~FEARFUL (165)

[English, afraid, scared, apprehensive, frightened, terrified, worried, anxious, timid, nervous, Opposite of, fearless]

- Jacob grew fearful after seeing a vision of the night.
- And he grew fearful and added; How fear-inspiring this place is! This is nothing else but the house of God and this is the gate of the heavens. (Genesis 28:17)
- When Israelite men were called to war, anyone fearful was to be excused from the fighting.
- And the officers must speak further to the people and say; Who is the man that is fearful and fainthearted? Let him go and return to his house, that he may not cause the hearts of his brothers to melt as his own heart. (Deuteronomy 20:8)
- The people of Israel became fearful after hearing the decisions of Solomon in judgment.
- And all Israel got to hear of the judicial decision that the king had handed down, and they became fearful because of the king, for they saw that the wisdom of God was within him to execute judicial decision. (1 Kings 3:28)
- Yehowah God will instruct and discipline those who are fearful of him.
- Who, now, is the man fearful of Yehowah? He will instruct him in the way that he will choose. (Psalms 25:12)
- The intimacy with Yehowah God belongs to those fearful of him.
- The intimacy with Yehowah belongs to those **fearful** of him, also his covenant, to cause them to know it. (Psalms 25:14)
- Joel called for the earth and the beasts of the open field not to be fearful, for Yehowah God would do a great thing in what he would do.
- Do not be **fearful**, O ground. Be joyful and rejoice, for Yehowah will actually do a great thing in what He does. (**Joel 2:21**)

- Do not be **fearful**, you beasts of the open field, for the pasture grounds of the wilderness will certainly grow green. For the tree will actually give its fruitage. The fig tree and the vine must give their vital energy. (Joel 2:22)
- Jesus warned his disciples not to be **fearful** of those who can only kill the body, but to **fear** him who can destroy soul and body in Gehenna.
- And do not become fearful of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul, but rather be in fear of him that can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna. (Matthew 10:28)
- The angel told the women looking for Jesus, that they should not be **fearful**, for he knew that they were looking for Jesus.
- But the angel in answer said to the women; Do not you be fearful, for I know you are looking for Jesus who was impaled. (Matthew 28:5)
- The townspeople came out to see what had happened, and viewed the once demon-possessed man sitting peacefully listening to Jesus talk, and they grew fearful.
- So they came to Jesus, and they beheld the demon-possessed man sitting clothed and in his sound mind, this man that had had the legion, and they grew fearful. (Mark 5:15)
- Then people turned out to see what had happened, and they came to Jesus and found the man from whom the demons came out, clothed and in his sound mind, sitting at the feet of Jesus, and they became fearful. (Luke 8:35)
- Peter upon seeing the transfiguration of Jesus, did not know what response he should make, for he grew **fearful** at the sight of the vision.
- In fact, he did not know what response he should make, for they became quite **fearful**. (Mark 9:6)
- But as he was saying these things a cloud formed and began to overshadow them. As they entered into the cloud, they became fearful. (Luke 9:34)

- Then Yehowah God's angel appeared to the shepherds making them fearful.
- And suddenly Yehowah's angel stood by them, and Yehowah's glory gleamed around them, and they became very fearful. (Luke 2:9)
- Jesus' signs of the Last Days included seeing many fearful sights, and from heaven great signs.
- And there will be great earthquakes, and in one place after another pestilences and food shortages, and there will be fearful sights and from heaven great signs. (Luke 21:11)
- When Jesus' disciples saw him walking miles out to sea across the water, they became fearful of the sight.
- However, when they had rowed about three or four miles, they beheld Jesus walking upon the sea and getting near the boat, and they became fearful. (John 6:19)
- When Pilate heard his wife's confession, he became more fearful of harming Jesus.
- When, therefore, Pilate heard this saying, he became more fearful. (John 19:8)
- The constables who had imprisoned Paul and Silas grew more fearful upon seeing that they were Roman citizens.
- So the constables reported these sayings to the civil magistrates. These grew fearful when they heard that the men were Romans. (Acts of Apostles 16:38)
- Paul reasoned that only a fearful expectation of judgment awaits those who accept the undeserved-kindness of Yehowah God and then turn away to a practice of sin again.
- But there is a certain fearful expectation of judgment and there is a fiery jealousy that is going to consume those in opposition.
 (Hebrews 10:27)

- Paul showed that it is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God for adverse punishment.
- It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God. (Hebrews 10:31)
- When Moses saw the display of Yehowah God's almighty power at Sinai, even he was fearful and trembling.
- Also, the display was so fearsome that Moses said; I am fearful and trembling. (Hebrews 12:21)
- The Lord laid his hand upon John and told him not to be fearful at the vision he was seeing.
- And when I saw him, I fell as dead at his feet. And he laid his right hand upon me and said; Do not be fearful. I am the First and the Last. (Revelation 1:17)
