~FRIGHTENED (200)

[English, scared, terrified, alarmed, startled; anxious, upset, worried, panicky Opposite of, calm]

- Moab became very frightened at the numbers of Israel, and they came to feel a sickening dread over them.
- And Moab became very frightened at the people, because they were many, and Moab began to feel a sickening dread of the sons of Israel. (Numbers 22:3)
- Yehowah God told those judging his people, not to become frightened to bring a judgment against a great one of the people, for the judgment belonged to God.
- You must not be partial in judgment. You should hear the little one the same as the great one. You must not become frightened because of a man, for the judgment belongs to God, and the case that is too hard for you, you should present to me, and I must hear it. (Deuteronomy 1:17)
- When the word a prophet speaks does not come true, then his people should not become **frightened**, it was not Yehowah God's word he spoke.
- When the prophet speaks in the name of Yehowah and the word does not occur or come true, that is the word that Yehowah did not speak. With presumptuousness the prophet spoke it. You must not get frightened at him. (Deuteronomy 18:22)
- Job showed that anyone should become **frightened** because of a coming sword, for the sword means a raging against errors.
- Be frightened for yourselves because of a sword, for the sword means a raging against errors, in order, that you men may know there is a judge. (Job 19:29)
- Due to the rising up of Leviathan, even strong men get frightened.
- Due to its rising up the strong get frightened, due to consternation they get bewildered. (Job 41:25)

- The Psalmist calls for all the seed of Israel to become frightened at their God, for he is fear-inspiring.
- You fearers of Yehowah, praise him! All you the seed of Jacob, glorify him! And be frightened at him, all you the seed of Israel. (Psalms 22:23)
- Let all those of the earth be in fear of Yehowah. At him let all the inhabitants of the productive land be frightened. (Psalms 33:8)
- Yes, why have the Governing Body of Jehovah's Witnesses taken to lying, by calling truth apostasy and by withholding fine scriptural counsel from God's people? They truly have forgotten the way of Yehowah. The answers to all of these questions were right in the book, Revealing The Sons Of God, but they refused to take any of it to heart.
- Whom did you become frightened at and begin to fear, so that you took up lying? But I was not the one that you remembered. You took nothing to your heart. Was I not keeping silent and hiding matters? So you were in no fear even of me. (Isaiah 57:11)
- It was then, that worldly rulers became frightened and realized, that they are not able to defeat true Christians. Nearly every one of these men who entered the crucible came out alive! Even worldly rulers had to admit, that their God was with them!
- At that time Nebuchadnezzar the king himself became frightened and he rose up in a hurry. He was answering and saying to his high royal officials; Was it not three able-bodied men that we threw bound into the midst of the fire? They were answering and saying to the king; Yes, O king. (Daniel 3:24)
- Surely this writing was important, for it was a most unusual occurrence. Belshazzar became frightened and his advisors were perplexed. What did this mean? Could anyone understand it?
- Consequently King Belshazzar was very much frightened and his complexion was changing within him, and his grandees were perplexed. (Daniel 5:9)
- The people of Israel and their priests will have to mourn and become frightened over their calf-idol of Beth-aven, in which they once

rejoiced, because they will be taken away to exile from it. Likewise the idols Christendom worshiped for centuries will all come to nothing, providing no more joy, as her many festivals come to an end, and the people are exiled away from their continued support of her.

- For the calf idol of Beth-aven the residents of Samaria will get frightened, for over it its people will certainly mourn, as well as its foreign-god priests who used to be joyful over it, on account of its glory, because it will have gone into exile away from it. (Hosea 10:5)
- Then the woman came forth at his request, and she was frightened and trembling, but knowing full well what had happened to her. So she came to him and fell down at Jesus' feet and told him her story, and how she was healed upon touching his garment.
- But the woman, frightened and trembling, knowing what had happened to her, came and fell down before him and told him the whole truth. (Mark 5:33)
- As the women became frightened and kept their faces turned to the ground, the men said to them; Why are you looking for the living One among the dead? (Luke 24:5)
- So they one and all became terrified, imagining that they were seeing a spirit, when Jesus appeared among them after his death.
- But because they were terrified, and had become **frightened**, they were imagining they beheld a spirit. (Luke 24:37)
- So Cornelius gazed at the angel and was frightened, so he asked the angel; What is it Lord? And in reply the angel told him that his prayers and his gifts of mercy had ascended as a remembrance before the true God, Yehowah. God had heard his many prayers, and now had come to answer them.
- The man gazed at him and, becoming frightened, said; What is it, Lord? He said to him; Your prayers and gifts of mercy have ascended as a remembrance before God. (Acts of Apostles 10:4)
- Yet when Paul began to talk about righteousness and self-control and the judgment from Yehowah God, that was coming upon all mankind, Felix became **frightened** and answered Paul, that he would

hear Paul speak of these things even at another time, thus politely putting Paul off.

- But as he talked about righteousness and self-control and the judgment to come, Felix became frightened and answered; For the present go your way, but when I get an opportune time I shall send for you again. (Acts of Apostles 24:25)
- Paul counsels them to not be frightened by their opponents, but to boldly go forward in their preaching efforts to spread the Good News of God. This very thing is a proof of destruction for their opponents, when they see our courage and determination, and that we have power spiritually beyond what is normal. It is also a proof of salvation, to those of us who preach, and this indication is from God.
- And in no respect being frightened by your opponents. This very thing is a proof of destruction for them, but of salvation for you, and this indication is from God. (Philippians 1:28)
- In that hour, in a very short time, it caused a massive upheaval in human society, a great earthquake. The tenth of the city represents those within the Great City of Babylon, who receive the tenth part or the tithe, the clergy classes of Judaism and Christendom. They will all fall from favor and be destroyed.
- The seven thousand persons refers to 7, heavenly completeness times ($10 \times 10 \times 10$) earthly completeness emphasized to the third degree. It shows that false religions fall will be complete and devastating, especially here on earth.
- The rest refers to all of mankind not a part of Christendom and Judaism. This will impress on them that the true God is a God of justice, one exacting exclusive devotion and many of them will become frightened and turn to him in spirit.
- And in that hour a great earthquake occurred, and a tenth of the city fell, and seven thousand persons were killed by the earthquake, and the rest became frightened and gave glory to the God of heaven. (Revelation 11:13)
