~FEEBLE (72)

[English, Weak, frail, delicate, shabby, thin, meager, Opposite of, strong]

- Jacob cleverly waited for the flocks to show feebleness before allowing them to mate when they were of Laban's flock.
- But when the flocks showed feebleness he would not locate them there. So the feeble ones always came to be Laban's, but the robust ones Jacob's. (Genesis 30:42)
- When the son of Saul heard that Abner had died then his hands became feeble and all of Israel were disturbed about the matter.
- When the son of Saul heard that Abner had died in Hebron, then his hands became feeble and all the Israelites themselves were disturbed. (2 Samuel 4:1)
- Ahithophel counseled Absalom, David's son, to come upon him with 12,000 men when his father was feeble and strike down the king.
- And I shall come upon him when he is weary and feeble in both hands, and I shall certainly drive him into trembling, and all the people that are with him will have to flee, and I shall certainly strike down the king by himself. (2 Samuel 17:2)
- Nehemiah's opposers felt that the Jews could not mount a valid defense of Jerusalem, but could make only a feeble attempt to defend her walls.
- And he began to say before his brothers and the military force of Samaria, yes, he began to say; What are the feeble Jews doing? Will they depend upon themselves? Will they sacrifice? Will they finish up in a day? Will they bring the stones to life out of the heaps of dusty rubbish when they are burned? (Nehemiah 4:2)
- The Psalmist declared that no matter how far from Yehowah he was that he would cry to Yehowah when his own heart became feeble.
- From the extremity of the earth I shall cry, even to you, when my heart grows feeble. Onto a rock that is higher than I am may you lead me. (Psalms 61:2)

- The afflicted ones pour out their hearts to Yehowah in prayer whenever their hearts become feeble.
- Every morning I shall silence all the wicked ones of the earth, to cut off from the city of Yehowah all the practicers of what is hurtful. A prayer of the afflicted in case he grows feeble and pours out his concern before Yehowah himself. (Psalms 101:8)
- Isaiah told his countrymen that they refused to accept Yehowah's discipline and so their hearts had become feeble toward doing his will and living righteously.
- Where else will you be struck still more, in that you add more revolt? The whole head is in a sick condition, and the whole heart is feeble. (Isaiah 1:5)
- If Yehowah held man accountable forever then the very spirit of mankind would grow feeble, for no man can be perfect before him.
- For it will not be to time indefinite that I shall contend, nor perpetually that I shall be indignant, for because of me the spirit itself would grow feeble, even the breathing creatures that I myself have made. (Isaiah 57:16)
