[English, went after, went behind, pursued, chased, trailed, tracked, tagged along, hunted, Opposite of, preceded]

- It followed that in the morning Jacob awoke to see Leah as his wife rather than Rachel.
- So it followed in the morning that here it was Leah!
 Consequently he said to Laban; What is this you have done to
 me? Was it not for Rachel that I served with you? So why have
 you tricked me? (Genesis 29:25)
- If followed that as soon as Rachel gave birth to Joseph that Jacob asked Laban to leave his country.
- And it followed that when Rachel had given birth to Joseph,
 Jacob immediately said to Laban; Send me away that I may go
 to my place and to my country. (Genesis 30:25)
- If followed that from the time Joseph was appointed over Potiphar's household, Yehowah God's blessing came to be upon all his house.
- And it followed that from the time he appointed him over his house and in charge of all that was his Yehowah kept blessing the house of the Egyptian due to Joseph, and Yehowah's blessing came to be upon all that he had in the house and in the field. (Genesis 39:5)
- Potiphar's wife lyingly said that if followed that as soon as Joseph tried to rape her, she cried out, and he left his garment there beside of her.
- And it followed that as soon as he heard that I raised my voice and began crying out, he then left his garment beside me and took to flight and went on outside. (Genesis 39:15)
- But it followed that as soon as I raised my voice and began to cry out, he then left his garment beside me and went fleeing outside. (Genesis 39:18)

- Yehowah swore that all the men twenty years old and up would not come to see the Promised Land because they had not followed him whole souled. Only Joshua and Caleb had followed Yehowah God whole-souled.
- The men who came up out of Egypt from twenty years old upward will not see the soil of which I have sworn to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, because they have not followed me wholly. (Numbers 32:11)
- Except Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenizzite and Joshua the son of Nun, because they have followed Yehowah wholly. (Numbers 32:12)
- Except Caleb the son of Jephunneh. He will see it, and to him and to his sons I shall give the land upon which he trod, by reason of the fact that he has followed Yehowah fully.

 (Deuteronomy 1:36)
- That is why Hebron has come to belong to Caleb the son of Jephunneh the Kenizzite as an inheritance down to this day, for the reason that he followed Yehowah the God of Israel fully. (Joshua 14:14)
- Joshua showed that when the heart of his brothers melted, he followed Yehowah whole-souled.
- And my brothers who went up with me caused the heart of the people to melt, but as for me, I followed Yehowah my God fully. (Joshua 14:8)
- Consequently Moses swore on that day, saying; The land upon which your foot has trod will become yours and your sons as an inheritance to time indefinite, because you have followed Yehowah my God fully. (Joshua 14:9)
- Six hundred men that had followed the king from Gath, crossed at his side.
- And all his servants were crossing at his side, and all the Cherethites and all the Pelethites and all the Gittites, six hundred men that had followed him from Gath, were crossing before the king's face. (2 Samuel 15:18)

- The Psalmist showed that his soul had closely followed Yehowah God, and his right hand had guided him.
- My soul has closely followed you. On me your right hand keeps fast hold. (Psalms 63:8)
- Jesus' disciples abandoned their business professions and followed after Jesus.
- At once abandoning the nets, they followed him. (Matthew 4:20)
- At once leaving the boat and their father, they followed him. (Matthew 4:22)
- And at once they abandoned their nets and followed him. (Mark 1:18)
- But as he was passing along, he caught sight of Levi the son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax office, and he said to him; Be my follower. And rising up he followed him. (Mark 2:14)
- On hearing of Jesus' many healings, great crowds followed him from the surrounding territory.
- Consequently great crowds followed him from Galilee and Decapolis and Jerusalem and Judea and from the other side of the Jordan. (Matthew 4:25)
- After he had come down from the mountain great crowds followed him. (Matthew 8:1)
- And when he got aboard a boat, his disciples followed him. (Matthew 8:23)
- And he departed from there and came into his home territory, and his disciples followed him. (Mark 6:1)
- So they brought the boats back to land, and abandoned everything and followed him. (Luke 5:11)
- On going out he went as customarily to the Mount of Olives, and the disciples also followed him. (Luke 22:39)
- And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus.

