~GAIUS 2 (22)

(Ga'ius) [from a root meaning land]

- A Christian from Derbe in Asia Minor who is listed along with six others as accompanying the apostle Paul on his last missionary tour.

 Gaius and these others evidently separated from Paul and then went on to Troas, on the West coast of Asia Minor, where they waited for him.
- There were accompanying him Sopater the son of Pyrrhus of Beroea, Aristarchus and Secundus of the Thessalonians, and Gaius of Derbe, and Timothy, and from the district of Asia Tychicus and Trophimus. (Acts of Apostles 20:4)
- These went on and were waiting for us in Troas. (Acts of Apostles 20:5)
- This Gaius may be the same as No. 1, since Aristarchus is also mentioned in the account. If so, this would likely mean that Gaius was of Macedonian birth, or descent, but had been residing in Derbe.
