- And the dove did not **find** any resting-place for the sole of its foot, and so it returned to him into the ark because the waters were yet upon the surface of the whole earth. At that he put his hand out and took it and brought it to himself inside the ark. (**Genesis 8:9**)
- Then Yehowah said; If I shall **find** in Sodom fifty righteous men in the midst of the city I will pardon the whole place on their account. (**Genesis 18:26**)
- Suppose the fifty righteous should be lacking five. Will you for the five bring the whole city to ruin? To this he said; I shall not bring it to ruin if I **find** there forty-five. (**Genesis 18:28**)
- But he continued; May Yehowah, please, not grow hot with anger, but let me go on speaking; Suppose thirty are found there. In turn he said; I shall not do it if I **find** thirty there. (**Genesis 18:30**)
- But they struck with blindness the men who were at the entrance of the house, from the least to the greatest, so that they were wearing themselves out trying to **find** the entrance. (**Genesis 19:11**)
- Now Reuben went walking in the days of the wheat harvest and got to **find** mandrakes in the field. So he brought them to Leah his mother. Then Rachel said to Leah; Give me, please, some of your sons mandrakes. (**Genesis 30:14**)
- Whoever it is with whom you may **find** your gods, let him not live. Before our brothers, examine for yourself what is with me and take them for yourself. But Jacob did not know that Rachel had stolen them. (**Genesis 31:32**)
- So Laban went on into the tent of Jacob and into the tent of Leah and into the tent of the two slave girls, but did not **find** them. Finally he went out of Leah's tent and went on into Rachel's tent. (**Genesis 31:33**)

- Now Rachel had taken the teraphim, and she resorted to putting them in the woman's saddle basket of the camel, and she kept sitting upon them. So Laban went feeling through the whole tent, but did not **find** them. (**Genesis 31:34**)
- Then she said to her father; Do not let anger gleam in the eyes of my lord, because I am not able to get up before you, for the customary thing with women is upon me. So he searched on carefully, but did not **find** the teraphim. (**Genesis 31:35**)
- And I have come to have bulls and asses, sheep, and menservants and maidservants, and I would like to send to notify my lord, that I may **find** favor in your eyes. (**Genesis 32:5**)
- He now said; What do you mean by all this camp of travelers that I have met? To this he said; In order to **find** favor in the eyes of my lord. (**Genesis 33:8**)
- When Esau said; Let me, please, put at your disposal some of the people who are with me. To this he said; Why this? Let me **find** favor in the eyes of my lord. (**Genesis 33:15**)
- Then Shechem said to her father and to her brothers; Let me **find** favor in your eyes, and whatever you will say to me I shall give it. (**Genesis 34:11**)
- And the young man did not delay to perform the condition, because he did **find** delight in Jacob's daughter and he was the most honorable of the whole house of his father. (**Genesis 34:19**)
- However, Yehowah continued with Joseph and kept extending loving-kindness to him and granting him to **find** favor in the eyes of the chief officer of the prison house. (**Genesis 39:21**)
- For how can I go up to my father without the boy along with me, for fear that then I may look upon the calamity that will **find** out my father? (**Genesis 44:34**)
- Consequently they said; You have preserved our lives. Let us **find** favor in the eyes of my lord, and we will become slaves to Pharaoh. (**Genesis 47:25**)
- Further, his sister stationed herself at a distance to **find** out what

would be done with him. (**Exodus 2:4**)

