## ~FULFILLED (523)

[English, satisfied, content, happy, pleased, rewarded, Opposite of, frustrated]

- Seven days were fulfilled after Yehowah God struck the Nile River before its waters were drinkable again.
- And seven days came to be fulfilled after Yehowah's striking the Nile River. (Exodus 7:25)
- Gradually the days of Esther's beauty treatments were fulfilled.
- And when the turn of each young woman arrived to go in to King Ahasuerus after it had happened to her according to the women's regulation for twelve months, for that was the way the days of their massage procedure were gradually fulfilled, six months with oil of myrrh and six months with balsam oil and with the massages of the women. (Esther 2:12)
- The wicked one will come to an end before his days are fulfilled.
- Before his day will it be fulfilled, and his shoot itself will certainly not grow luxuriantly. (Job 15:32)
- Speak to the heart of Jerusalem, to those who love all that she stands for. Your military service, your struggle against Satan the Devil and his demon angels and their wicked system is **fulfilled**. Their disciplining for her sins at Yehowah's hand has reached a culmination.
- Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call out to her that her military service has been fulfilled, that her error has been paid off. For from the hand of Yehowah she has received a full amount for all her sins. (Isaiah 40:2)
- Yehowah would not leave his people there in Babylon indefinitely, but after seventy years had been fulfilled he would restore a repentant remnant to their homeland. Then too, he would call to account those who had previously imprisoned them for any abuses by them during that seventy years. Babylon's land also would then become desolate wastes.
- And it must occur that when seventy years have been fulfilled I

shall call to account against the king of Babylon and against that nation, is the utterance of Yehowah, their error, even against the land of the Chaldeans, and I will make it desolate wastes to time indefinite. (Jeremiah 25:12)

- Yes, howl you shepherds and you majestic ones of the flock, who have misled their flocks saying; Peace! There is Peace! When there is no peace, between them and their God, for your days of slaughtering will come, and all of your flocks will be scattered. Like a desirable vessel, that falls suddenly and cannot be caught, they will fall suddenly and be shattered to pieces. The day of Yehowah's accounting with all of the false shepherds has been fulfilled.
- Howl, you shepherds, and cry out! And wallow about, you majestic ones of the flock, because your days for slaughtering and for your scatterings have been fulfilled, and you must fall like a desirable vessel! (Jeremiah 25:34)
- Then Yehowah God's word was fulfilled upon Nebuchadnezzar and he was driven away to act like a beast offer seven years.
- At that moment the word itself was fulfilled upon Nebuchadnezzar, and from mankind he was being driven away, and vegetation he began to eat just like bulls, and with the dew of the heavens his own body got to be wet, until his very hair grew long just like eagles feathers and his nails like birds claws. (Daniel 4:33)
- This birth of the Messiah through a virgin girl was earlier prophesied to happen through the Isaiah the prophet, and all the things that are written in the prophets always come true in time. This particular prophecy took some eight centuries to be fulfilled.
- All this actually came about for that to be fulfilled which was spoken by Yehowah through his prophet, saying; (Matthew 1:22)
- This new family then stayed in Egypt for a time, until the decease of wicked Herod came about. Also this fulfilled the prophecy of Hosea, where Yehowah God stated, that he would call his son out of Egypt.
- And he stayed there until the decease of Herod, for that to be fulfilled which was spoken by Yehowah through his prophet, saying; Out of Egypt I called my son. (Matthew 2:15)

