- Abraham divided his forces by night and came against the five kings by night, defeating them.
- And by night he resorted to dividing his forces, he and his slaves, against them, and thus he defeated them and kept in pursuit of them up to Hobah, which is north of Damascus. (Genesis 14:15)
- Yehowah God got glory from his defeat of all of Pharaoh's mighty military forces.
- So I shall indeed let Pharaoh's heart become obstinate, and he will certainly chase after them and I shall get glory for myself by means of Pharaoh and all his military forces, and the Egyptians will certainly know that I am Yehowah. Accordingly they did just that. (Exodus 14:4)
- And the Egyptians went chasing after them, and all the chariot horses of Pharaoh and his cavalrymen and his military forces were overtaking them while camping by the sea, by Pihahiroth in view of Baal-zephon. (Exodus 14:9)
- As for me, here I am letting the hearts of the Egyptians become obstinate, that they may go in after them and that I may get glory for myself by means of Pharaoh and all his military forces, his war chariots and his cavalrymen. (Exodus 14:17)
- And the waters kept coming back. Finally they covered the war chariots and the cavalrymen belonging to all of Pharaoh's military forces and who had gone into the sea after them. Not so much as one among them was let remain. (Exodus 14:28)
- Pharaoh's chariots and his military forces he has cast into the sea, and the choice of his warriors have been sunk in the Red Sea. (Exodus 15:4)
- Nor what he did to the military forces of Egypt, to his horses and his war chariots against the faces of which he made the waters of the Red Sea overflow when they were chasing after them, and Yehowah proceeded to destroy them till this day. (Deuteronomy

11:4)

- Moses grew indignant at the appointed military forces and their chiefs.
- And Moses grew indignant at the appointed men of the combat forces, the chiefs of the thousands and the chiefs of the hundreds who were coming in from the military expedition. (Numbers 31:14)
- David left the sheep to the keepers in charge of them, and went out to join the military forces at the front lines.
- Accordingly David got up early in the morning and left the sheep to the keepers charge and picked up and went just as Jesse had commanded him. When he came to the camp enclosure, the military forces were going out to the battle line, and they raised a shout for the battle. (1 Samuel 17:20)
- Joab was the chief of the military forces under King David.
- O the king said to Joab the chief of the military forces who was with him; Move about, please, through all the tribes of Israel, from Dan to Beer-sheba, and you men register the people, and I shall certainly know the number of the people. (2 Samuel 24:2)
- Finally the king's word prevailed upon Joab and the chiefs of the military forces.
- Finally the king's word prevailed upon Joab and the chiefs of the military forces. So Joab and the chiefs of the military forces went out from before the king to register the people Israel. (2 Samuel 24:4)
- Ben-hadad listened to Asa, and sent the chiefs of the military forces against the cities of Israel.
- Accordingly Ben-hadad listened to King Asa and sent the chiefs of the military forces that were his against the cities of Israel and went striking down Ijon and Dan and Abel-beth-maacah and all Chinnereth, as far as all the land of Naphtali. (1 Kings 15:20)
- As for Ben-hadad the king of Syria, he collected all his military forces together and also thirty-two kings with him and horses

- and chariots, and he proceeded to go up and lay siege to Samaria and fight against it. (1 Kings 20:1)
- So Ben-hadad listened to King Asa and sent the chiefs of the military forces that were his against the cities of Israel, so that they struck Ijon and Dan and Abel-maim and all the storage places of the cities of Naphtali. (2 Chronicles 16:4)
- And he proceeded to put military forces in all the fortified cities of Judah and to put garrisons in the land of Judah and in the cities of Ephraim that Asa his father had captured. (2 Chronicles 17:2)
- The ones coming out from the city included the military forces that were behind them.
- And these were the ones that came out from the city, the young men of the princes of the jurisdictional districts and the military forces that were behind them. (1 Kings 20:19)
- When the military forces who were scattered throughout Israel heard that Gedeliah had become governor, they gathered together to him as Mizpah.
- When all the chiefs of the military forces, they and their men, heard that the king of Babylon had appointed Gedaliah, they immediately came to Gedaliah at Mizpah, that is, Ishmael the son of Nethaniah and Johanan the son of Kareah and Seraiah the son of Tanhumeth the Netophathite and Jaazaniah the son of the Maacathite, they and their men. (2 Kings 25:23)
- In time all the chiefs of the military forces who were in the field, they and their men, got to hear that the king of Babylon had commissioned Gedaliah the son of Ahikam over the land and that he had commissioned him over the men and women and little children and some of the lowly people of the land, who had not been taken into exile in Babylon. (Jeremiah 40:7)
- As for Johanan the son of Kareah and all the chiefs of the military forces who were in the field, they came to Gedaliah at Mizpah. (Jeremiah 40:13)
- In time Johanan the son of Kareah and all the chiefs of the military forces who were with him got to hear all the bad that