- You yourselves go, get straw for yourselves wherever you may **find** it, because there is to be no reducing of your services one bit. (**Exodus 5:11**)
- Later Moses caused Israel to depart from the Red Sea and they went out to the wilderness of Shur and marched on for three days in the wilderness, but they did not **find** water. (**Exodus 15:22**)
- Then Moses said; Eat it today, because today is a Sabbath to Yehowah. Today you will not **find** it in the field. (**Exodus 16:25**)
- And now, if, please, I have found favor in your eyes, make me know, please, your ways, that I may know you, in order, that I may **find** favor in your eyes. And consider that this nation is your people. (**Exodus 33:13**)
- Or he does **find** something lost and is actually deceptive about it and does swear falsely over any of all the things that the man might do to sin by them. (**Leviticus 6:3**)
- And in case anyone proves to have no repurchaser and his own hand does make gain and he does **find** enough for its repurchase. (**Leviticus 25:26**)
- But if his hand does not **find** enough to give back to him, what he sold must also continue in the hand of its purchaser until the Jubilee year, and it must go out in the Jubilee, and he must return to his possession. (**Leviticus 25:28**)
- And the avenger of blood does **find** him outside the boundary of his city of refuge, and the avenger of blood does slay the manslayer, he has no bloodguilt. (**Numbers 35:27**)
- If you do look for Yehowah your God from there, you will also certainly **find** him, because you will inquire for him with all your heart and with all your soul. (**Deuteronomy 4:29**)
- And he has charged her with notorious deeds and brought forth a bad name upon her and has said; This is the woman I have taken, and I proceeded to go near her, and I did not **find** evidence of virginity in her. (**Deuteronomy 22:14**)

- In case a man takes a woman and does make her his possession as a wife, it must also occur that if she should **find** no favor in his eyes because he has found something indecent on her part, he must also write out a certificate of divorce for her and put it in her hand and dismiss her from his house. (**Deuteronomy 24:1**)
- He came to **find** him in a wilderness land, and in an empty, howling desert. He began to encircle him, to take care of him, to safeguard him as the pupil of his eye. (**Deuteronomy 32:10**)
- So they went and came to the mountainous region and kept dwelling there three days, until the pursuers had come back. Now the pursuers were looking for them on every road, and they did not **find** them. (**Joshua 2:22**)
- Ought they not to **find**, ought they not to distribute spoil, a womb, two wombs to every able-bodied man, spoil of dyed stuffs for Sisera, spoil of dyed stuffs, an embroidered garment, dyed stuff, two embroidered garments for the necks of men of spoil? (**Judges 5:30**)
- And the man proceeded to go from the city of Bethlehem in Judah to reside for a time wherever he might **find** a place. At length while going his way he came into the mountainous region of Ephraim as far as the house of Micah. (**Judges 17:8**)
- Then Micah said to him; Where do you come from? At that he said to him; I am a Levite from Bethlehem in Judah, and I am on my way to reside for a time wherever I may **find** a place. (**Judges 17:9**)
- Accordingly Benjamin came back at that time. Then they gave them the women that they had preserved alive from the women of Jabesh-gilead, but they did not **find** enough for them. (**Judges 21:14**)
- May Yehowah make a gift to you, and do you **find** a resting-place each one in the house of her husband. Then she kissed them, and they began to raise their voices and weep. (**Ruth 1:9**)
- In time Ruth the Moabite woman said to Naomi; Let me go, please, to the field and glean among the ears of grain following after whoever it is in whose eyes I may **find** favor. So she said to

her; Go, my daughter. (**Ruth 2:2**)

- To this she said; Let me **find** favor in your eyes, my lord, because you have comforted me and because you have spoken reassuringly to your maidservant, although I myself may not happen to be like one of your maidservants. (**Ruth 2:13**)
- To this she said; Let your maidservant **find** favor in your eyes. And the woman proceeded to go on her way and to eat, and her face became self-concerned no more. (**1 Samuel 1:18**)
- And he went passing through the mountainous region of Ephraim and passing on through the land of Shalishah, and they did not **find** them. And they went passing on through the land of Shaalim, but they were not there. And he went passing on through the land of the Benjaminites, and they did not find them. (**1 Samuel 9:4**)
- As soon as you men come into the city, you will directly **find** him before he goes up to the high place to eat, because the people may not eat until his coming, for he is the one that blesses the sacrifice. First after that those who are invited may eat. And now go up, because him, just now you will find him. (**1 Samuel 9:13**)
- On your going away from me today you will certainly **find** two men close by the tomb of Rachel in the territory of Benjamin at Zelzah, and they will certainly say to you; The she-asses that you have gone to look for have been found, but now your father has given up the matter of the she-asses and has become anxious about you men, saying; What shall I do about my son? (**1 Samuel 10:2**)
- And now your kingdom will not last. Yehowah will certainly **find** for himself a man agreeable to his heart, and Yehowah will commission him as a leader over his people, because you did not keep what Yehowah commanded you. (**1 Samuel 13:14**)
- And, look! I shall send the attendant, saying; Go, **find** the arrows. If I should specifically say to the attendant, Look! The arrows are on this side of you, take them, then you come, for it means peace for you and there is nothing the matter, as Yehowah is living. (**1 Samuel 20:21**)