- This also brought fulfillment to the prophecy of Jeremiah below. This is what Yehowah has said; In Ramah, a voice is being heard, lamentation and bitter weeping. Rachel weeping over her sons. She has refused to be comforted over her sons, because they are no more. (Jeremiah 31:15)
- Then that was fulfilled which was spoken through Jeremiah the prophet, saying; (Matthew 2:17)
- There in Nazareth of Galilee he settled down with Mary and they raised a family there. Now the term Nazareth comes from the word Nazarene meaning, Sprout, and so this fulfilled several prophecies in Isaiah, Jeremiah and Zechariah, that relate to this term, Sprout.
- And came and dwelt in a city named Nazareth, that there might be fulfilled what was spoken through the prophets; He will be called a Nazarene. (Matthew 2:23)
- This initial work by Jesus Christ fulfilled the scripture of Isaiah quoted below by Matthew.
- That there might be fulfilled what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet, saying; (Matthew 4:14)
- Matthew now relates to us, that this brought fulfillment to the prophecy of Isaiah where he said of this coming one, the Messiah: He himself took our sicknesses and carried our diseases.
- That there might be fulfilled what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet, saying; He himself took our sicknesses and carried our diseases. (Matthew 8:17)
- Now Matthew relates that his course was a fulfillment of the prophecy of (Isaiah Chapter 42).
- That there might be fulfilled what was spoken through Isaiah the prophet, who said. (Matthew 12:17)
- Matthew then shows, that this **fulfilled** a scripture in the Psalms, that the Messiah would speak thus, in riddles and illustrations.
- That there might be fulfilled what was spoken through the prophet who said; I will open my mouth with illustrations, I will publish things hidden since the founding. (Matthew 13:35)

- This actually took place and it was in **fulfillment** of an earlier prophecy in the Hebrew scriptures.
- This actually took place that there might be fulfilled what was spoken through the prophet, saying; (Matthew 21:4)
- However, then how could the scriptures be fulfilled, that it must take place this way. Jesus felt that it was more important than even his life to fulfill his father's word the Bible, and thus prove God true. What honor this brought to the true God, Yehowah, for his onlybegotten son to act this way.
- In that case, how would the Scriptures be fulfilled that it must take place this way? (Matthew 26:54)
- Yet all these things had to take place for the scriptures to be fulfilled, just as Jesus had stated to Peter. At this point, as Jesus was taken away, all his other disciples then fled, fearing for their own lives and their freedom.
- But all this has taken place for the scriptures of the prophets to be fulfilled. Then all the disciples abandoned him and fled. (Matthew 26:56)
- This actually brought to fulfillment a prophecy in Jeremiah, that they would take thirty pieces of silver, that had been the value given to a man's life, the price that had been put upon his head, and with this, bought a field.
- Then what was spoken through Jeremiah the prophet was fulfilled, saying; And they took the thirty silver pieces, the price upon the man that was priced, the one on whom some of the sons of Israel set a price. (Matthew 27:9)
- His message, was that the appointed time had been fulfilled, and that the Kingdom of God had drawn near. He preached repentance also, and that people should have faith in the Good News of God that he preached.
- And saying; The appointed time has been fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has drawn near. Be repentant, you people, and have faith in the Good News. (Mark 1:15)

- Then Jesus remarked, that day after day he was in the temple teaching publicly, and yet then no one tried to take him and arrest him. Nevertheless he recognized that it was in order for the scriptures to be fulfilled. Thus he made no further attempt to resist or defend himself.
- Day after day I was with you in the temple teaching, and yet you did not take me into custody. Nevertheless, it is in order, that the Scriptures may be fulfilled. (Mark 14:49)
- However because Zechariah did not believe his first word at face value, Zechariah was told, that he would become mute until the day that these things were fulfilled, because he did not believe his words at first. Then he assured Zechariah that his words would come true at the appointed time, just as he earlier spoke to him.
- But, look! You will be silent and not able to speak until the day that these things take place, because you did not believe my words, which will be **fulfilled** in their appointed time. (Luke 1:20)
- Then after his two weeks of priestly service at the temple was fulfilled, he went off back to his home.
- When, now, the days of his public service were fulfilled, he went off to his home. (Luke 1:23)
- Then he told them plainly, that this very day, the scripture that he had just read, was fulfilled in him. For he had been anointed for just this purpose by Yehowah God, and now his ministry was to begin among God's people, whom he would set free from religious bondage, to wrong traditions and falsehoods, he would assist the poor, and he was calling people to take advantage of Yehowah's year of goodwill, by coming to repentance before their God.
- Then he started to say to them; Today this scripture that you just heard is **fulfilled**. (Luke 4:21)
- Jesus then showed, that these would be days for meting out justice to the disobedient Jews, who had killed God's own Son, Jesus Christ. Their system of things would likewise end, and from that time onward, no further favor would be shown to them again.
- Since then, they have received no true prophets from God, neither direction from his angels, nor further Bible writings. Their system of things ended then, and there. As Jesus told them, they

would gain no favor from Yehowah God, until they said; Blessed is he who comes in Yehowah's name. Since they still reject the Christ, this has not been, and will not be forthcoming.

