** in your ways from the day of your being created until unrighteousness was found in you. (**Ezekiel 28:15**)
- Paul reasons that if the Law Covenant, the first covenant had been **faultless**, God would not have needed to bring in a second and better one, the New Covenant.
- For if that first covenant had been faultless, no place would have been sought for a second. (**Hebrews 8:7**)