- And he proceeded to say to his attendant; Run, please, **find** the arrows that I am shooting. The attendant ran, and he himself shot the arrow to make it pass beyond him. (**1 Samuel 20:36**)
- And he went on to say to him; Do not be afraid, for the hand of Saul my father will not **find** you, and you yourself will be king over Israel, and I myself shall become second to you, and Saul my father also has knowledge to that effect. (**1 Samuel 23:17**)
- Ask your own young men, and they will tell you, that my young men may **find** favor in your eyes, because it was upon a good day that we came. Just give, please, whatever your hand may find to your servants and to your son David. (**1 Samuel 25:8**)
- And they got to **find** a man, an Egyptian, in the field. So they took him to David and gave him bread that he might eat and gave him water to drink. (**1 Samuel 30:11**)
- And it came about the next day that, when the Philistines came to strip the slain, they got to **find** Saul and his three sons fallen upon Mount Gilboa. (**1 Samuel 31:8**)
- And Abner got very angry at the words of Ish-bosheth and went on to say; Am I a dogs head that belongs to Judah? Today I keep exercising loving-kindness toward the house of Saul your father, to his brothers and his personal friends, and I have not let you **find** yourself in the hand of David, and yet you call me to account for an error concerning a woman today. (**2 Samuel 3:8**)
- But the king said to Zadok; Take the ark of the true God back to the city. If I shall **find** favor in the eyes of Yehowah, he will also certainly bring me back and let me see it and its abiding place. (**2 Samuel 15:25**)
- The king then said to Ziba; Look! Yours is everything that belongs to Mephibosheth. Upon that Ziba said; I do bow down. Let me **find** favor in your eyes, my lord the king. (**2 Samuel 16:4**)
- The servants of Absalom now came to the woman at her house and said; Where are Ahimaaz and Jonathan? At this the woman said to them; They passed on from here to the waters. Then they kept on searching, and they did not **find** them and so returned to Jerusalem. (**2 Samuel 17:20**)

- Then David said to Abishai; Now Sheba the son of Bichri will be worse for us than Absalom. You yourself take the servants of your lord and chase after him, that he may not actually **find** for himself fortified cities and escape before our eyes. (**2 Samuel 20:6**)
- And Hadad continued to **find** favor in the eyes of Pharaoh, so much that he gave him a wife, the sister of his own wife, the sister of Tahpenes the lady. (**1 Kings 11:19**)
- And it came about at that particular time that Jeroboam himself went out from Jerusalem, and Ahijah the Shilonite the prophet got to **find** him on the road, and Ahijah was covering himself with a new garment, and the two of them were by themselves in the field. (**1 Kings 11:29**)
- And he went following the man of the true God and got to **find** him sitting under the big tree. Then he said to him; Are you the man of the true God who has come out of Judah? To which he said; I am. (**1 Kings 13:14**)
- And Ahab went on to say to Obadiah; Go through the land to all the springs of water and to all the torrent valleys. Perhaps we may **find** green grass, that we may preserve the horses and mules alive and may not have any more of the beasts cut off. (**1 Kings 18:5**)
- As Yehowah your God is living, there is not a nation or kingdom where my lord has not sent to look for you. After they had said; He is not here, he made the kingdom and the nation swear that they could not **find** you. (**1 Kings 18:10**)
- And it is bound to occur that, when I myself go from you, then the spirit of Yehowah itself will carry you away to where I shall not know, and I shall have come to tell Ahab, and he will not **find** you, and he will be bound to kill me, as your servant himself has feared Yehowah from his youth. (**1 Kings 18:12**)
- Therefore he said to him; For the reason that you did not listen to the voice of Yehowah, here you are going away from me, and a lion will certainly strike you down. After that he went away from beside him, and the lion got to **find** him and strike him down. (**1 Kings 20:36**)