- Because these are days for meting out justice, that all the things written may be fulfilled. (Luke 21:22)
- Then Jesus showed, that the Jews as a people who survived this destruction, would be led away as captives and dispersed into all the other nations, and their national identity would end. Jerusalem then would be trampled upon by men of the nations, until the appointed times for the worldly nations to rule over her, had been fulfilled. Men of other nations then, would control the land, that once had been the homeland of the Jews alone, trampling its soil.
- And they will fall by the edge of the sword and be led captive into all the nations, and Jerusalem will be trampled on by the nations, until the appointed times of the nations are fulfilled. (Luke 21:24)
- Then he told them, that this would be his last meal on earth before he came in his Kingdom, and again broke bread with them in the Kingdom of God.
- For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it becomes fulfilled in the kingdom of God. (Luke 22:16)
- Then he told them that all the things he had earlier told them while he was yet with them, in the Law Covenant and the Prophets and Psalms about him, must be fulfilled.
- He now said to them; These are my words which I spoke to you while I was yet with you, that all the things written in the Law of Moses and in the Prophets and Psalms about me must be fulfilled. (Luke 24:44)
- Thus through their faithless behavior, the prophecy of Isaiah the prophet had come to fulfillment through them. Yehowah who has put faith in the thing heard by us, and as for the arm of Yehowah to whom, had it been revealed?
- So that the word of Isaiah the prophet was fulfilled which he said; Yehowah, who has put faith in the thing heard by us? And as for the arm of Yehowah, to whom has it been revealed? (John

- So then, he showed that he was not talking about all of them, for the most of them were putting his counsel into practice. Then he showed, that the scripture, regarding one of his disciples, must come to fulfillment, that one of his disciples who was living off of his bread, would betray him, and lift up his heel against him.
- I am not talking about all of you. I know the ones I have chosen. But it is in order, that the Scripture might be fulfilled, He that used to feed on my bread has lifted up his heel against me. (John 13:18)
- Jesus then showed, that their behavior was prophesied in the holy scriptures within the Law Covenant where it said: They hated me without cause.
- But it is that the word written in their Law may be **fulfilled**: They hated me without cause. (John 15:25)
- Jesus then showed, that when he was with them in person, he used to watch over them, so that they might also glorify his Father's name through their actions and beliefs. Because of his fine shepherding of them, they were all in Yehowah God's protective sheepfold, with the exception of the son of destruction, whose loss was unavoidable, for the prophecies about him must come to fulfillment.
- When I was with them I used to watch over them on account of your own name which you have given me, and I have kept them, and not one of them is destroyed except the son of destruction, in order, that the scripture might be fulfilled. (John 17:12)
- This he said in order for the scriptures to be fulfilled that: Of those that were given to me, I have not lost a single one.
- In order, that the word might be fulfilled which he said; Of those whom you have given me I have not lost a single one. (John 18:9)
- This they said to bring fulfillment to Jesus words, about what sort of death he was destined to experience at their hands.
- This, in order, that the word of Jesus might be fulfilled which he said to signify what sort of death he was destined to die. (John

- So they decided to cast lots to see which one of them would get his inner garment. This fulfilled a scripture, that they would apportion his garments among themselves, and cast lots over his apparel. So the soldiers really did these things, thus fulfilling that scripture.
- Therefore they said to one another; Let us not tear it, but let us determine by lots over it whose it will be. This was that the scripture might be fulfilled: They apportioned my outer garments among themselves, and upon my apparel they cast lots. And so the soldiers really did these things. (John 19:24)
- Also the scripture was fulfilled, that not one of his bones would be broken, though this was the order of the Roman governor Pilate, it was never done to Jesus, for he was already dead.
- In fact, these things took place in order for the scripture to be fulfilled: Not a bone of his will be crushed. (John 19:36)
- Peter then related, that the scriptures showed, that it was necessary for Judas, the one who betrayed Jesus, to act as he did, to fulfill the scriptures, the ones which King David under inspiration spoke, concerning the one who would later betray the Messiah, who turned out to be Judas. Judas did this be leading the Jewish religious leaders to Jesus in the middle of the night, thus betraying him for mere money.
- Men, brothers, it was necessary for the scripture to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by David's mouth about Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. (Acts of Apostles 1:16)
- So now Peter showed, that by allowing this wrong treatment of his glorious Son, that Yehowah God had fulfilled the things he had previously announced at the mouth of the prophets, concerning the sufferings that his Messiah must undergo.
- But in this way God has fulfilled the things he announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. (Acts of Apostles 3:18)

