

~FINDS (150)

[English, discovers, locates, comes across, hits upon, unearths, uncovers, stumbles upon]

- If an Israelite man **finds** a virgin girl not engaged to another and lies down with her.
- In case a man **finds** a girl, a virgin who has not been engaged, and he actually seizes her and lies down with her, and they have been found out. (**Deuteronomy 22:28**)
- If a man **finds** no delight in his brother's widow he could refuse to raise up children for her, though he would be shamed in doing so.
- Now if the man **finds** no delight in taking his brother's widow, his brother's widow must then go up to the gate to the older men and say; My husband's brother has refused to preserve his brother's name in Israel. He has not consented to perform brother-in-law marriage with me. (**Deuteronomy 25:7**)
- Saul asked, that if a man **finds** his enemy, will he send him away on a good road?
- Now in the case where a man **finds** his enemy, will he send him away on a good road? So Yehowah himself will reward you with good, due to the fact that this day you have done it to me. (**1 Samuel 24:19**)
- Job asked Yehowah God to give him rest like a hired laborer, until he **finds** pleasure.
- Turn your gaze from upon him that he may have rest, until he **finds** pleasure as a hired laborer does in his day. (**Job 14:6**)
- Job felt that Yehowah God **found** occasions for opposition toward him.
- Look! Occasions for opposition to me he **finds**, he takes me for an enemy of his. (**Job 33:10**)
- The Psalmist showed, that the soul of Yehowah God's enemies **finds** itself melting because of the calamity.

- They go up to the heavens, they go down to the bottoms. Because of the calamity their very soul **finds** itself melting. (**Psalms 107:26**)
- Whom Yehowah God loves he reproves, as a father does with a son in whom he **finds** pleasure.
- Because the one whom Yehowah loves he reproves, even as a father does a son in whom he **finds** pleasure. (**Proverbs 3:12**)
- The stupid ones **finds** no delight in discernment.
- Anyone stupid **finds** no delight in discernment, except that his heart should uncover itself. (**Proverbs 18:2**)
- Men should do all that their hands **find** to do while alive, because in death there is nothing, and all men are going to die.
- All that your hand **finds** to do, do with your very power, for there is no work nor devising nor knowledge nor wisdom in Sheol, the place to which you are going. (**Ecclesiastes 9:10**)
- Jesus showed that everyone seeking **finds**, and so encouraged prayer to Yehowah God.
- For everyone asking receives, and everyone seeking **finds**, and to everyone knocking it will be opened. (**Matthew 7:8**)
- Jesus showed that he who **finds** his soul will lose it, and he that loses his soul for Jesus' sake will **find** it.
- He that **finds** his soul will lose it, and he that loses his soul for my sake will find it. (**Matthew 10:39**)
- Jesus showed that the man would be happy who **finds** no cause for stumbling in Jesus Christ.
- And happy is he that **finds** no cause for stumbling in me. (**Matthew 11:6**)
- An unclean spirit upon leaving its victim, searches for another resting place, and **finds** none, and to returns to its former home.

- When an unclean spirit comes out of a man, it passes through parched places in search of a resting-place, and **finds** none. (Matthew 12:43)
- Then it says; I will go back to my house out of which I moved. And on arriving it **finds** it unoccupied, but swept clean and adorned. (Matthew 12:44)
- And on arriving it **finds** it swept clean and adorned. (Luke 11:25)
- Jesus said that the slave watching for his return would be happy if his master upon returning **found** him ready and watching for his return.
- Happy is that slave if his master on arriving **finds** him doing so. (Matthew 24:46)
- Happy are those slaves whom the master on arriving **finds** watching! Truly I say to you, He will gird himself and make them recline at the table and will come alongside and minister to them. (Luke 12:37)
- And if he arrives in the second watch, even if in the third, and **finds** them thus, happy are they! (Luke 12:38)
- Happy is that slave, if his master on arriving **finds** him doing so! (Luke 12:43)
- Jesus assured his disciples that everyone seeking **finds**.
- For everyone asking receives, and everyone seeking **finds**, and to everyone knocking it will be opened. (Luke 11:10)
- In Jesus' parable he showed that a shepherd would go after one sheep that was lost until he **finds** it. Also in a similar illustration he showed that a woman losing a valuable coin in her house would go searching for it until she **finds** it.
- What man of you with a hundred sheep, on losing one of them, will not leave the ninety-nine behind in the wilderness and go for the lost one until he **finds** it? (Luke 15:4)
- Or what woman with ten drachma coins, if she loses one drachma coin, does not light a lamp and sweep her house and

search carefully until she **finds** it? (**Luke 15:8**)
