~GE-HARASHIM (25) (Ge-har'a-shim) [Valley of Craftsmen]

- A valley named for the community of craftsmen living there.
- As for Meonothai, he became father to Ophrah. As for Seraiah, he became father to Joab the father of Ge-harashim, for craftsmen are what they became. (1 Chronicles 4:14)
- The community was fathered, or founded, by Joab, though evidently not the Joab of David's time. It was settled by Benjamites after the Babylonian exile.
- And the sons of Benjamin were from Geba, Michmash and Aija and Bethel and its dependent towns. (Nehemiah 11:31)
- Lod and Ono, the valley of the craftsmen. (Nehemiah 11:35)
- Some geographers tentatively locate it at Wadi esh-Shellal, a broad valley located a few miles Southeast of Tel Aviv-Yafo, others prefer the identification with Sarafand el-Kharab to the Southwest of the former.