- Now when Moses became forty years old, he went out and made an inspection of his Hebrew brothers, the sons of Israel, the descendants of Abraham.
- Now when the time of his fortieth year was being fulfilled, it came into his heart to make an inspection of his brothers, the sons of Israel. (Acts of Apostles 7:23)
- Moses then stayed in Midian until forty more years were fulfilled, before an angel appeared to him in the wilderness of Mount Sinai, in the fiery flame of a thornbush.
- And when forty years were fulfilled, there appeared to him in the wilderness of Mount Sinai an angel in the fiery flame of a thornbush. (Acts of Apostles 7:30)
- Paul then showed, that the inhabitants of Jerusalem and their rulers did not know this glorious one, and thus, when they acted as judges of him, they fulfilled the things written in the Law Covenant and the Prophets, and read every Sabbath in the synagogues, concerning this one.
- For the inhabitants of Jerusalem and their rulers did not know this One, but, when acting as judges, they fulfilled the things voiced by the Prophets, which things are read aloud every Sabbath. (Acts of Apostles 13:27)
- Paul then showed, that all of the promises of Yehowah God had been fulfilled in this man, Jesus Christ. Yehowah God had fulfilled the Second Psalm, which says: You are my son, I have become your Father this day.
- That God has entirely fulfilled it to us their children in that he resurrected Jesus, even as it is written in the Second Psalm: You are my son, I have become your Father this day. (Acts of Apostles 13:33)
- So Paul did as instructed by the elders in Jerusalem, and he took along these four men the next day, cleansing both himself and them ceremonially in the temple, until the offering should be made in their behalf there. This being done in full sight of all the Jews.
- Then Paul took the men along the next day and cleansed himself ceremonially with them and went into the temple, to give notice

of the days to be **fulfilled** for the ceremonial cleansing, until the offering should be presented for each one of them. (Acts of Apostles 21:26)

- Paul now counsels Christians, that it is in them alone, that the righteous requirement of the Law Covenant will be fulfilled. The Jews who keep walking under the Law Covenant alone, will remain fleshly, and they will fail in meeting this righteous requirement.
- The Law Covenant cannot make men love obedience, only the spirit can. Those who follow the spirit of God, like their exemplar Jesus Christ, can hope to actually attain to true righteousness before God, their creator. There are no fences where we as Christians walk, only an intimacy and a drawing near to God, through, and because of, his spirit.
- That the righteous requirement of the Law might be fulfilled in us who walk, not in accord with the flesh, but in accord with the spirit. (Romans 8:4)
- What is the entire Christian obligation to all others of the human family to fulfill? To love one another! What things we have promised to others, we should pay to the best of our ability, such as bills, taxes and other dues, for we are all interdependent through society.
- Most men under worldly governments, think that paying such obligations, and obeying the Laws is their only responsibility. However Christians go much further, having an obligation to love their neighbors as themselves. No man who loves another man will kill him. This does not, somehow, fail to apply to persons of another nationality, as the world currently thinks.
- Do not you people be owing anybody a single thing, except to love one another, for he that loves his fellowman has fulfilled the Law. (Romans 13:8)
- Now the entire Law Covenant stands fulfilled in one statement as respects other people: You must love your neighbor as yourself. Jesus Christ had already taught this, and it is the second most important commandment, the first being to; Love Yehowah God with our whole heart, spirit, mind and strength. How fitting circumcision is then, to maintaining clean relationships with others, and in doing all things in love.
- For the entire Law stands **fulfilled** in one saying, namely: You

must love your neighbor as yourself. (Galatians 5:14)

- Thus through his works, he fulfilled the scripture which says: That he put faith in Yehowah and it was counted to him as righteousness. His willingness to do works in behalf of God and in imitation of his ways, made him God's friend.
- And the scripture was fulfilled which says: Abraham put faith in Yehowah, and it was counted to him as righteousness, and he came to be called, Yehowah's friend. (James 2:23)