- And he went on to **find** another man and to say; Strike me, please. So the man struck him, striking and wounding. (**1 Kings 20:37**)
- And they kept urging him until he was embarrassed, so that he said; Send. They now sent fifty men, and they kept looking for three days, but they did not **find** him. (**2 Kings 2:17**)
- Accordingly a certain one went out to the field to pick mallows, and he got to **find** a wild vine and went picking wild gourds from it, his garment full, and then came and sliced them into the stewpot, for they were not acquainted with them. (**2 Kings 4:39**)
- At that Jehoram said; Hitch up! So his war chariot was hitched up and Jehoram the king of Israel and Ahaziah the king of Judah went out, each in his own war chariot. As they continued on out to meet Jehu, they got to **find** him in the tract of land of Naboth the Jezreelite. (**2 Kings 9:21**)
- When they went to bury her, they did not **find** anything of her but the skull and the feet and the palms of the hands. (**2 Kings 9:35**)
- However, the king of Assyria got to **find** conspiracy in Hoshea's case, in that he had sent messengers to So the king of Egypt and did not bring the tribute up to the king of Assyria as in former years. Hence the king of Assyria shut him up and kept him bound in the house of detention. (**2 Kings 17:4**)
- And it came about the next day that, when the Philistines came to strip the slain, they got to **find** Saul and his sons fallen upon Mount Gilboa. (**1 Chronicles 10:8**)
- Tomorrow go down against them. There they are coming up by the pass of Ziz, and you will be certain to **find** them at the end of the torrent valley in front of the wilderness of Jeruel. (**2 Chronicles 20:16**)
- So Jehoshaphat and his people came to plunder the spoil on them, and they got to **find** among them in abundance both goods and clothing and desirable articles, and they went stripping them off for themselves until they could carry no more. And it came to be three days that they were plundering the spoil, for it was abundant. (**2 Chronicles 20:25**)

- And it came about that as soon as Jehu had entered into controversy with the house of Ahab, he got to **find** the princes of Judah and the sons of the brothers of Ahaziah, ministers of Ahaziah, and he proceeded to kill them. (**2 Chronicles 22:8**)
- Accordingly many people were collected together, and they went stopping up all the fountains and the torrent that floods through the middle of the land, saying; Why should the kings of Assyria come and actually **find** a great deal of water? (**2 Chronicles 32:4**)
- These were the ones that looked for their register to establish their genealogy publicly, and they did not **find** themselves, so that they were barred as polluted from the priesthood. (**Ezra 2:62**)
- That there may be an investigation of the book of records of your ancestors. Then you will **find** in the book of records and learn that that city is a city rebellious and causing loss to kings and jurisdictional districts, and within it there were movers of revolt from the days of old. For this reason that city has been laid waste. (**Ezra 4:15**)
- With all the silver and the gold that you **find** in all the jurisdictional district of Babylon along with the gift of the people and the priests who are voluntarily giving to the house of their God, which is in Jerusalem. (**Ezra 7:16**)
- And I proceeded to collect them at the river that comes to Ahava, and we kept encamped there three days, that I might scrutinize the people and the priests, but none of the sons of Levi did I **find** there. (**Ezra 8:15**)
- And I proceeded to say to them; We ourselves have bought back our own Jewish brothers who were sold to the nations, as far as it was in our power, and at the same time will you yourselves sell your own brothers, and must they be sold to us? At this they became speechless, and they did not **find** a word. (**Nehemiah 5:8**)
- And I got to **find** out that the very portions of the Levites had not been given them, so that the Levites and the singers doing the work went running off, each one to his own field. (**Nehemiah 13:10**)
- And I began to **find** fault with the deputy rulers and say; Why

has the house of the true God been neglected? Consequently I collected them together and stationed them at their standing place. (**Nehemiah 13:11**)