Ishmael the son of Nethaniah had done. (Jeremiah 41:11)

- Then it came about that as soon as all the people that were with Ishmael saw Johanan the son of Kareah and all the chiefs of the military forces who were with him, they began to rejoice. (Jeremiah 41:13)
- Johanan the son of Kareah and all the chiefs of the military forces who were with him now took all the remnant of the people whom they brought back from Ishmael the son of Nethaniah, from Mizpah, after he had struck down Gedaliah the son of Ahikam, able-bodied men, men of war, and the wives and the little children and the court officials, whom he brought back from Gibeon. (Jeremiah 41:16)
- Then all the chiefs of the military forces and Johanan the son of Kareah and Jezaniah the son of Hoshaiah and all the people, from the smallest one even to the greatest one, approached (Jeremiah 42:1)
- So he called for Johanan the son of Kareah and for all the chiefs of the military forces who were with him and for all the people, from the smallest one even to the greatest one. (Jeremiah 42:8)
- And Johanan the son of Kareah and all the chiefs of the military forces and all the people did not obey the voice of Yehowah, to keep on dwelling in the land of Judah. (Jeremiah 43:4)
- So Johanan the son of Kareah and all the chiefs of the military forces took all the remnant of Judah that had returned from all the nations to which they had been dispersed, in order to reside for a while in the land of Judah. (Jeremiah 43:5)
- Later these same forces accompanied the people into Egypt after Gedeliah was killed.
- After that all the people, from small to great, and the chiefs of the military forces rose up and came into Egypt, for they had become afraid because of the Chaldeans. (2 Kings 25:26)
- Among the mighty men of the military forces were Asahel and Elhanan.
- As for the mighty men of the military forces, there were Asahel

the brother of Joab, Elhanan the son of Dodo of Bethlehem. (1 Chronicles 11:26)

- The combined military force numbered three hundred and seven thousand five hundred.
- And under their control the army forces were three hundred and seven thousand five hundred men engaging in war with the power of a military force to help the king against the enemy. (2 Chronicles 26:13)
- There is no king saved by the abundance of military forces.
- There is no king saved by the abundance of military forces, a mighty man himself is not delivered by the abundance of power. (Psalms 33:16)
- Jeremiah was under guard in the courtyard in Jerusalem when the city was under siege by the military forces of Babylon.
- And at that time the military forces of the king of Babylon were laying siege to Jerusalem, and as for Jeremiah the prophet, he happened to be under restraint in the Courtyard of the Guard that is in the house of the king of Judah. (Jeremiah 32:2)
- When the military forces of the king of Babylon were fighting against Jerusalem and against all the cities of Judah that were left remaining, against Lachish and against Azekah, for they, the fortified cities, were the ones that remained over among the cities of Judah. (Jeremiah 34:7)
- Yehowah God promised to give Jerusalem and her king Zedekiah over to the Babylonian military forces.
- And Zedekiah the king of Judah and his princes I shall give into the hand of their enemies and into the hand of those seeking for their soul and into the hand of the military forces of the king of Babylon who are withdrawing from against you men. (Jeremiah 34:21)
- Later the military forces of Babylon pulled down the walls of Jerusalem.
- And all the walls of Jerusalem, round about, all the military

forces of the Chaldeans that were with the chief of the bodyguard pulled down. (Jeremiah 52:14)

- The king of the north would gather together a large military force.
- Now as for his sons, they will excite themselves and actually gather together a crowd of large military forces. And in coming he will certainly come and flood over and pass through. But he will go back, and he will excite himself all the way to his fortress. (Daniel 11:10)
- Paul showed that spirit anointed Christians have a spiritual wrestling against the wicked spirit forces in the heavenly places.
- Because we have a wrestling, not against blood and flesh, but against the governments, against the authorities, against the world rulers of this darkness, against the wicked spirit forces in the heavenly places. (Ephesians 6:12)
