~FIG-MULBERRY TREE (28)

[Greek, sy-ko-mo-re'a]

- When short-statured Zacchaeus wanted to get a better look at Christ Jesus he climbed a fig-mulberry tree.
- So he ran ahead to an advance position and climbed a figmulberry tree in order to see him, because he was about to go through that way. (Luke 19:4)
- The Greek name indicates a fig tree Greek, *sy-ke'* with leaves like those of the mulberry Greek, *mo-re'a*. The two trees are of the same family, and the fig-mulberry mentioned in;
- So he ran ahead to an advance position and climbed a figmulberry tree in order to see him, because he was about to go through that way. (Luke 19:4)
- Appears to be the same as the sycamore, *Ficus sycomorus*, of the Hebrew Scriptures.
- And the king came to make the silver in Jerusalem like the stones, and cedarwood he made like the sycamore trees that are in the Shephelah for great quantity. (1 Kings 10:27)
