- Moses told the Israelites to stand firm and see the salvation of Yehowah, when Yehowah God parted the waters of the Red Sea.
- Then Moses said to the people; Do not be afraid. Stand firm and see the salvation of Yehowah, which he will perform for you today. For the Egyptians whom you do see today you will not see again, no, never again. (Exodus 14:13)
- Moses told Israel that none of the kings of Canaan would stand firm against Israel, until they had exterminated all of the nations of Canaan.
- And he will certainly give their kings into your hand, and you must destroy their names from under the heavens. Nobody will take a firm stand against you, until you have exterminated them. (Deuteronomy 7:24)
- No man will make a firm stand against you. The dread of you and the fear of you Yehowah your God will put before the face of all the land on which you will tread, just as he has promised you. (Deuteronomy 11:25)
- Nobody will take a firm stand before you all the days of your life. Just as I proved to be with Moses I shall prove to be with you. I shall neither desert you nor leave you entirely. (Joshua 1:5)
- The Israelites asked who could make a firm stand against the Anakim because of their size.
- A people great and tall, the sons of Anakim, about whom you yourself have known and you yourself have heard it said; Who can make a firm stand before the sons of Anak? (Deuteronomy 9:2)
- Samuel told Saul that if he had taken a firm stand for righteousness, that Yehowah God would have made his kingdom firm to time indefinite.

- At this Samuel said to Saul; You have acted foolishly. You have not kept the commandment of Yehowah your God that he commanded you, because, if you had, Yehowah would have made your kingdom firm over Israel to time indefinite. (1 Samuel 13:13)
- As soon as the kingdom of Jehoash became firm he began to strike down his servants, that had killed his father the king.
- And it came about that as soon as the kingdom had become firm in his hand, he began to strike down his servants that had struck down the king his father. (2 Kings 14:5)
- Job showed that he would support anyone wobbling and their knees he would make firm.
- Anyone stumbling, your words would raise up, and knees giving way you would make firm. (Job 4:4)
- The Psalmist showed that every earthling man, though standing firm, is nothing more than an exhalation.
- Look! You have made my days just a few, and my life's duration is as nothing in front of you. Surely every earthling man, though standing firm, is nothing but an exhalation. (Psalms 39:5)
- Yehowah God promised David to use a firm hand to guide him, and to strengthen him with his own arm.
- With whom my own hand will be firm, whom my own arm also will strengthen. (Psalms 89:21)
- The congregator showed, that Yehowah God made the cloud masses firm.
- When he made firm the cloud masses above, when he caused the fountains of the watery deep to be strong. (Proverbs 8:28)
- Isaiah called for Israel to make the weak hands strong, and the knees that were wobbling among Israel, firm.
- Strengthen the weak hands, you people, and make the knees that are wobbling firm. (Isaiah 35:3)

- Peter took hold of a crippled man nearby the temple and instantly his feet and anklebones were made firm, and he stood praising God.
- With that he took hold of him by the right hand and raised him up. Instantly the soles of his feet and his anklebones were made firm. (Acts of Apostles 3:7)
- As Paul went traveling with Timothy in his ministry, they continued to make the congregations firm in the faith.
- Therefore, indeed, the congregations continued to be made firm in the faith and to increase in number from day to day. (Acts of Apostles 16:5)
- Paul longed to visit the congregation of spirit anointed Christians so as to make them firm for righteousness and in faith toward Christ.
- For I am longing to see you, that I may impart some spiritual gift to you in order for you to be made firm. (Romans 1:11)
- Paul showed by his counsel to the Romans, that it is Yehowah God himself who makes spirit anointed Christians firm through his Holy Spirit he puts within them.
- Now to him who can make you firm in accord with the Good News I declare and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the sacred secret which has been kept in silence for long-lasting times. (Romans 16:25)
- Paul showed that the witness about the Christ had been rendered firm among those there in Corinth, Greece.
- Even as the witness about the Christ has been rendered firm among you. (1 Corinthians 1:6)
- Yehowah God makes his spirit anointed Christian sons firm for righteousness, so that they might be holy and open to no accusation before him.
- He will also make you firm to the end, that you may be open to no accusation in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 1:8)

