~FIGHTING (345)

[English, hostility, combating, warfare, skirmishing, war struggle]

- Sihon did not allow Israel to cross his territory, and so came out fighting against Israel in the wilderness.
- And Sihon did not allow Israel to pass through his territory, but Sihon gathered all his people and went out to meet Israel in the wilderness, and came to Jahaz and began fighting with Israel. (Numbers 21:23)
- And Sihon did not feel sure about Israel's crossing through his territory, and Sihon went gathering all his people together and camping in Jahaz and fighting against Israel. (Judges 11:20)
- Moses told Israel that Yehowah their God was fighting for them, and so they must not be afraid.
- You men must not be afraid of them, for Yehowah your God is the One fighting for you. (Deuteronomy 3:22)
- Israel was told where fighting against a city in a siege, they were nor to cut down fruit bearing trees around the city to build fortifications, as many worldly armies did.
- In case you lay siege to a city many days by fighting against it so as to capture it, you must not ruin its trees by wielding an ax against them, for you should eat from them, and you must not cut them down, for is the tree of the field a man to be besieged by you? (Deuteronomy 20:19)
- Yehowah God went listening to the voice of Joshua and fighting for Israel, causing the sun to stand still in the sky to lengthen the daylight.
- And no day has proved to be like that one, either before it or after it, in that Yehowah listened to the voice of a man, for Yehowah himself was fighting for Israel. (Joshua 10:14)
- It was Yehowah God who was fighting for Israel to give them the Promised Land.

- And Joshua captured all these kings and their land at one time, because it was Yehowah the God of Israel who was fighting for Israel. (Joshua 10:42)
- And as for you, you have seen all that Yehowah your God did to all these nations on your account, because Yehowah your God was the one who was fighting for you. (Joshua 23:3)
- Just one man of you will chase a thousand, because Yehowah your God is the one who is fighting for you, just as he has promised you. (Joshua 23:10)
- Eventually I brought you to the land of the Amorites who were dwelling on the other side of the Jordan, and they went fighting against you. At that I gave them into your hand that you might take possession of their land, and I annihilated them from before you. (Joshua 24:8)
- Balak went to fighting against Israel, and then called down evil against them through Balaam.
- Then Balak the son of Zippor, the king of Moab, got up and went fighting against Israel. So he sent and summoned Balaam the son of Beor to call down evil upon you. (Joshua 24:9)
- Joshua showed, that the then inhabitants of Canaan came out fighting against Israel, when they crossed over the Jordan River into Canaan.
- Then you went crossing the Jordan and came to Jericho. And the landowners of Jericho, the Amorites and the Perizzites and the Canaanites and the Hittites and the Girgashites, the Hivites and the Jebusites began fighting against you, but I gave them into your hand. (Joshua 24:11)
- Abimelech made his way to the tower and began fighting against it.
- And Abimelech made his way to the tower and began fighting against it, and he went on up close to the entrance of the tower to burn it with fire. (Judges 9:52)
- The men of Gilead asked who would take the lead in fighting against the men of Ammon.

- And the people and the princes of Gilead began to say to one another; Who is the man that will take the lead in fighting against the sons of Ammon? Let him become the head of all the inhabitants of Gilead. (Judges 10:18)
- The sons of Israel showed, that they had not been the ones to initiate the fighting between them and Ammon.
- As for me, I have not sinned against you, but you are dealing wrong with me by fighting against me. Let Yehowah the Judge, judge today between the sons of Israel and the sons of Ammon. (Judges 11:27)
- Ten thousand men of all Israel went to fighting against the men of Benjamin, and the fighting was heavy.
- Thus ten thousand chosen men out of all Israel came in front of Gibeah, and the fighting was heavy, and the Benjamites did not know that calamity was impending over them. (Judges 20:34)
- When Israel forgot their God he sold them into captivity to Sisera, and the Philistines, and to the king of Moab, and they kept fighting against them.
- And they went forgetting Yehowah their God, so that he sold them into the hand of Sisera the chief of the army of Hazor and into the hand of the Philistines and into the hand of the king of Moab, and they kept fighting against them. (1 Samuel 12:9)
- Saul and his men were in the low plain of Elah fighting against the Philistines.
- Meantime, Saul and they and all the other men of Israel were in the low plain of Elah, fighting against the Philistines. (1 Samuel 17:19)
- When war broke out David went fighting against the Philistines, striking them down with a great slaughter.
- In time war broke out again and David went sallying forth and fighting against the Philistines and striking them down with a great slaughter, and they took to flight from before him. (1 Samuel 19:8)

