## ~FIT (135)

[English, healthy, robust, well, in shape, vigorous, able-bodied, athletic, Opposite of, unfit]

- The folds of skin of the Leviathan fit closely together, so that not even air can come between them.
- One to the other they fit closely, and not even air can come in between them. (Job 41:16)
- In time the Son of Man's presence will be over and Yehowah himself will reveal his son to all the world of mankind. Jehovah's Witnesses were given the first chance to reveal the Son of Man, and then Christendom was given a second opportunity. In fact they were both asleep to the doing of God's will in our day, and were not fit to carry out his purpose.
- Accordingly I went to the Euphrates and dug and took the belt from the place in which I had hid it, and, look! The belt had been ruined, it was not fit for anything. (Jeremiah 13:7)
- This bad people who are refusing to obey my words, who are walking in the stubbornness of their heart and who keep walking after other gods in order to serve them and to bow down to them, will also become just like this belt that is fit for nothing. (Jeremiah 13:10)
- Ezekiel showed that a vine tree burned at both ends was not fit for any useful purpose.
- Look! Into the fire is where it must be put for fuel. Both ends of it the fire certainly devours, and the very middle of it does get scorched. Is it fit for any work? (Ezekiel 15:4)
- Over the years Jehovah's Witnesses have become a mainstream religion. They have had to become such in order to attract large numbers of worshippers. Where they used to meet in school gymnasiums and racetracks, now they have their own beautiful convention facilities. Rather than simple text in their books, now they have slick four-color publications. They have grown up on the finest of spiritual foods at Yehowah's table and had grown to be very beautiful

to their God. Many of their older anointed ones went on to their reward as they were deemed fit for royal position.

- And you kept decking yourself with gold and silver, and your attire was fine linen and costly material and an embroidered garment. Fine flour and honey and oil were what you ate, and you grew to be very, very pretty, and gradually you became fit for royal position. (Ezekiel 16:13)
- Yehowah has given Jehovah's Witnesses time since 1971 C.E, to remove the detestable and disgusting thing from before his face, the Governing Body of Jehovah's Witnesses. They stand in open defiance of Yehowah and his anointed and appointed king/priest, his son the Son of Man, to teach among his people and to direct his work on earth. They are the disgusting thing that causes desolation that is standing in a holy place, as sole teacher over God's people. Yehowah is about to forcibly remove them just as he sees fit.
- And they continued to be haughty and to carry on a detestable thing before me, and I finally removed them, just as I saw fit. (Ezekiel 16:50)
- John the Baptist showed that he himself was not fit to untie the laces of the Messiah's sandals
- I, for my part, baptize you with water because of your repentance, but the one coming after me is stronger than I am, whose sandals I am not fit to take off. That one will baptize you people with Holy Spirit and with fire. (Matthew 3:11)
- And he would preach, saying; After me someone stronger than I am is coming, I am not fit to stoop and untie the laces of his sandals. (Mark 1:7)
- John gave the answer, saying to all; I, for my part, baptize you with water, but the one stronger than I am is coming, the lace of whose sandals I am not fit to untie. He will baptize you people with Holy Spirit and fire. (Luke 3:16)
- The army officer pleading for Jesus Christ's assistance did not see himself as fit to have Jesus enter under his roof.
- In reply the army officer said; Sir, I am not a fit man for you to enter under my roof, but just say the word and my manservant

will be healed. (Matthew 8:8)

- So Jesus started off with them. But when he was not far from the house, the army officer had already sent friends to say to him; Sir, do not bother, for I am not fit to have you come in under my roof. (Luke 7:6)
- The Jewish religious leaders said that Jesus was not fit to live, after hearing him speak.
- Now they kept listening to him down to this word, and they raised their voices, saying; Take such a man away from the earth, for he was not fit to live! (Acts of Apostles 22:22)
- Paul reasoned that Yehowah God tolerated the Jews who were fit only for destruction, so as to make known his mercy upon vessels of mercy, spirit anointed Christians.
- If, now, God, although having the will to demonstrate his wrath and to make his power known, tolerated with much long-suffering vessels of wrath made fit for destruction. (Romans 9:22)
- Paul called himself the least of the apostles, and did not see himself fit to be called an apostle, because of his earlier persecution off the congregation of God.
- For I am the least of the apostles, and I am not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the congregation of God. (1 Corinthians 15:9)
- Paul showed that Yehowah God was the one who made him and other preachers of the Good News fit to preach to others.
- But, just as we have been proved by God as fit to be entrusted with the Good News, so we speak, as pleasing, not men, but God, who makes proof of our hearts. (1 Thessalonians 2:4)