- Paul counseled the Corinthians to stand firm in the faith, and to carry on their Christian service as men, growing stronger as they exercised their faith daily.
- Stay awake, stand firm in the faith, carry on as men, grow mighty. (1 Corinthians 16:13)
- Paul showed spirit anointed Christians that a complete suit of armor would make them firm, and fully able to resist the advances of Satan the Devil against them spiritually.
- Put on the complete suit of armor from God that you may be able to stand firm against the machinations of the Devil. (Ephesians 6:11)
- On this account take up the complete suit of armor from God, that you may be able to resist in the wicked day and, after you have done all things thoroughly, to stand firm. (Ephesians 6:13)
- Stand firm, therefore, with your loins girded about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness. (Ephesians 6:14)
- Paul wanted to see those whom he ministered to, to remain firm in what he taught them, remaining united in the faith of the Good News of God.
- Only behave in a manner worthy of the Good News about the Christ, in order, that, whether I come and see you or be absent, I may hear about the things which concern you, that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one soul striving side by side for the faith of the Good News. (Philippians 1:27)
- Paul told the Philippians to stand firm in their faith.
- Consequently, my brothers beloved and longed for, my joy and crown, stand firm in this way in the Lord, beloved ones.
 (Philippians 4:1)
- Ephphras prayed for his brothers to remain firm in their faith.
- Epaphras, who is from among you, a slave of Christ Jesus, sends you his greetings, always exerting himself in your behalf in his prayers, that you may finally stand complete and with firm conviction in all the will of God. (Colossians 4:12)

- Paul sent Timothy to the congregation in Thessalonica to make them firm and to comfort them regarding their faith in Christ.
- And we sent Timothy, our brother and God's minister in the Good News about the Christ, in order to make you firm and comfort you in behalf of your faith. (1 Thessalonians 3:2)
- Paul realized that if his work in the Lord stood firm, then this meant salvation for him.
- Because now we live if you stand firm in the Lord. (1 Thessalonians 3:8)
- Paul requested of Yehowah God to make the hearts of the Thessalonians firm and unblamable at the presence of Jesus Christ, when he comes with all his holy ones.
- To the end that he may make your hearts firm, unblamable in holiness before our God and Father at the presence of our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones. (1 Thessalonians 3:13)
- Paul counseled the Thessalonians to remain firm, keeping a tight hold on the traditions that they were taught.
- So, then, brothers, stand firm and maintain your hold on the traditions that you were taught, whether it was through a verbal message or through a letter of ours. (2 Thessalonians 2:15)
- Paul counseled the Thessalonians so as to comfort their hearts, and to make them firm in every good deed and word.
- Comfort your hearts and make you firm in every good deed and word. (2 Thessalonians 2:17)
- But the Lord is faithful, and he will make you firm and keep you from the wicked one. (2 Thessalonians 3:3)
- Paul counseled Timothy to fight the fine fight of the faith, and thus to get a firm hold on everlasting life.
- Fight the fine fight of the faith, get a firm hold on the everlasting life for which you were called and you offered the fine public declaration in front of many witnesses. (1 Timothy 6:12)

- Safely treasuring up for themselves a fine foundation for the future, in order, that they may get a firm hold on the real life. (1 Timothy 6:19)
- Paul wanted the local elders to make firm assertions constantly so that those believers might keep their minds on maintaining fine works.
- Faithful is the saying, and concerning these things I desire you to make firm assertions constantly, in order, that those who have believed God may keep their minds on maintaining fine works.

 These things are fine and beneficial to men. (Titus 3:8)
- Paul reasoned, that if the word spoken through angels to Moses proved to be firm, and every disobedient act received a retribution in harmony with justice.
- For if the word spoken through angels proved to be firm, and every transgression and disobedient act received a retribution in harmony with justice. (Hebrews 2:2)
- Paul showed the Hebrew Christians that they were the spiritual house of Yehowah God, if they made fast their hold on their freeness of speech in preaching, and their boasting over the glorious hope within them firm to the end of their lives on earth.
- But Christ was faithful as a Son over the house of that One. We are the house of that One, if we make fast our hold on our freeness of speech and our boasting over the hope firm to the end. (Hebrews 3:6)
- Paul showed that believers only become partakers of the Christ, if they carry that initial confidence of faith they had at the beginning of their ministry, firm to the end of their lives on earth.
- For we actually become partakers of the Christ only if we make fast our hold on the confidence we had at the beginning firm to the end. (Hebrews 3:14)
- Paul showed that the hope based upon Yehowah God's oath and promise, was both sure and firm.
- This hope we have as an anchor for the soul, both sure and firm,

and it enters in within the curtain. (Hebrews 6:19)

- James counseled spirit anointed Christians to exercise patience, and thus make their hearts firm, because the presence of Christ had drawn close.
- You too exercise patience, make your hearts firm, because the presence of the Lord has drawn close. (James 5:8)
- Peter assured spirit anointed Christians that after they had accepted suffering for a little while, that Yehowah God himself would complete their training, and then make them firm and strong in faith.
- But, after you have suffered a little while, the God of all undeserved kindness, who called you to his everlasting glory in union with Christ, will himself finish your training, he will make you firm, he will make you strong. (1 Peter 5:10)
- Peter attested that his witness was true regarding the undeserved-kindness of Yehowah God, and asked his spirit anointed Christian brothers to stand firm in it.
- Through Silvanus, a faithful brother, as I account him, I have written you in few words, to give encouragement and an earnest witness that this is the true undeserved kindness of God, in which stand firm. (1 Peter 5:12)