- So I began to **find** fault with the nobles of Judah and say to them; What is this bad thing that you are doing, even profaning the Sabbath day? (**Nehemiah 13:17**)
- And I began to **find** fault with them and call down evil upon them and strike some men of them and pull out their hair and make them swear by God; You should not give your daughters to their sons, and you should not accept any of their daughters for your sons or yourselves. (**Nehemiah 13:25**)
- For how can I bear it when I must look upon the calamity that will **find** my people, and how can I bear it when I must look upon the destruction of my relatives? (**Esther 8:6**)
- Those who are rejoicing to gleefulness, they exult because they **find** a burial place. (**Job 3:22**)
- If he should **find** delight in contending with him, he cannot answer him once out of a thousand. (**Job 9:3**)
- That you should try to **find** my error and for my sin you should keep looking? (**Job 10:6**)
- Can you **find** out the deep things of God, or can you find out to the very limit of the Almighty? (**Job 11:7**)
- However, I, for my part, would speak to the Almighty himself, and in arguing with God I would **find** delight. (**Job 13:3**)
- However, you men may all of you resume. So come on please, as I do not **find** anyone wise among you. (**Job 17:10**)
- Like a dream he will fly off, and they will not **find** him, and he will be chased away like a vision of the night. (**Job 20:8**)
- For then in the Almighty you will **find** your exquisite delight, and you will raise your face to God himself. (**Job 22:26**)
- O that I really knew where I might **find** him! I would come clear to his fixed place. (**Job 23:3**)

- Or in the Almighty will he **find** exquisite delight? Will he call to God at all times? (**Job 27:10**)
- Indeed, for silver there exists a place to **find** it and a place for gold that they refine. (**Job 28:1**)
- You sons of men, how long must my glory be for insult, while you keep loving empty things, while you keep seeking to **find** a lie? (**Psalms 4:2**)
- Break the arm of the wicked and bad one. May you search after his wickedness until you **find** no more. (**Psalms 10:15**)
- Your hand will **find** all your enemies, your own right hand will find those hating you. (**Psalms 21:8**)
- Concerning you my heart has said; Seek to **find** my face, you people. Your face, O Yehowah, I shall seek to find. (**Psalms 27:8**)

- The sickened ones you have not strengthened, and the ailing one you have not healed, and the broken one you have not bandaged, and the dispersed one you have not brought back, and the lost one you have not sought to **find**, but with harshness you have had them in subjection, even with tyranny. (**Ezekiel 34:4**)
- My sheep kept straying on all the mountains and on every high hill, and on all the surface of the earth my sheep were scattered, with no one making a search and with no one seeking to **find**. (**Ezekiel 34:6**)
- And they will complete the days. And it must occur on the eighth day and from then on that the priests will render upon the altar the whole burnt offerings of you people and your communion sacrifices, and I shall certainly **find** pleasure in you, is the utterance of the Sovereign Lord Yehowah. (**Ezekiel 43:27**)
- And as regards every matter of wisdom and understanding that the king inquired about from them, he even got to **find** them ten times better than all the magic-practicing priests and the conjurers that were in all his royal realm. (**Daniel 1:20**)

- At that time the high officials and the satraps themselves were constantly seeking to **find** some pretext against Daniel respecting the kingdom, but there was no pretext or corrupt thing at all that they were able to find, forasmuch as he was trustworthy and no negligence or corrupt thing at all was found in him. (**Daniel 6:4**)
- Consequently these able-bodied men were saying; We shall **find** in this Daniel no pretext at all, except we have to find it against him in the Law of his God. (**Daniel 6:5**)
- Therefore here I am hedging your way about with thorns, and I will heap up a stone wall against her, so that her own roadways she will not **find**. (**Hosea 2:6**)
- And she will actually chase after her passionate lovers, but she will not overtake them, and she will certainly look for them, but she will not **find** them. And she will have to say; I want to go and return to my husband, the first one, for I had it better at that time than now. (**Hosea 2:7**)
- With their flock and with their herd they proceeded to go and look for Yehowah, but they could not **find** him. He had drawn away from them. (**Hosea 5:6**)
- And he kept contending with an angel and gradually prevailed. He wept, that he might implore favor for himself. At Bethel He got to **find** him, and there He began talking with us. (**Hosea 12:4**)
- And Ephraim keeps saying; Indeed, I have become rich, I have found valuable things for myself. As regards all my toiling, they will **find**, on my part, no error that is sin. (**Hosea 12:8**)
- But if you people offer up to me whole burnt offerings, even in your gift offerings I shall **find** no pleasure, and on your communion sacrifices of fatlings I shall not look. (**Amos 5:22**)
- And they will certainly stagger from sea all the way to sea, and from north even to the sunrise. They will keep roving about while searching for the word of Yehowah, but they will not **find** it. (**Amos 8:12**)
- Look! There are days coming, is the utterance of Yehowah, and the plowman will actually overtake the harvester, and the treader of grapes, the carrier of the seed, and the mountains

must drip with sweet wine, and the very hills will all **find** themselves melting. (**Amos 9:13**)