(John 1:37)

- Andrew the brother of Simon Peter was one of the two that heard what John said and followed Jesus. (John 1:40)
- Two blind men followed after Jesus begging him to have mercy upon them.
- As Jesus was passing along from there, two blind men followed him, crying out and saying; Have mercy on us, Son of David. (Matthew 9:27)
- Many people followed Jesus wherever he went, so that he had no place of rest, yet still he cured them all.
- Having come to know this, Jesus withdrew from there. Many also followed him, and he cured them all. (Matthew 12:15)
- At hearing this Jesus withdrew from there by boat into a lonely place for isolation, but the crowds, getting to hear of it, followed him on foot from the cities. (Matthew 14:13)
- Also, great crowds followed him, and he cured them there. (Matthew 19:2)
- But Jesus with his disciples withdrew to the sea, and a great multitude from Galilee and from Judea followed him. (Mark 3:7)
- But the crowds, getting to know it, followed him. And he received them kindly and began to speak to them about the kingdom of God, and he healed those needing a cure. (Luke 9:11)
- Peter remarked to Jesus that he and the other apostles had left all things in life and followed after him, asking what really there would be for them for doing this. Jesus then showed that a glorious future was ahead for them all.
- Then Peter said to him in reply; Look! We have left all things and followed you. What actually will there be for us? (Matthew 19:27)
- Jesus said to them; Truly I say to you, in the re-creation, when the Son of man sits down upon his glorious throne, you who have followed me will also yourselves sit upon twelve thrones, judging

the twelve tribes of Israel. (Matthew 19:28)

- But Peter said; Look! We have left our own things and followed you. (Luke 18:28)
- Upon leaving Jericho a great crowd followed after Jesus.
- Now as they were going out of Jericho a great crowd followed him. (Matthew 20:29)
- Jesus touched the eyes of the blind men and they received sight, and began following after Jesus.
- Moved with pity, Jesus touched their eyes, and immediately they received sight, and they followed him. (Matthew 20:34)
- As Jesus advanced toward Jerusalem, many who followed after him experienced fear, of what they might experience there in Jerusalem.
- Now they were advancing on the road up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was going in front of them, and they felt amazement, but those who followed began to fear. Once again he took the twelve aside and started to tell them these things destined to befall him. (Mark 10:32)
- On the night of Jesus' arrest Peter followed Jesus to the courtyard of the High Priest.
- But Peter, from a good distance, followed him as far as in the courtyard of the High Priest, and he was sitting together with the house attendants and warming himself before a bright fire.

 (Mark 14:54)
- While upon the torture stake, women who followed him to Jerusalem stood at a distance. Later two of them also followed to the memorial tomb nearby.
- Moreover, all those acquainted with him were standing at a distance. Also, women, who together had followed him from Galilee, were standing beholding these things. (Luke 23:49)
- But the women, who had come with him out of Galilee, followed along and took a look at the memorial tomb and how his body

- The Jews with Mary in her house followed her when she went out to meet Jesus.
- Therefore the Jews that were with her in the house and that were consoling her, on seeing Mary rise quickly and go out, followed her, supposing that she was going to the memorial tomb to weep there. (John 11:31)
- After a synagogue assembly in Antioch in Pisidia, many men followed Paul and Barnabas after the assembly to learn more.
- So after the synagogue assembly was dissolved, many of the Jews and of the proselytes who worshiped God followed Paul and Barnabas, who in speaking to them began urging them to continue in the undeserved kindness of God. (Acts of Apostles 13:43)
- Paul showed that the Israelites in the wilderness drank a spiritual drink from the rock-mass that followed them, Jesus Christ.
- And all drank the same spiritual drink. For they used to drink from the spiritual rock-mass that followed them, and that rockmass meant the Christ. (1 Corinthians 10:4)
- Paul showed Timothy that by following his advices he would become a fine minister for following closely these teachings.
- By giving these advices to the brothers you will be a fine minister of Christ Jesus, one nourished with the words of the faith and of the fine teaching which you have followed closely. (1 Timothy 4:6)
- Widows were to be taken care of by the congregation in general, only if they diligently followed every good work.
- Having a witness borne to her for fine works, if she reared children, if she entertained strangers, if she washed the feet of holy ones, if she relieved those in tribulation, if she diligently followed every good work. (1 Timothy 5:10)
- Timothy had closely followed all of Paul's suffering throughout his life, and knew well of his faith.

- But you have closely followed my teaching, my course of life, my purpose, my faith, my long-suffering, my love, my endurance. (2 Timothy 3:10)
- Peter showed that some Christian men had followed the path of Balaam for the reward, thinking that godly devotion was a means of material gain.
- Abandoning the straight path, they have been misled. They have followed the path of Balaam, the son of Beor, who loved the reward of wrongdoing. (2 Peter 2:15)
- The whole earth followed after the wild beast that received a death stroke and yet was healed.
- And I saw one of its heads as though slaughtered to death, but its death-stroke got healed, and all the earth followed the wild beast with admiration. (Revelation 13:3)
- A second angel followed crying out that Babylon the Great had fallen.
- And another, a second angel, followed, saying; She has fallen!

 Babylon the Great has fallen, she who made all the nations drink of the wine of the anger of her fornication! (Revelation 14:8)
- A third angel followed him warning people not to worship this wild beast or its image.
- And another angel, a third, followed them, saying in a loud voice; If anyone worships the wild beast and its image, and receives a mark on his forehead or upon his hand. (Revelation 14:9)