- Abigail realized that David her Lord was fighting the wars of Yehowah God.
- Pardon, please, the transgression of your slave girl, because Yehowah will without fail make for my lord a lasting house, because the wars of Yehowah are what my lord is fighting, and as for badness, it will not be found in you throughout your days. (1 Samuel 25:28)
- When Saul was fighting against the Philistines, and was in sore straits, he went to a witch of Endor, a spirit medium, to try to raise Samuel from the dead to counsel him.
- And Samuel began to say to Saul; Why have you disturbed me by having me brought up? To this Saul said; I am in very sore straits, as the Philistines are fighting against me, and God himself has departed from me and has answered me no more, either by means of the prophets or by dreams, so that I am calling you to let me know what I shall do. (1 Samuel 28:15)
- While the Philistines were fighting against Israel, Israel took them to flight near Mount Gilboa.
- Now the Philistines were fighting against Israel, and the men of Israel took to flight from before the Philistines, and they kept falling down slain in Mount Gilboa. (1 Samuel 31:1)
- When the fighting became heavy Saul was severely wounded by the shooters of the bow of his enemy.
- And the fighting became heavy against Saul, and the shooters, the bowmen, finally found him, and he got severely wounded by the shooters. (1 Samuel 31:3)
- And the fighting became heavy against Saul, and those shooting with the bow finally found him, and he got wounded by the shooters. (1 Chronicles 10:3)
- When the **fighting** became extremely heavy, Abner and the men of Israel were defeated.
- And the fighting came to be extremely hard on that day, and Abner and the men of Israel were finally defeated before the

servants of David. (2 Samuel 2:17)

- When Joab blew a horn, then the people of Israel did not renew the fighting anymore.
- Joab now blew the horn, and all the people came to a halt and did not continue chasing after Israel anymore, and they did not renew the fighting anymore. (2 Samuel 2:28)
- Joab led a charge when fighting against the city, and Uriah the Hittite died, as David and Joab had planned.
- When the men of the city came on out and went fighting against Joab, then some of the people, the servants of David, fell and Uriah the Hittite also died. (2 Samuel 11:17)
- Rabshekeh returned and found the king of Assyria fighting at Libnah.
- After that Rabshakeh returned and found the king of Assyria fighting against Libnah, for he had heard that he had pulled away from Lachish. (2 Kings 19:8)
- After that Rabshakeh returned and found the king of Assyria fighting against Libnah, for he had heard that he had pulled away from Lachish. (Isaiah 37:8)
- Israel called upon Yehowah God in the fighting against the Hagrites.
- For there were many that had fallen slain, because it was on the part of the true God that the fighting was. And they continued to dwell in their place down to the time of the exile. (1 Chronicles 5:22)
- The Psalmist showed that with words of hatred his enemies surrounded him, fighting against him without cause.
- And with words of hatred they have surrounded me, and they keep fighting against me without cause. (Psalms 109:3)
- The Psalmist blessed his God Yehowah who instructed his hands for fighting.

- Blessed be Yehowah my Rock, who is teaching my hands for fighting, my fingers for warfare. (Psalms 144:1)
- Wisdom is better that implements of weapons of fighting.
- Wisdom is better than implements for fighting, and merely one sinner can destroy much good. (Ecclesiastes 9:18)
- Yehowah God promised through Jeremiah to turn around the weapons used to defend Jerusalem against the Babylonians fighting against her.
- This is what Yehowah the God of Israel has said; Here I am turning in reverse the weapons of war that are in the hand of you people, with which you are fighting the king of Babylon, and the Chaldeans who are laying siege against you outside the wall, and I will gather them into the middle of this city. (Jeremiah 21:4)
- Jeremiah prophesied that the Babylonians, by fighting against it, would destroy Jerusalem.
- Look! With siege ramparts men have come to the city to capture it, and the very city will certainly be given into the hand of the Chaldeans who are fighting against it, because of the sword and the famine and the pestilence, and what you have said has happened, and here you are seeing it. (Jeremiah 32:24)
- And the Chaldeans who are fighting against this city must come in and set this city aflame with fire and must burn it down and the houses upon the roofs of which they have made sacrificial smoke to Baal and have poured out drink offerings to other gods for the purpose of offending me. (Jeremiah 32:29)
- The word that occurred to Jeremiah from Yehowah, when Nebuchadrezzar the king of Babylon and all his military force and all the kingdoms of the earth, the dominion under his hand, and all the peoples were fighting against Jerusalem and against all her cities, saying; (Jeremiah 34:1)
- When the military forces of the king of Babylon were fighting against Jerusalem and against all the cities of Judah that were left remaining, against Lachish and against Azekah, for they, the fortified cities, were the ones that remained over among the cities of Judah. (Jeremiah 34:7)

- Jeremiah showed that even if only wounded men remained of the enemy forces fighting against Jerusalem, they would certainly break through the wall, and burn down Jerusalem.
- For if you men had struck down all the military force of the Chaldeans who are fighting you and there remained over among them men pierced through, they would each one in his tent rise up and actually burn this city with fire. (Jeremiah 37:10)
- Moses tried to stop men of Israel from fighting among themselves, telling them that they were brothers.
- And the next day he appeared to them as they were fighting, and he tried to bring them together again in peace, saying; Men, you are brothers. Why do you treat each other unjustly? (Acts of Apostles 7:26)
- Herod was in a fighting mood against the men of Tyre and Sidon.
- Now he was in a fighting mood against the people of Tyre and of Sidon. So with one accord they came to him and, after persuading Blastus, who was in charge of the bedchamber of the king, they began suing for peace, because their country was supplied with food from that of the king. (Acts of Apostles 12:20)
- James showed that spirit anointed Christians who went on fighting and waging war with one another, were in the wrong and would not gain God's favor.
- You desire, and yet you do not have. You go on murdering and coveting, and yet you are not able to obtain. You go on fighting and waging war. You do not have because of your not asking. (James 4:2)
