

~GLORIFYING (100)

[English, worshiping, adoring, lionizing, exalting, deifying, elevating, venerating, praising]

- Better is the lightly esteemed one who has a servant, than the one **glorifying** himself, but who is himself going hungry.
- Better is the one lightly esteemed but having a servant than the one **glorifying** himself but in want of bread. (**Proverbs 12:9**)
- The one showing favor to the poor one is **glorifying** his creator.
- He that is defrauding the lowly one has reproached his Maker, but the one showing favor to the poor one is **glorifying** Him. (**Proverbs 14:31**)
- Yehowah is a wondrous God! He knows the very thoughts and feelings of every man woman and child on earth, all the time. He can also completely control all of those people especially any who take a haughty position, or think that they are above justice. Any who are walking haughtily he will humble. After a time of humility Nebuchadnezzar went **glorifying** Yehowah God.
- Now I, Nebuchadnezzar, am praising and exalting and **glorifying** the King of the heavens, because all his works are truth and his ways are justice, and because those who are walking in pride he is able to humiliate. (**Daniel 4:37**)
- Then the shepherds returned to their fields **glorifying** and praising God for all the things that they had just seen and heard, through his angels, for they had found it, just as they had been told.
- Then the shepherds went back, **glorifying** and praising God for all the things they heard and saw, just as these had been told them. (**Luke 2:20**)
- No sooner had Jesus said this, than the man arose and picked up what he used to lie on, and went off to his home, **glorifying** God for his blessing. Really, who would not do so!
- And instantly he rose up before them, picked up what he used to lie on and went off to his home, **glorifying** God. (**Luke 5:25**)

- Yet only one of the men turned back to Jesus, and began to **glorify** God for the precious gift he had just received, doing so with a loud voice.
- One of them, when he saw he was healed, turned back, **glorifying** God with a loud voice. (**Luke 17:15**)
- No sooner had Jesus said this, than the man recovered his sight and he also began to follow after Jesus, **glorifying** God as he went. Also all the people in the crowd were also doing so, after seeing this demonstration of God's wonderful power and spirit.
- And instantly he recovered sight, and he began to follow him, **glorifying** God. Also, all the people, at seeing it, gave praise to God. (**Luke 18:43**)
- So after this they further threatened them, but seeing that their threats had no effect, they released them, since they could not find any ground upon which to base any real punishment of them. They also were in fear of the people, and how these might react, because many of the people were **glorifying** God over the miracle that had occurred.
- So, when they had further threatened them, they released them, since they did not find any ground on which to punish them and on account of the people, because they were all **glorifying** God over what had occurred. (**Acts of Apostles 4:21**)
- So many of them began to **glorify** God, because of this turning around of Paul.
- So they began **glorifying** God because of me. (**Galatians 1:24**)
- However Peter is talking about him suffering as a Christian, in the name of Christ for his beliefs and his service to God. Such a man should feel no shame, even though others may look upon him that way. Let such a man keep on **glorifying** God feeling no shame over his reproach.
- But if he suffers as a Christian, let him not feel shame, but let him keep on **glorifying** God in this name. (**1 Peter 4:16**)
