## ~FURIOUS (75)

[English, angry, livid, fuming, enraged, mad, irate, infuriated, enraged, upset, beside yourself, Opposite of, calm]

- Moses told Israel that Yehowah God had become furious against him on their account.
- And Yehowah continued to be furious against me on your account and did not listen to me, but Yehowah said to me, That is enough of you! Never speak to me further on this matter.

  (Deuteronomy 3:26)
- Job asked for Yehowah God to let flow the furious outbursts of his anger and bring the haughty ones low
- Let flow the furious outbursts of your anger, and see every one haughty and bring him low. (Job 40:11)
- The Psalmist recounted how in the past Yehowah God had become furious against Israel for their conduct.
- That was why Yehowah heard and began to be furious, and fire itself was kindled against Jacob, and anger also ascended against Israel. (Psalms 78:21)
- God heard and got to be furious, and so he contemned Israel very much. (Psalms 78:59)
- And he kept handing over his people to the sword itself, and against his inheritance he became furious. (Psalms 78:62)
- But you, you have cast off and you keep contemning; You have become furious toward your anointed one. (Psalms 89:38)
- The stupid man, rather than turning away from badness, is becoming furious and self-confident.
- The wise one fears and is turning away from badness, but the stupid is becoming furious and self-confident. (Proverbs 14:16)
- Anyone taking on someone else's fight is like a man grabbing hold of the ears of an angry dog.

- As one grabbing hold of the ears of a dog is anyone passing by that is becoming furious at the quarrel that is not his. (Proverbs 26:17)
- The shearing off of the hair was done in Israel when one had broken a Nazirite vow, and so they must begin over their service. In Yehowah's eyes this entire generation has broken its dedication to him, and because they refuse to repent, he had rejected and will desert them, for he is furious with them. This should cause them to go into mourning, but it does not.
- Shear off your uncut hair and throw it away, and upon the bare hills raise a dirge, for Yehowah has rejected and will desert the generation with which he is furious. (Jeremiah 7:29)
- When Nebuchadnezzar could not find anyone to tell him his dream and its interpretation, he became furious, and said to destroy all of Babylon's wise men including Daniel and his three companions.
- Because of this the king himself became angry and got very furious, and he said to destroy all the wise men of Babylon. (Daniel 2:12)