- For I shall show compassion no more upon the inhabitants of the land, is the utterance of Yehowah. So here I am causing mankind to **find** themselves, each one in the hand of his companion and in the hand of his king, and they will certainly crush to pieces the land, and I shall do no delivering out of their hand. (**Zechariah 11:6**)
- And when you present a blind animal for sacrificing; It is nothing bad. And when you present a lame animal or a sick one; It is nothing bad. Bring it near, please, to your governor. Will he **find** pleasure in you, or will he receive you kindly? Yehowah of armies has said. (**Malachi 1:8**)
- Keep on asking, and it will be given you, keep on seeking, and you will **find**, keep on knocking, and it will be opened to you. (**Matthew 7:7**)
- He that **finds** his soul will lose it, and he that loses his soul for my sake will find it. (**Matthew 10:39**)
- Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am mild-tempered and lowly in heart, and you will **find** refreshment for your souls. (**Matthew 11:29**)
- Which is, in fact, the tiniest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the largest of the vegetables and becomes a tree, so that the birds of heaven come and **find** lodging among its branches. (**Matthew 13:32**)
- For whoever wants to save his soul will lose it, but whoever loses his soul for my sake will **find** it. (**Matthew 16:25**)
- But that we do not cause them to stumble, you go to the sea, cast a fishhook, and take the first fish coming up and, when you open its mouth, you will **find** a stater coin. Take that and give it to them for me and you. (**Matthew 17:27**)
- And if he happens to **find** it, I certainly tell you, he rejoices more over it than over the ninety-nine that have not strayed. (**Matthew 18:13**)

- **Saying to them; Be on your way into the village that is within sight of you, and you will at once find an ass tied, and a colt with her, untie them and bring them to me. (Matthew 21:2)**
- **Therefore go to the roads leading out of the city, and anyone you find invite to the marriage feast. (Matthew 22:9)**
- **But when it has been sown, it comes up and becomes greater than all other vegetables and produces great branches, so that the birds of the heaven are able to find lodging under its shadow. (Mark 4:32)**
- **And told them; Go into the village that is within sight of you, and as soon as you pass into it you will find a colt tied, on which none of mankind has yet sat, loose it and bring it. (Mark 11:2)**
- **And from a distance he caught sight of a fig tree that had leaves, and he went to see whether he would perhaps find something on it. But, on coming to it, he found nothing but leaves, for it was not the season of figs. (Mark 11:13)**
- **In order, that when he arrives suddenly, he does not find you sleeping. (Mark 13:36)**
- **And this is a sign for you. You will find an infant bound in cloth bands and lying in a manger. (Luke 2:12)**
- **The scribes and the Pharisees were now watching him closely to see whether he would cure on the Sabbath, in order to find some way to accuse him. (Luke 6:7)**
- **Then the day started to decline. The twelve now came up and said to him; Dismiss the crowd, that they may go into the villages and countryside round about and procure lodging and find provisions, because out here we are in a lonely place. (Luke 9:12)**
- **Accordingly I say to you, keep on asking, and it will be given you. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and it will be opened to you. (Luke 11:9)**
- **I tell you, he will cause justice to be done to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of man arrives, will he really find the faith on the earth? (Luke 18:8)**

