[English, positively, constructively, happily, well, auspiciously, sympathetically, kindly, satisfactorily, approvingly, fortunately, promisingly, Opposite of, **negatively**]

- The ones sown on fine soil are those who hear the word about the Christ and **favorably** receive it into their hearts and bear fruit in different measure.
- Finally, the ones that were sown on the fine soil are those who listen to the word and **favorably** receive it and bear fruit thirtyfold and sixty and a hundred. (**Mark 4:20**)
- Zechariah supplicated Yehowah in behalf of his wife to end her barrenness and reproach, and he was **favorably** heard by Yehowah by him giving her a son, whom they later called John the Baptist.
- However, the angel said to him; Have no fear, Zechariah, because your supplication has been **favorably** heard, and your wife Elizabeth will become mother to a son to you, and you are to call his name John. (**Luke 1:13**)
- Yehowah's angel told Cornelius that his prayer had been **favorably** heard by God.
- And said; Cornelius, your prayer has been **favorably** heard and your gifts of mercy have been remembered before God. (**Acts of Apostles 10:31**)
- Paul counseled Timothy to instruct with mildness any who are not **favorably** disposed to the way of the truth.
- Instructing with mildness those not **favorably** disposed, as perhaps God may give them repentance leading to an accurate knowledge of truth. (**2 Timothy 2:25**)
- Christ's supplications and petitions to Yehowah were favorably heard due to his godly fear.
- In the days of his flesh Christ offered up supplications and also petitions to the One who was able to save him out of death, with strong outcries and tears, and he was **favorably** heard for his

godly fear. (**Hebrews 5:7**)
