~FORGETTING (66)

[English, not remembering, not recalling, failing to remember, overlooking]

- The chief of the cupbearers went to forgetting Joseph in prison for two long years.
- However, the chief of the cupbearers did not remember Joseph and went on forgetting him. (Genesis 40:23)
- The Israelites went to forgetting Yehowah their God and so he sold them into the hand of their enemies.
- And they went forgetting Yehowah their God, so that he sold them into the hand of Sisera the chief of the army of Hazor and into the hand of the Philistines and into the hand of the king of Moab, and they kept fighting against them. (1 Samuel 12:9)
- Apostasy is the pathway of those forgetting God, and all doing so will certainly perish.
- Thus are the pathways of all those forgetting God, and the very hope of an apostate will perish. (Job 8:13)
- All those forgetting God, even all the nations will turn back to Sheol, the common grave of all mankind.
- Wicked people will turn back to Sheol, even all the nations forgetting God. (Psalms 9:17)
- Men who look to Destiny and Good Luck are forgetters of God for they attribute his blessing to these false gods.
- But you men are those leaving Yehowah, those forgetting my holy mountain, those setting in order a table for the god of Good Luck and those filling up mixed wine for the god of Destiny. (Isaiah 65:11)
- Yehowah's people rejected knowledge and so he also rejected his priests, because they kept forgetting his law.
- My people will certainly be silenced, because there is no

knowledge. Because the knowledge is what you yourself have rejected, I shall also reject you from serving as a priest to me, and because you keep forgetting the Law of your God, I shall forget your sons, even I. (Hosea 4:6)

- Israel worshiped false idol gods and Judah looked to strong fortified cities for protection thereby forgetting their God.
- And Israel began forgetting his Maker and building temples, and Judah, for his part, multiplied fortified cities. And I shall certainly send fire into his cities and it must devour the dwelling towers of each one. (Hosea 8:14)
- Paul evaluated the Christian hope as something we need to focus upon, forgetting the things behind and focusing on the things ahead.
- Brothers, I do not yet consider myself as having laid hold on it, but there is one thing about it. Forgetting the things behind and stretching forward to the things ahead. (Philippians 3:13)
