~FEARED (175)

[English, terror, dread, horror, fright, panic, alarm, trepidation, apprehension]

- The midwives feared the true God and did not kill the Israelite children at birth. They were blessed with children of their own by Yehowah God for doing this.
- However, the midwives feared the true God, and they did not do as the king of Egypt had spoken to them, but they would preserve the male children alive. (Exodus 1:17)
- And it came about that because the midwives had feared the true God he later presented them with families. (Exodus 1:21)
- Anyone among Pharaoh's servants who feared the word of Yehowah God brought their livestock and servants into the house for protection from the hail.
- Anyone who feared Yehowah's word among Pharaoh's servants caused his own servants and his livestock to flee into the houses. (Exodus 9:20)
- The Israelites sang, that Yehowah God alone was the God to be feared by men, for he is mighty in holiness.
- Who among the gods is like you, O Yehowah Who is like you, proving yourself mighty in holiness. The One to be feared with songs of praise, the One doing marvels. (Exodus 15:11)
- When Jericho fell suddenly under Joshua's leadership, then Israel began to fear him, just as they had feared Moses all his days.
- On that day Yehowah made Joshua great in the eyes of all Israel, and they began to fear him just as they had feared Moses all the days of his life. (Joshua 4:14)
- Gideon went at night with ten men because he feared the men of the city.
- Accordingly Gideon took ten men of his servants and went doing just as Yehowah had spoken to him, but it came about that, as he

feared the household of his father and the men of the city too much to do it by day, he went doing it by night. (Judges 6:27)

- Saul sinned against Yehowah God because he feared the will of the people more than he feared Yehowah God.
- Then Saul said to Samuel; I have sinned, for I have overstepped the order of Yehowah and your words, because I feared the people and so obeyed their voice. (1 Samuel 15:24)
- A certain woman told Elijah that she had feared Yehowah all her life, and that a creditor had come and taken her children for slaves.
- Now there was a certain woman of the wives of the sons of the prophets that cried out to Elisha, saying; Your servant, my husband, is dead, and you yourself well know that your own servant had continually feared Yehowah, and the creditor himself has come to take both my children for his slaves. (2 Kings 4:1)
- Yehowah God is great and very much to be feared, more than all other gods.
- For Yehowah is great and very much to be praised, and he is to be feared more than all other gods. (1 Chronicles 16:25)
- Hanani and Hananiah were put in charge of Jerusalem, by Nehemiah, because they were trustworthy, and feared the true God more than many others.
- And I went on to put in command of Jerusalem, Hanani my brother, and Hananiah the prince of the Castle, for he was such a trustworthy man and feared the true God more than many others. (Nehemiah 7:2)
- Satan the Devil asked if Job feared the true God simply for nothing.
- At that Satan answered Yehowah and said; Is it for nothing that Job has feared God? (Job 1:9)
- Yehowah God will give answer to those who refused to change their ways, and who have not feared the true God.
- God will hear and answer them, even He that is sitting enthroned

as in the past. Selah. Those with whom there are no changings and who have not feared God. (Psalms 55:19)

- When Yehowah God conducts his legal case against the earth, the earth will be in fear and remain silent.
- From heaven you caused the legal contest to be heard, the earth itself feared and kept quiet (Psalms 76:8)
- The Psalmist showed that there was true forgiveness with Yehowah God, so that he should be feared.
- For there is the true forgiveness with you, in order, that you may be feared. (Psalms 130:4)
- Yehowah showed that since they had feared a sword, then a sword he would bring upon them.
- A sword you have **feared**, and a sword I shall bring upon you, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 11:8**)
- Then they will come and say that they have no king or leader, because they had not feared Yehowah God, nor have they looked to the ones he provided leadership through. What could a mere man as king do for them, they will ask.
- For now they will say; We have no king, for we have not feared Yehowah. And as regards the king, what will he do for us? (Hosea 10:3)
- Through Malachi Yehowah God promised to become a speedy witness against those practicing bad things, while they continued not fearing him.
- And I will come near to you people for the judgment, and I will become a speedy witness against the sorcerers, and against the adulterers, and against those swearing falsely, and against those acting fraudulently with the wages of a wage worker, with the widow and with the fatherless boy, and those turning away the alien resident, while they have not feared me, Yehowah of armies has said. (Malachi 3:5)
- Herod wanted to kill John the Baptist, but he feared the will of the people, for they saw John the Baptist as a prophet of Yehowah.

- However, although he wanted to kill him, he feared the crowd, because they took him for a prophet. (Matthew 14:5)
- The Jews wanted to seize Jesus, but they also feared the crowds, for these took him for a prophet.
- But, although they were seeking to seize him, they feared the crowds, because these held him to be a prophet. (Matthew 21:46)
- At that they began seeking how to seize him, but they feared the crowd, for they took note that he spoke the illustration with them in mind. So they left him and went away. (Mark 12:12)
- The scribes and the chief priests now sought to get their hands on him in that very hour, but they feared the people, for they perceived that he spoke this illustration with them in mind. (Luke 20:19)