- **Saying; Go into the village that is within sight of you, and in it after you pass in you will **find** a colt tied, on which none of mankind ever sat. Loose it and bring it. (Luke 19:30)**
- **And yet they did not **find** the effective thing for them to do, for the people one and all kept hanging onto him to hear him. (Luke 19:48)**
- **Then Pilate said to the chief priests and the crowds; I **find** no crime in this man. (Luke 23:4)**
- **And when they entered they did not **find** the body of the Lord Jesus. (Luke 24:3)**
- **But did not **find** his body and they came saying they had also seen a supernatural sight of angels, who said he is alive. (Luke 24:23)**
- **You will look for me, but you will not **find** me, and where I am you cannot come. (John 7:34)**
- **Therefore the Jews said among themselves; Where does this man intend going, so that we shall not **find** him? He does not intend to go to the Jews dispersed among the Greeks and teach the Greeks, does he? (John 7:35)**
- **What does this saying mean that he said; You will look for me, but you will not **find** me, and where I am you cannot come? (John 7:36)**
- **I am the door, whoever enters through me will be saved, and he will go in and out and **find** pasturage. (John 10:9)**
- **Pilate said to him; What is truth? And after saying this, he went out again to the Jews and said to them; I **find** no fault in him. (John 18:38)**
- **And Pilate went outside again and said to them; See! I bring him outside to you in order for you to know I **find** no fault in him. (John 19:4)**
- **However, when the chief priests and the officers saw him, they shouted, saying; Impale him! Impale him! Pilate said to them;**

Take him yourselves and impale him, for I do not **find** any fault in him. ([John 19:6](#))

- He said to them; Cast the net on the right side of the boat and you will **find** some. Then they cast it, but they were no longer able to draw it in because of the multitude of the fishes. ([John 21:6](#))
- So, when they had further threatened them, they released them, since they did not **find** any ground on which to punish them and on account of the people, because they were all glorifying God over what had occurred. ([Acts of Apostles 4:21](#))
- But when the officers got there they did not **find** them in the prison. So they returned and made report. ([Acts of Apostles 5:22](#))
- When they did not **find** them they dragged Jason and certain brothers to the city rulers, crying out; These men that have overturned the inhabited earth are present here also. ([Acts of Apostles 17:6](#))
- For them to seek God, if they might grope for him and really **find** him, although, in fact, he is not far off from each one of us. ([Acts of Apostles 17:27](#))
- So there broke out a loud screaming, and some of the scribes of the party of the Pharisees rose and began contending fiercely, saying; We **find** nothing wrong in this man, but if a spirit or an angel spoke to him. ([Acts of Apostles 23:9](#))
- From him you yourself can by examination **find** out about all these things of which we are accusing him. ([Acts of Apostles 24:8](#))
- As you are in a position to **find** out that for me it has not been more than twelve days since I went up to worship in Jerusalem. ([Acts of Apostles 24:11](#))
- I **find**, then, this Law in my case. That when I wish to do what is right, what is bad is present with me. ([Romans 7:21](#))
- You will therefore say to me; Why does he yet **find** fault? For who has withstood his express will? ([Romans 9:19](#))

- Thus we are avoiding having any man **find** fault with us in connection with this liberal contribution to be administered by us. (**2 Corinthians 8:20**)
- Otherwise, in some way, if Macedonians should come with me and **find** you not ready, we, not to say you, should be put to shame in this assurance of ours. (**2 Corinthians 9:4**)
- For I am afraid that somehow, when I arrive, I may **find** you not as I could wish and I may prove to be to you not as you could wish, but, instead, there should somehow be strife, jealousy, cases of anger, contentions, backbitings, whisperings, cases of being puffed up, disorders. (**2 Corinthians 12:20**)
- May the Lord grant him to **find** mercy from Yehowah in that day. And all the services he rendered in Ephesus you know well enough. (**2 Timothy 1:18**)
- Let us, therefore, approach with freeness of speech to the throne of undeserved kindness, that we may obtain mercy and **find** undeserved kindness for help at the right time. (**Hebrews 4:16**)
- For he does **find** fault with the people when he says; Look! There are days coming, says Yehowah, and I will conclude with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah a New Covenant. (**Hebrews 8:8**)
- And in those days the men will seek death but will by no means **find** it, and they will desire to die but death keeps fleeing from them. (**Revelation 9:6**)
- Yes, the fine fruit that your soul desired has departed from you, and all the dainty things and the gorgeous things have perished from you, and never again will people **find** them. (**Revelation 18:14**)
